COMMITTEE D

There were successful meetings regarding Math 67 during spring 2016. The course is ready to be voted on at the next department meeting.

Committee D will try to address Math 37 in the fall. Most of the changes will be regarding a reduced load and a change in the lab/lecture pattern.

A. Hockman reminded all that changes must be completed before 10/31/16 or the new course will not go into effect for another year.

CM 2

The Math Department is not offering Math 160 or 161 this semester. We can begin the inactivation process. The SLOs for any active courses will need to be evaluated so this could be an issue if Math 160 and 161 are not inactivated.

Math 150H has been approved with CM2 but will need to go through consultation before coming to DCC. The goal is to offer Math 150H in fall 2017, which means it needs to be completed this semester.

CM 3

Math 115 and 116 will be coming to DCC in the spring.

CS

L. Ternes discussed that the AP Computer Science course is now focused on Java (was previously C++). The College Catalog will be changed stating that students who pass the AP CS exam with a 4 or 5 will receive credit for CS 3 (Java) instead of CS 1 (C++).
