REASONS TO JOIN THE HONORS TRANSFER PROGRAM

The purpose of the Honors Transfer Program is to prepare highly motivated students for transfer to an excellent university. HTP requirements are similar to those required by the University of California. Honors courses focus on improving reading, writing, and study skills. These are the main benefits of the Honors Transfer Program:

- Priority registration for ECC classes each semester you are in the HTP
- "Completed Honors Transfer Program" designation on ECC transcript and degree, and a "T" (for transfer) next to each honors course
- Priority admission consideration for universities requiring a personal statement as part of the application process (about 90% get into the UC of their choice)*
- Variety of general-education honors courses available
- Honors courses with smaller class size, taught by specially selected faculty
- Increased chances of receiving scholarships
- Honors Transfer Club activities and newsletter-writing opportunities
- Interaction with other highly motivated students
- Enrichment workshops which provide information leading to academic and personal growth
- Special privileges at universities with which ECC has transfer agreements
- Honors Student Research Conference an opportunity to give a presentation at a UC conference and have your abstract printed in a UC publication

*Completing the Honors Transfer Program gives you an advantage when applying for **admission to UC** or to any university that requires a personal statement as part of the application. At present, **admission to CSU** is based on GPA only. While the CSU system does not currently consider HTP completion when determining admission status, HTP is still a worthwhile endeavor for students who <u>might</u> decide to apply to a UC or private school, or plan someday to attend graduate school. Talk to a counselor about your future educational plans, and discuss the possible benefits of joining the HTP.

Alpha Gamma Sigma is the statewide honor and scholarship society for community college students. It is separate from the Honors Transfer Program and has its own benefits and requirements. If you are interested in joining AGS, apply for membership at the main counter in the Student Activities Center.

Transfer Agreements (tab on right)

HONORS TRANSFER PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS (Requirements are subject to change in future semesters.)

To join the HTP, you must:

- Have at least <u>3.1 unweighted total academic GPA for grades 9-12</u> (you must be currently completing senior year) on your high school transcript; if in college, have at least <u>3.1 on all transferable college</u> coursework (at least nine transferable units).
- Be eligible for (or have completed) English 1A. See page 16 for types of verification.
- Complete the Honors Transfer Program application and submit all required materials.

To remain active in the HTP, you must:

- Maintain a minimum 3.1 GPA on all transferable ECC coursework.
- Complete English 1A the first semester in the program (unless already completed).
- Complete at least one honors course each regular (fall and spring) semester, with a minimum grade of C. An honors course is <u>not</u> required during summer or winter, but honors courses taken during these sessions do count, and may be banked (see below).
- Attend at least one workshop each semester (or an option as described on page 7).

To complete the HTP, you must:

- Have at least 3.1 GPA on all transferable ECC coursework at the time of completion.
- Complete at least two regular (fall and spring) semesters in the HTP.
- Complete five honors courses, each with a minimum grade of C. We will count only one honors course completed at another college; submit an unofficial transcript.
- Attend at least four workshops (as described on page 7).
- Attend two scheduled counseling appointments and submit documentation to the HTP.

HTP does <u>not</u> require you to be a full-time student, but <u>every semester</u> you must meet all the requirements described above to remain active. If you do not, you will be suspended from the HTP and will not receive priority registration. If suspended, you may reinstate into the HTP as soon as you have corrected the deficiency. Reinstatement is allowed two times.

It is best to be in the HTP for two years. Although we <u>require</u> only two regular (fall and spring) semesters, you must be able to complete the five required honors courses. If you completed <u>designated</u> honors sections before joining the HTP, they will count.

Banking an Honors Course: If you take a summer or winter honors course, or more than one honors course during a regular semester, you may bank the "extra" course for a future semester in which you cannot take one. You may do this as many times as you wish. The form "Request to Bank an Honors Course" is available on the HTP information counter.

Banking a Workshop: If you complete more than one honors workshop during a semester, you may bank the "extra" workshop by notating it on the sign in sheet (name, SID, "bank"). Regardless, **YOU MUST** attend at least one workshop during your last year in the program.

When you have completed the required number of honors courses, workshops, or counseling appointments, you do <u>not</u> need any more to stay active in the program.

