Dear Members of the Board:

I am authoring this letter in President Fallo's absence. At this time, we expect him to return in time for the Board meeting; however, if the storm in Washington, D.C. is as massive as anticipated, we may not see him.

This month's Board meeting takes place on Tuesday, February 18, and begins at 3:00 p.m. with the dedication of the James Russell sculpture. Mr. Russell was one of our 50 Distinguished Alumni and has expressed his great appreciation and delight at having his work displayed at his alma matre.

I am pleased to report that the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) acted to remove El Camino College from Warning status during its January 7-10, 2014 meeting. The Commission verified that the College addressed the recommendation and achieved the level of Proficiency for SLO assessments. With this final determination, all nine recommendations from the 2008 comprehensive accreditation visit have been resolved. However, we cannot rest on our laurels and will instead move forward into our comprehensive visit this fall with a "clean slate."

A draft of the Self-Evaluation Report is now available for input from the El Camino College community. You are more than welcome to read the 279 page document and provide your feedback. The link is as follows: http://www.elcamino.edu/accreditation/Draft-ECCAccreditationSelf-Evaluation-2014.pdf If this is too daunting a task, select the sections that are of interest to you. May I recommend Standard IV-B, Board and Administrative Organization?

Keep in mind that Commencement takes place almost a month earlier this year, May 16, in a new venue. With the demolition of Murdock Stadium, this year's Commencement will take place on the softball field. The decision to hold Commencement on the softball field was an angst-filled conversation with students, College Council, Facilities, Office of Student Development and the Physical Education Department. Other venues considered were Marsee Auditorium, Parking Lot L, new practice field, or an off-campus

venue. In the end, the softball field was selected in order to hold one Commencement ceremony that could accommodate all graduates and their guests with the least amount of damage to our facilities.

A number of important activities are happening this month in honor of Black History. If your schedule permits, please attend any of these events. A Black History Month schedule (Attachment A) is enclosed for your reference.

Our partnership with UCLA Extension is commencing this spring with the offering of three certificate programs (Attachment B). We believe these programs will offer an opportunity for adults in our community to upgrade their skills at the El Camino College campus rather than taking the slow drive west to UCLA or Santa Monica.

In answer to some of the questions raised regarding our outreach efforts, an Outreach Report (Attachment C) is presented for your review. Next month, a presentation will be made regarding our outreach activities and plans.

This Tuesday's meeting begins with a presentation on the Implementation of the Student Success Act of 2012. This historical legislation mandates a number of required services for our students and also incentivizes students with priority registration for completing their assessment, orientation, and educational planning.

The rest of our agenda is fairly routine and is highlighted as follows:

- 1. Academic Affairs section presents a fairly lengthy summary of curricular actions because Title 5 now requires Board approval for all curricular changes (See Attachment D).
- 2. Student and Community Advancement section includes an international recruitment trip to Tokyo. Outcomes from the previous recruitment trip can be reviewed on Attachment E. Also included is a Board Policy for a First Reading, a grant application and grant acceptance.
- 3. Administrative Services includes routine contracts, a resolution declaring our intent to lease the CDC property, and the El Camino College Sound Fiscal Management Assessment (Attachment F).

- 4. Administrative Services Measure E section recommends the approval of the architectural contract for the New Main Gym and Physical Education Project (Attachment G).
- 5. Human Resources section includes routine personnel items and a series of Board policies for Second Reading and Adoption and two procedures for information purposes only.
- 6. The Superintendent/President and Board of Trustees section presents five policies for a First Reading.

The Closed Session agenda includes a personnel item, an update on pending litigation, and negotiations update.

To add to your knowledge and to adorn your bookshelf, we have two binders containing the ECC Fact Book, Community Profiles and K-12 Enrollment/Outcomes. The second binder contains the same information for our Compton Center. This material is given to you annually and will help inform your conversations within the community.

If you have any questions, comments or concerns about the February agenda, please feel free to call Ms. Cindy Constantino or me prior to the meeting so we may research responses to your requests. Please plan to meet in President Fallo's office a little before the 3:00 p.m. dedication of the James Russell sculpture.



