Student Success: Degrees/Certificates Increase

A recent report indicates that as a whole, the number of students earning degrees and certificates continued to steadily increase at both El Camino College and ECC Compton Center for academic years 2008-09 to 2012-13. El Camino College's degrees and certificates increased by 20 percent and 22 percent, respectively, for the five-year period. These increases totaled more than 2,600 degrees and certificates for the first time in at least 20 years. This was partly fueled by the first graduating cohorts of Associate of Arts for Transfer (A.A.-T) students, as well as strong growth in the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) majors. A total of 79 degrees were earned across three different A.A.-T majors (communications, psychology, and sociology). Additionally, strong increases were seen among STEM degrees and certificates, with past-year growth of 79 percent and 81 percent, respectively.

El Camino College Compton Center awarded a total of 380 degrees and certificates in the same five-year period. From the previous year, degrees increased 23 percent. The Natural Sciences division experienced the greatest growth, increasing by 200 percent compared to the previous year. Similar to El Camino College, ECC Compton Center saw large growth in the number of STEM degrees and certificates awarded, with past-year growth of 300 percent and 900 percent, respectively. The first students to complete training in El Camino College's Homeland Security Education program recently celebrated at a ceremony held at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX). Fifty-one Transportation Security Administration (TSA) employees received a Certificate of Accomplishment from ECC. Through this partnership between El Camino College and the TSA at LAX, the inaugural class completed specially designed courses in homeland security. The program includes career guidance and opportunities for participants to complete a certificate of achievement and/or an associate degree in the college's Administration of Justice program.

ECC is one of only six community colleges in California authorized by the TSA to offer this program.

The partnership has worked so well that El Camino College has expanded the program. "Introduction to Administration of Justice" was added to the curriculum for spring.

Space Science Day

El Camino College welcomes NASA Astronaut Col. Douglas H. Wheelock to Onizuka Space Science Day 2014, scheduled from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday, March 8 at the college's planetarium and science classrooms. Sponsored by El Camino College and American Honda Motor Co., Inc., and coordinated by the



El Camino College Astronaut Ellison Onizuka Memorial Committee, the event is dedicated to Ellison Onizuka, a Space Shuttle Challenger astronaut who perished along with six other crew members during the tragic events of 1986. It is free and open to serious-minded science students in grades five through 12.

Wheelock began astronaut candidate training in August 1998, and since then he has flown aboard the space shuttle, the International Space Station and the Russian Soyuz TMA spacecraft. He has accumulated more than 178 days in space and has conducted six spacewalks totaling 43 hours and 30 minutes. His experience outside of the station includes four contingency spacewalks.

During Onizuka Space Science Day, Astronaut Wheelock will make a presentation to students before they join classroom activities and demonstrations led by El Camino College professors, students, and guests from JPL and other institutions.