Grade Progress Report: If you are not eligible to join the HTP now, you may apply during the next application period to join for next semester. If you have completed fewer than nine transferable units of college coursework at that time, include a Grade Progress Report (available on the HTP information counter) with your application (<u>instead</u> of a high school transcript). This form should be filled out by <u>all</u> of your current professors after midterm and must show at least nine transferable units in progress (or fewer, if some have already been completed).

COUNTDOWN to COMPLETION

5 honors courses

Complete one or more each semester, for a total of five. Be sure to take the <u>honors</u> sections.

4 HTP workshops

Attend one or more each semester, for a total of four. Record them on your HTP Completion Form on page 12, right after you attend.

3.1 transferable GPA

Be sure to maintain this minimum GPA on all transferable ECC coursework.

2 counseling appointments

Attend a total of two whenever you need them, bring documentation to the HTP office, and record them on your HTP Completion Form on page 12. (see page 10 for more details)

Page 12 of this Handbook. Keep it up to date and submit it in November of your final year at ECC, right after you register for your fifth honors course.

THE HONORS CURRICULUM

Students in the HTP complete the same number of courses as other students planning to transfer. The HTP does <u>not</u> require you to take a minimum number of units per semester, but **you must complete** <u>at least one</u> **honors course each fall and spring** until you have completed the five required honors courses. You may take up to three honors courses per semester, except in your last spring just before transfer, when we limit you to two. If you do <u>not</u> register for an honors course during a fall or spring semester, or register for only one and then drop it, you will forfeit your priority registration for the next semester. You may "bank" courses as described on page 4. (NOTE: We will count one honors course completed at another college if you submit an unofficial transcript and a confirming letter from a professor or counselor at that college.)

Before you register, obtain a list of honors courses for the following semester. This list is available on the HTP website, the HTP information counter, and printed in the Schedule of Classes under the heading "Honors Transfer Program Courses." **Be sure to register for the <u>designated</u> honors section.**

New HTP students are required to take **English 1A** (unless previously completed or waived by College Board AP exam) during their first semester in the program. We <u>recommend</u> that you take an <u>honors</u> section of English 1A.

Courses in the list below are regularly offered for honors credit, but not every course is offered every semester. **Be sure to register for a <u>designated honors section</u>**.

Limitation: Your total of five required honors courses may include only two courses in the same <u>department</u>, and only three courses in the same <u>IGETC area</u>.

HOW TO SUCCEED IN THE HONORS TRANSFER PROGRAM

The HTP is an "honors" program, and high standards are appropriate. Please read this Handbook thoroughly before applying to the program, keep it until you have completed the program, and review it regularly. You are expected to know and follow the requirements.

Keep your originals of your own official paperwork. <u>Make photocopies</u> to give to offices that request them.

The **HTP Completion Form** is page 12. Record the names and dates of honors courses, workshops, and counseling appointments as you complete them. Detach and submit this form in November of your final year at ECC, after you have registered for your fifth honors course, even if you have not yet attended all required workshops and counseling appointments by that time.

It is critical to read your ECC email every day. You should receive an email from the HTP assistant about once a week; this is how we tell you everything you need to know. Emails we send to the entire membership are posted on the bulletin board across from the assistant's desk, and some of them are also posted on our **Facebook** page, "El Camino College Honors Transfer Program." Problems with your ECC email? Call the HELP DESK at (310) 660-6571.

Complete one or more honors courses each semester, until you have completed five. If you took honors courses before joining the HTP, these will count toward your five required. You may be allowed to "bank" an honors course, as described on page 4. Any semester in which you do not complete an honors course with a C or better, and do not have anything to bank, you will forfeit priority registration for the next semester.

Attend one or more workshops (one-hour meetings on a variety of topics) each semester, until you have attended four. Workshop credit is given <u>only</u> for planned HTP workshops; or for being a presenter at the HTCC Student Research Conference in the spring. If we offer anything else for workshop credit, we will let you know by email. Unless you bank a workshop (see below,) you must go to at least one workshop every semester until you have attended four. Transfer Center workshops are <u>not</u> HTP workshops. **Any semester, in which you do not earn at least one workshop credit, you will forfeit priority registration for the next semester.** (You may "bank a workshop" see page 4.)