UCLA Extension Program

Last year administrators from the UCLA Extension Program approached the Vice President of Academic Affairs to discuss the possibility of offering extension courses on the ECC campus. The UCLA Extension program is offered primarily on the university campus with an outreach extension program at Santa Monica College. In an effort to better serve the greater western Los Angeles community the program is seeking to expand southward from the university to improve access. ECC is located in an ideal location for the planned expansion. ECC is also located near major corporations and LAX. UCLA Extension offers a wide selection of certificate and training programs to help persons upgrade their skills in the labor market. The Extension Program administrators believe there is a demand for selected programs on the ECC campus.


It is proposed that UCLA will rent ECC classrooms with audio visual support to offer three UCLA Extension courses each quarter for the period of one year. The certificates are in Project Management, Finance and Transformational Leadership in Health Care. These certificates were recommended by the Extension Program as a result of a marketing survey conducted last year to assess the interest in various programs. These programs do not compete with any ECC courses or certificate programs and are available to ECC students interested in the courses.

Three programs and courses will be offered each quarter: Spring 2014, March 31 – June 22; Summer 2014, June 23 – September 14; and Fall 2014, September 29- to December 21, 2014. UCLA will pay ECC \$85 per each course meeting. Each course is 12 weeks long. Attached is a copy of the brochure for each of the programs starting in March 2014. The Extension Program will host an Open House on March 20, 6 – 8 p.m. at El Camino College.







Personnel

The Office of Outreach & School Relations (OSR) is currently staffed by a full-time Director and Student Services Specialist. In addition, part-time classified, student workers and outreach counselors have been utilized to meet the outreach demands of in-district and out-of-district high schools. The number of positions is determined by the budget assigned to the outreach office and the need to grow student enrollment. During the years in which the College was growing, a robust outreach counselor program and part-time staff augmented the staffing of the OSR. In addition, many of our categorical and specialized programs assisted in the outreach efforts.

The following El Camino College entities provide(d) additional outreach services: Career Technical Education (CTE), Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE), El Camino College Inglewood Center (closed 1/2011), Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS), Financial Aid Office (FAO), First Year Experience (FYE), Honors Transfer Program (HTP), Special Resource Center (SRC), Teacher Education Program (TEP), and Women-In-Industry and Technology (WIT).

Budget

The Office of Outreach & School Relations budget includes compensation for outreach personnel, supplies, and other office expenditures. The budget for outreach counselors was provided by Matriculation funding until 2008-09 when this categorical allocation was reduced statewide by 50%. Other categorically funded program budgets were also cut and the number of students they could serve was reduced by the state. The Student Ambassador program was continued with support from the ECC Foundation from 2010-2012.

With the passage of the Student Success Act of 2012, El Camino College has restored the OSR budget utilizing the newly established Student Success and Support Program (SSSP) funding. The outreach counselor program was re-established in 2013-14 and the budget for the Student Ambassador program was stabilized with SSSP funding.

College Promotional Items

High School Scholarships

Since 2007-2008, the El Camino College Foundation & Scholarship Office has guaranteed each public, in-district high school \$1,000 scholarships for at least one and up to three graduating seniors who plan to enroll at ECC the subsequent summer/fall term. These scholarships are renewable for a second year as long as the students meet the scholarship criteria. Information about the scholarships is sent to each high school principal or designee in January and it is the responsibility of high school personnel to inform their students of the scholarship and to select the recipient. Follow-up is made by the Foundation Office and the Director of OSR to encourage nominations from each high school. The annual budget for this scholarship is approximately \$60,000.



The reason the curriculum action items are as long as they are is because I am including non-substantive changes. In this agenda, the changes to the curriculum are presented with the strikeouts of the old language and underlines of the new language. If I included the final draft of the changes, this agenda item would increase in length significantly.

Leonid Rachman, International Student Recruiter, recently participated in the ELS Educational Services Northeast Asia Fall Tour (October 10-27, 2013), and included visits to China, Japan, Russia, and South Korea. Because of the College's long-standing reputation with ELS Educational Services, ELS provided a travel grant which paid the majority of Mr. Rachman's expenses for this tour. ELS printed a special brochure and advertised 12 selected institutions. El Camino College is one of the 12 institutions selected. The publication will be distributed to all ELS schools in over 20 different languages. The following information is provided regarding the outcome of the tour for each location visited:
