UPDATE ON FALL 2015 SLO AND PLO REPORT COMPLETION

CM 1 has submitted all reports. They are also reviewing SLOs reports in terms of submitting an analysis of the data instead of a list of instructor comments.

When the ALC reviews submitted reports, they focus on the results section for a summary of what was learned when assessing the SLO.

- S. Bucher requested a summary of the SLO results in TracDat for each course that is being assessed. S. Bucher needs to submit a report of any cancelled classes by week three in order to remove those courses from the assessment timeline.
- CS 1, 2, 3, 12 and 16 are being assessed. The CS Department will need all of the results for SLO 2 in order to write the PLO.
- S. Bucher will email the SLO Coordinators to urge them to complete the SLO so the PLO can be completed.

Committee D is working on SLO 4. Questions for Math 37, 40 and 73 have been submitted. Math 12, 23, 60, 67 and 80 are pending.

CM 2 is assessing SLO 1. Questions for Math 130 and 165 have been submitted. Math 140, 150 and Engineering 1 are currently being worked on.

CM 3 has submitted all questions.

CS Department is assessing SLO 3 for CS 12, 30 and 40.

Spring 2016 SLO assessment schedule is posted in the mailroom.

Spring 2016 SLO questions are due by Friday 2/5/16.

DISCUSSION ABOUT GETTING QUESTIONS TURNED IN PRIOR TO SEMESTER BEGINNING

It may be challenging to have questions ready prior to the start of the semester.

Recommendation to make this an agenda item for the last SLO meeting of the year.

The department will work on questions during the spring semester to have them completed before the fall semester begins. The questions will be collected at the end of the spring semester.

SLO coordinators should send out the question to instructors as soon as possible so they can place it on one of their tests even before the final.

M. Georgevich sent the question out to Math 130 instructors and S. Bucher sent the question to all Math 40 instructors.

A template should be sent along with the questions to record the results.

Two questions were added to the analysis part: 1). What is an action you would take to improve your results? 2). What action would you take as a committee to improve results?

Remind Course Coordinators to send out previous results so some of the suggestions can be implemented on how to improve results. This will also assist in allowing adjunct faculty the opportunity to try some of the action items suggested.

M. Georgevich recommends copying and pasting just the action item in the memo when completing the SLO assessment.

DEAN'S REMARKS


All instructors should have at least viewing access of SLO/PLO reports in TracDat, This is being worked on.