Do not ask the HTP assistant to look up which workshops you have attended. If you do not keep a record, or lose your record, you will have to attend more workshops.

Attend at least two scheduled counseling appointments (Express Counseling does <u>not</u> count) while you are in the HTP. Attend at least one academic appointment (planning ECC courses) and one transfer appointment (discussing university plans). To receive HTP credit, obtain and submit proof of attending these two appointments --- a copy of the educational plan, or a note from the transfer counselor.

Each semester you will be notified of your **priority registration appointment** for the following semester. If you are not meeting HTP requirements each semester, you will be suspended from the HTP and will not be able to reinstate until you have corrected the deficiency. **While suspended, you will not receive emails from the HTP and will not receive priority registration.**

REGISTRATION Subject to change by the Admissions Office

IMPORTANT: In order to be eligible for priority registration, **ALL** students must complete:

- 1. An ECC application
- 2. An ECC orientation (either online or in person)
- 3. An education plan (EdPlan) with an ECC counselor
- 4. Assessment testing for Math/English placement

When you apply to ECC online, you will declare your start date. If you need to change your start date, then talk to someone in the Admissions Office about the change.

ECC students will register online at www.elcamino.edu MyECC link. If you have any problems with MyECC, call the ITS Help Desk at (310) 660-6571 or send an email to networkservices@elcamino.edu.

The <u>Schedule of Classes</u> for each semester is posted online before the paper copies become available in the Bookstore. You will register online for summer (if attending) and fall at the same time, or for winter (if attending) and spring at the same time.

Talk to a counselor <u>before</u> your registration date for processing clearances and for help in planning your courses. Make an appointment with an academic counselor <u>or</u> sign up for a short conversation with an Express Counselor (no appointment required). All honors students must submit a copy of an educational plan to the HTP office sometime during their first semester in the HTP. See page 10 for important information about when to make your counseling appointments

Register at your appointment time or as soon thereafter as possible. Register for at least one honors course every fall and spring semester, unless you have completed a course you can bank (see page 4). You may choose to take summer and winter session honors courses also, and they will count. Pay your fees by the stated deadline, or you will be dropped from classes. Get a printout showing you are registered and have paid.

After you are accepted to the HTP, we will tell you via your ECC email when to look online at MyECC to confirm that you have received the appropriate priority registration.

<u>New, out-of-district freshmen</u> might have trouble getting into their first choice of classes. Be sure to have alternate choices ready before you go online to register. Next semester you will register as "continuing students," and it will be easier to get the classes you want.

If a section is full, sign up on the waiting list, go to the first class meeting, and ask the professor to add you. There are always no-shows the first day of class, and students from the waiting list are added to almost every class. It is very important to be on time for the first class meeting, so arrive early and find the classroom in advance!

You might increase your chances of being added to a class by emailing the professor a few days before the class begins. Tell the professor you are in the HTP and will attend the first class meeting in hopes of adding. Professors might have some discretion in how many students they can add, and it doesn't hurt to ask.

<u>IMPORTANT NOTES:</u> Students with over 90 units completed **WILL NOT** get priority registration; this is an Admissions office policy that the HTP has no means of changing.

USEFUL DEPARTMENTS ON CAMPUS (hours are subject to change)

Become familiar with the campus web site, www.elcamino.edu, for up-to-date information about these offices and all other campus services. Read the first few pages of the **Schedule of Classes** each semester. The **El Camino College Catalog** describes all courses offered at this college. It is available for purchase in the bookstore, or can be browsed free in the Counseling Division. Versions of both the Schedule of Classes and the El Camino College Catalog are also available online.

Admissions/Records: Student Services Center, first floor. MTTh 9:00-5:30, W 9:00-6:30. File the "Intent to Graduate," request transcripts or IGETC, and solve application or registration problems.

Assessment Center (placement testing): Student Services Center, Second Floor, Room 217 Voice/Voice Mail: (310) 660-3405 (Staff). MTTh 10:00am-4:00pm; W 10:00am-5:00pm; F 9:00am-1:00pm. HTP requires eligibility for English 1A.

