“Pluto Close-Up”

Discovered in 1930, Pluto is so small and distant that little was known about it until the New Horizons spacecraft flew by it in the summer of 2015. Pluto, its large moon Charon, and its four small moons turned out to be surprisingly complex worlds. Pluto itself is a world unlike any seen previously, with glaciers, floating mountains, icy volcanism and a surface covered with solid air.
