**MATH 100**

The course received sufficient yea votes and will be inactivated.

**MATH 130**

Mr. Scott distributed a summary of the justifications and changes to the course.

**MATH 170 AND 180**

According to Quajuana Chapman, the Math 170 review can be postponed until spring. Dr. Kjeseth noted that any revisions made in spring will be effective in the fall of 2015.

Mr. Scott reported that Math 170 will be ready for the first January, 2014, meeting of the College Curriculum Committee.

**PUBLIC ACCOUNTABILITY IN THE CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT/REVISION PROCESS**

Dr. Kjeseth reported that there is a statewide push by the Curriculum Institute that would redefine “course revision” to bring it into compliance with the Brown Act. That would mean the College Curriculum Committee would no longer vote online, but be required to review course revisions and hold votes at their meetings. It may be that the division curriculum committees could be held to the same standard.

**OTHER**

Math 67 is not currently degree applicable. If this were to become degree applicable, there would need to be discussions within the Math department and the Academic Senate.

**OTHER - Continued**

In a few years there will be a change in the funding and governing of adult education courses. This changed will mean that some courses, such as Math 12, could no longer be offered as a credit course.

The Summer Math Academy may become non-credit courses and be taught by those with Bachelor's Degrees.

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