Financial Aid Office: Administration Building, first floor. Hours M-Th 8:00am -5:30pm, phone number (310) 660-3493. Apply online at MyECC, then visit the Financial Aid office to submit paperwork. The longest lines occur the two weeks <u>before</u>, and the two weeks <u>after</u>, each semester starts.

Scholarship Office: Administration Building, Rm.119. (310) 660-6541. Many scholarships are available for use at ECC and after transfer, and many go unclaimed! Find out if one is right for you!

Cashier's Office Location: Southeast corner of the Bookstore Building, ground level. Phone Number: 310-532-3670, Ext. 3142. Hours: Monday - Thursday 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 pm. Friday 8:00a.m. noon. PAYMENT INFO: For your convenience, we offer three ways to pay your fees: 1) Pay online 24 hours a day at http://www.elcamino.edu/mycc/. 2) The Cashier's Office - we accept cash, checks, Visa, MasterCard, or Discover. 3) Mail a check or money order to El Camino College; Cashier's Office; 16007 Crenshaw Blvd., Torrance, CA 90506. Be sure to mail your payment 7 days before the deadline. Your check must be received in the Cashier's Office on or before the deadline date.

Counseling: Student Services Center, first floor. MTTh 9:00-5:30, W 9:00-6:30, F 9:00-1:00. Page 10 of this Handbook describes the various types of counseling available. We encourage you to take advantage of the many services offered by the Career/Transfer Center.

Job Placement: The Job Placement Office is closed permanently. Job postings are available by logging into MyECC and clicking on the "Need a Job?" link on the right-hand side.

Student Development: Student Activities Center. M-TH 9:00am-5:45pm F 9-12:30. Headquarters for all student organizations, including Alpha Gamma Sigma Honor and Scholarship Society. Join a club, participate in social and service activities, or get elected to student government. Active participation looks good in your personal statement!

Library: MTTh 7:30am-9:00 pm, F 7:30-4:30, S 9:30-2:30. Learning Resources Center: (310) 660-3511. Departments: Learning Center, Basic Skills Study Center, LRC Tutorial Program, and LMTC Computer Commons. Take advantage of these valuable resources!

Writing Center: Humanities 122, M-Th 8:00-6:00, F 8:00-4:30. (310) 660-3873. Offers workshops and individual tutoring in reading and writing, including resumes and cover letters, and some computer instruction. No appointment necessary.

TYPES OF COUNSELING APPOINTMENTS AND WHERE TO MAKE THEM

- The HTP assistant cannot make any type of counseling appointments.
- You will receive HTP credit for an appointment with any ECC counselor when you submit documentation to the HTP office.
- For an educational plan (choosing ECC classes), make an appointment with an academic counselor in your major <u>during your first semester</u> at ECC.
- To discuss university transfer plans, make an appointment with a transfer counselor <u>no later than October 1</u> of your final year at ECC.
- Transfer counselors are more familiar with HTP requirements than academic counselors, but <u>don't</u> ask for an appointment with an "HTP counselor." That confuses staff members and they will just send you to the HTP office.
- Counseling Division hours are posted on the double doors. They are always <u>subject</u> to change.

Express Counseling is available for ten-minute walk-in sessions (no appointment required). Express counselors answer quick questions only, and do not prepare educational plans. The express sign-up station is on a desk just inside the double doors into Counseling, under a big blue sign on the wall. The schedule of counselors assigned for that week is also posted.

Academic Counseling requires a half-hour appointment and assists students to develop an educational plan for meeting academic goals here at ECC, and/or meeting requirements for transfer to a bachelor's degree granting university. **Appointments with an academic counselor are made online through MyECC starting Thursday at 5pm, to meet the following week.** This procedure is subject to change.

Transfer Counseling requires a half-hour appointment and provides students with information specific to their intended transfer institutions. Appointments with a transfer counselor are made in person in the Career/Transfer Center (that big round room behind the glassed-in counseling appointments counter), starting Mondays at 9:00 a.m. Do not ask for an "HTP counselor."

