| 2. All Students entering the program must have a social security number. | | |
| 3. Provide proof of High School graduation, GED, or proof of college degree. | | |
| 4. Attend a Nursing Information Session within one year of applying for admission into the program. | | |
| 5. PREREQUISITE COURSES (the following must be completed prior to applying): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • *Microbiology 33 or equivalent (4 -5 units with lab). • *Physiology 31 or equivalent (4 units with lab) <p>NOTE: Students must have a GPA of 2.5 or better in the prerequisite courses and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in all college courses completed since high school. For any course in which a grade of “C” or better was earned, the FIRST course grade will be utilized. Failure to submit transcripts with all grades posted will result in disqualification from the application process.</p> | | |
| 6. Have Official college transcripts from regionally accredited institutions <u>sent</u> directly to El Camino College or Compton Center Admissions and Records. All transcripts from outside the United States must be evaluated by an ECC-approved foreign evaluation service. No hand carried transcripts will be accepted. <p>NOTE: Transcripts must be received by the admission office no later than August 1 for Fall applications and January 1 for Spring applications. Students must confirm with the Admissions Office that transcripts have arrived prior to making a counseling appointment.</p> | | |
| 7. Complete Nursing 48 with a minimum grade of C or is in progress. Nursing 48 may be <u>in progress</u> or <u>taken prior</u> to applying to the Nursing Program. If this course is in progress, student must provide documentation of completion of the course to the Nursing Office by the end of the semester | | |
| 8. Potential candidate seeking admission into the Upward Mobility track as a 30Unit option candidate must possess a current California LVN/LPN license and have been employed as an LVN/LPN for at least one year or more in an acute care setting. | | |
| 9. TEAS Exam for N149 Entrance: Effective fall 2014, all upward mobility students (LVN and transfer students) will be required to take and successfully pass the TEAS exam prior to entering the Associate Degree Nursing program. Students who fail the TEAS test will be required to complete remediation. The TEAS must be passed on the first or second attempt. Students will not be considered for entry into the nursing program if they have failed the TEAS a total of two or more times at any location. *Students who take the TEAS at ECC and complete ECC remediation must retest at ECC. | | |

Items 1 through 8 and prerequisite courses must be completed before an application can be accepted for the Associate Degree Nursing program (Nursing 48 must be taken prior to applying to the Nursing Program).

All courses completed toward the 30 unit option must have minimum grade of “C” and minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 must be maintained.

NOTE: Upon admission to the Nursing Program and successful completion of Nursing 149, the 30 Unit Option students will be integrated into the generic program.
