New Uniform Dress Code:

All cosmetology students are required to adhere to the following uniform dress code:

All visible attire must be black in color.

An opaque black lab coat or smock is required. The lab coat may be purchased from any local beauty supply house. Lab coats must remain buttoned, snapped, zippered, or otherwise kept closed during class. Shear, see-through, or revealing garments are not acceptable attire unless covered by the lab coat. Any visible clothing that protrudes from the lab coat



must be black in color. Scarves, or other decorative attire, must be black, dangling or hanging materials must be secured with ends tethered and covered by the lab coat.

Full-length pants, socks and/or stockings are required and must be black in color. _____

Black closed-toe, closed-heel, leather or rubber soled shoes with less than 2 inch heels are required. Tennis shoes meeting the aforementioned requirements are acceptable.



The shoes pictured on the right are made by Keds and Converse, respectively, and cost about \$35. Sandals, slippers, flip-flops, or shoes with heels in excess of two inches are not acceptable and are not to be worn in class. ______initial



Note: You will get credit(s) for applied effort in the classroom.

<u>Uniform attire must be on upon entering classroom.</u> If you are not in uniform attire upon entering the classroom you will be sent home.

Punctuality and Attendance:

All cosmetology students must report to their assigned station for each class session on time in proper attire with all required books and materials.

Cosmetology students are required to be punctual and attend cosmetology courses regularly. During the first week *any instance of tardiness or absence* may result in a student being dropped from the class.

After the first week, the Cosmetology Department provides the following allowances for student tardiness and/or absence:

Day students will be dropped from class when tardiness or absence during the semester exceeds a maximum 45 hours.

Each instance of tardiness and/or absence is rounded up and accumulated in quarter hour (15 minute) increments. i.e., a tardiness of 7½ minutes will result in a 15 minute deduction from the allowable absence time remaining. Tardiness at the beginning of class in excess of the first 30 minutes is recorded as an absence and the entire class session will be deducted from the student's allowed time. ______initial

Each instance and time that a student spends outside of the classroom, other than that designated as break time or directly expressed by the instructor will be similarly rounded up, accumulated in quarter hour (15 minute) increments, and deducted from the student's remaining allowable absence time. Students who exceed the stated maximum limits will be dropped from this semester's cosmetology class. ______initial

Electronic Devices:

All electronic devices (ipads, iphones, ear-piece, beepers, etc) must be turned off in the classroominitial
Cellular Phones : Phones must be off and put away during classroom hours. Phones calls are to be handled outside the building, never inside the building even if you are on break. One warning will be given if a phone is out. After that, you will be clocked out for the rest of the class, resulting in absent hours. If you are caught texting or talking on the phone, you will be clocked out immediately with no warninginitial
Text messaging will not be tolerated during class initial
Laptop devices in classroom No devices in classroominitial
Behavior: If a student(s) is disruptive in class for any reason(s) they may be asked to leave for the day and lose absence hours. Being disrespectful in class to your fellow classmates, an instructor, and to guest speakers will not be tolerated. Talking out lout or out of turn, using unacceptable language, or interrupting the class is behaviors that are not acceptable. Exercise common courtesy while other classes are in session, and quietly exit classroom and hallwayinitial
Sleeping in class will not be tolerated and can result in dismissal and loss hours for the day initial
Zero Tolerance : The cosmetology department will not tolerate any cheating, fighting, stealing, or plagiarism. Should any of these actions be acted upon, students will be subjected to two days of suspension, and the missed hours will count against your absent hours which are 45 hours. Violation of such laws, policies, rules, and regulations or behavior adversely affecting suitability as a student, will lead to disciplinary action. Review the Student

STANDARDS OF STUDENT CONDUCT

This is condensed version of standards of conduct found on pages 25 – 27 of the El Camino College Catalog. The following misconduct shall constitute good cause for discipline, including but not limited to the removal, suspension or expulsion of a student.

1.	Academic Dishonesty - Cheating or plagiarism (including copying another or former students work.)
2.	Disruptive Behavior, Inappropriate Conduct, and Expression - Disruptive behavior, willful disobedience, profanity or vulgarity, or the open defiance of the authority of, or the abuse of, college personnel
3.	Drugs, Alcohol and Smoking - Unlawful possession, use, sale, offer to sell, or furnishing, or being under the influence of, any controlled substance such as alcoholic beverage, or intoxicants of any kind and unlawfully possessing, offering arranging, or negotiating the sale of any drug paraphernalia
4.	Theft, Robbery, and Damage – Committing or attempting to commit robbery or extortion.
5.	Weapons and Misuse of Facilities – Possessing, selling, or furnishing any firearm, knife, explosive or other dangerous objects.
6.	Causing, attempting to cause, or threatening to cause physical injury to another person or staff.

8.	Engaging in unlawful harassing, hazing, or injurious behavior for any reason or discriminatory behavior based on race, gender, religion, age, sexual orientation, national origin, disability, or any other status protected by law
9.	Persistent or habitual serious misconduct where other means of correction have failed to bring about proper conduct
10.	Persistent violation of classroom standards of conduct as established by the Instructor. Such as – Sleeping in class, Cell phone abuse, absent well beyond appointed break and return time, talking during a lecture or demonstration. Any direction given by the Instructor during the period of instruction. Any violation time will be deducted from the student's time card