Career Counseling helps students determine which field of study will assist them in preparing for a career. The process requires two counseling appointments and a series of interest assessments (small fee for assessments). Make an appointment with a career counselor at the desk in the Career/Transfer Center, or by calling (310) 660-3593 ext. 3408.

Documenting your attendance: The HTP assistant will give you counseling appointment credit when you bring the HTP office a copy of your educational plan, or a meeting verification note from a transfer counselor. You must also <u>keep your own record</u> of these requirements on the **HTP Completion Form** on page 12 of this Handbook.

TAP and TAG AGREEMENTS

TAP (Transfer Alliance Program) for HTP students who apply to UCLA:

All HTP students are automatically eligible for TAP, and completing the HTP doubles your chances of admission to UCLA. TAP certification gives HTP students <u>priority admission consideration</u> (this is an advantage, but not a guarantee). The minimum GPA needed to be TAP certified is currently at least 3.2 for UC transferable courses (from all colleges you have attended) and at least 3.0 for major prep courses, but is subject to change every year. To increase your chances of admission to UCLA, you are encouraged to **list an alternate (non-impacted) major in the College of Letters and Science when you apply to UCLA online,** and to prepare for the alternate major by taking several courses in that field. You will be required to list an alternate non-impacted major if your GPA is less than 3.4 and your major is impacted. **Impacted Majors**: *Biochemistry, Biology (all), Business Economics, Communication Studies, Economics, English, Global Studies, History, Human Biology and Society, International Development Studies, Life Sciences (all), Political Science, Psychology, and Sociology.*

TAP is an agreement with UCLA College of Letters and Science only and **does not** apply to majors in the School of Engineering & Applied Science, School of the Arts & Architecture, School of Theatre, Film & Television, and School of Nursing; **however, if you are willing to list an alternate (non-impacted) major which** <u>is</u> **in the College of Letters and Science,** you may be TAP certified and will increase your chances of admission to UCLA. Example: engineering majors may list mathematics as an alternate.

In late October, TAP details will be emailed to all HTP students, and those who apply to UCLA will sign up to attend a TAP certification workshop to be held in February. **Only two honors courses will be accepted during the final spring semester before transfer,** and all HTP requirements must be finished by the end of spring semester. It is recommended that you take **no more than two major prep courses** (especially for impacted majors) during your final spring. **UCLA will not accept courses taken during your final summer** to complete the requirements of the HTP and the admissions/selection criteria of the university.


At the end of spring semester, HTP notifies UCLA which students have successfully completed HTP requirements. Your final transcript is examined by UCLA evaluators to confirm completion of major prep and other transfer requirements. Even if you are TAP certified and admitted, **UCLA may rescind your admission** if you do not complete HTP and transfer requirements.

TAG for UCD, UCSD, UCSC, UCI, UCSB, UCR, UCM (for all ECC students):

TAG (Transfer Admission Guarantee) is a contract between you and a specific university. The Career/Transfer Center maintains an up-to-date list of campuses which offer TAG agreements. Since requirements vary among different campuses, it is important that you attend a TAG workshop and meet with a transfer counselor before the end of September. Make a counseling appointment by calling (310) 660-3593 x 3408.

CSUDH: Pathways to Success Enrollment Partnership is a contract between you and CSUDH, which guarantees to admit you as an upper-division transfer student* if you complete the stated requirements. You must meet with the university representative once each semester. For more details, make an appointment with a transfer counselor. Call (310) 660-3593 x 3408.

HOW TO APPLY TO THE HONORS TRANSFER PROGRAM Only complete application packets will be considered.

First: apply for admission to El Camino College online at www.elcamino.edu.

Second: take the English and math placement tests, and see a counselor about "Additional Notes" or "Additional Prerequisites" on the paperwork given to you by the Assessment Center.

Third: meet with an ECC counselor to complete an education plan (Ed Plan).

Fourth: complete an ECC orientation, either in person or online. (Note: placement testing, orientation, and Ed plans may be done in any order; they do NOT need to be completed in the order listed here.)

Fifth: apply to the HTP by the deadline, by submitting the following items in the following order:

- 1. The application form (last page of this handbook). Be sure to sign it!
- 2. **A typed, double-spaced essay of at least 600 words** that addresses the following:

What is your intended major? Discuss your interest in the subject and any experience you have had in the field (such as volunteer work, internships and employment, participation in student organizations and activities) and what you have gained from your involvement. Furthermore, explain a personal quality, accomplishment, life experience, or contribution that relates to your intended major.

