This course introduces the basic principles and history related to the national firefighter life safety initiatives. Emphasis will be placed on the need for cultural and behavior change throughout emergency services. Focus is placed on assessing fire dangers and handling common fire situations.

Margins: Shall not be greater than 1.5 inches and not less than .5 inch at the top

and both sides. An exception shall be made for the title page.

Fonts: Shall be size 12 (actual size), unless otherwise specified.

Spacing: All lines shall be double-spaced (note spacing).

Title Page: Center the title of your class project **one-third from the top of the page.**

Use a **20 font and bold** for the title, only (see title page example).

Double-space and center below the title, the course.

Double-space and center below the course, your name.

Double-space and center below your name, the date completed.

<u>Introduction:</u> Center Introduction no more than 1.5 inches from the top of the page and

underline. Measure to ensure accuracy.

Start your page numbering with the Introduction. (e.g., 1; or page 1; or

page 1 of 6) at the bottom of the page and center.

Address each numbered page with your last name in the upper, right-

hand corner.

Describe your "game plan" or why you've chosen this Firefighter.

Must be a minimum of one-half page.

(Content): Center the **title of your paper** no more than 1.5 inches from the top of

the page and underline. Did you measure?

Answer the questions that were discussed in class using a

"Question/Answer" format.

Must be a minimum of one page and no more than two pages.

Conclusion: Center Conclusion no more than 1.5 inches from the top of the page and

underline. Margin?

Describe how this project has assisted you towards your goal of

becoming a Firefighter.

Must be a minimum of one-half page.

<u>Pictures:</u> Center Pictures no more than 1.5 inches from the top of the page and

underline. This is my last advisory about measuring your margins.

Must have at least one picture of the class project author with the person

interviewed. Other options need to be approved.

Submitting: Staple your class project in the upper, left-hand corner. NO folders and

NO sheet protectors. Do you see the mistake?