OR

If you have not chosen a specific major, describe how you will search for and select a major while here at ECC. Discuss how you will pursue experiences that will help you determine your potential interest and success in that field. Discuss a personal quality, accomplishment, or life experiences that will contribute to your success in the Honors Transfer Program and in whatever major you eventually choose.

- 3. Your completed **HTP Open Book Test** (page 14).
- 4. Verification of eligibility for (or completion of) English 1A: qualifying scores on both parts of the English Placement Test, or College Board AP exam score of 3 or more, or a counselor clearance, or the Early Assessment Program document, or college transcript showing current enrollment in (or completion of) English 1A, or a college transcript showing current enrollment in (or completion of) prerequisite courses for English 1A.
- 5. **Your high school transcript**: new students just finishing high school must ask their high school counselor for an unofficial transcript showing the name of the student, name of the school, grades, and cumulative GPA through the end of the fall semester of the senior year. **NOTES**: You must be <u>finishing</u> high school in order to start the HTP. If you have been attending ECC while in high school, you must re-apply to ECC as a <u>new</u> student. If you are not yet 18 at the time you apply, you must include a letter from a high school official (on school letterhead) confirming your imminent graduation date. If you graduate high school after June 1st and wish to attend summer session at ECC you must also submit a letter from a high school official regardless of your age. Take the original letter to the Admissions Office after you apply to ECC online, <u>and</u> include a copy of that letter with your HTP application. If you are leaving high school early using the California High School Proficiency Certificate, you will not be accepted to the HTP your first semester at El Camino. Follow instructions on page 4 for submitting the Grade Progress Report.

Your college transcript(s): students who have completed some college courses must submit unofficial transcripts (showing the name of the student, name of the school, grades, and cumulative GPA) from all colleges attended, including ECC. Print your transcript from MyECC and look at your <u>transfer unit summary</u>: if it does not show at least <u>nine</u> transferable units completed, include a **Grade Progress Report** with your application. On your ECC transcript, <u>highlight honors courses</u> you have already completed.

6. Include a **Grade Progress Report** if applicable, as described above and on page 4.

WHEN TO APPLY TO THE HONORS TRANSFER PROGRAM

Apply to begin the HTP in Summer/Fall 2016:

The application period begins on March 1, 2016 and ends on March 31, 2016.

The application deadline to begin the program in Summer/Fall 2016 is Thursday, March 31, 2016.

Students who complete the application process by the deadline and are accepted to the program will receive priority registration.

*IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL APPLICANTS: Students who are new to ECC will have to complete four crucial steps before **the HTP application deadline** in order to receive priority registration. The steps are:

- 1. An ECC application
- 2. An ECC orientation (either online or in person)
- 3. An education plan (EdPlan) with an ECC counselor
- 4. Assessment testing for Math/English placement

Submit only the following items (described in detail on page 16), in the following order:

- 1. Your completed and signed HTP application form (page 18)
- 2. Your essay as described on page 16
- 3. Your completed HTP Open Book Test, with all questions answered correctly (see page 14)
- 4. Verification of eligibility for English 1A, by one of the methods described on page 16
- 5. All appropriate transcripts (highlight completed college honors courses)
- 6. Grade Progress Report if applicable (see page 4)
- 7. Documentation if under age 18 (see page 16)

Staple these items together and bring the packet to Student Services Center during the hours that Counseling is open. Leave your packet in the plastic pocket on the HTP director's door, SSC 102F.

Your application will not be considered if:

- You miss the deadline
- Your application packet is not complete
- You do not meet the HTP requirements
- You did not follow the instructions in this Handbook
- You submit your whole Handbook

Your application status: you will be notified via your ECC email address within two weeks after the application deadline, followed by a letter mailed to your home address on your application.

Priority registration for the upcoming session and semester will be given to all students who apply on time and are accepted. Registration information will be emailed to your ECC email address.

Students are accepted at the discretion of the HTP directors.
