
Argelia Andrade, Humanities, Spanish instructor. Argelia has a doctorate in Hispanic languages and literature, a master's degree in

Student Success: Grant Brings Engineering Ed to Area High Schools

El Camino College is a partner in a recently awarded multi-million dollar grant to bring engineering education to area high schools, while also creating a pathway to college and career opportunities. ECC is part of the five-college Consortium for Advanced Manufacturing, which secured a \$15 million grant from the California Department of Education through the California Career Pathways Trust, a \$250 million competitive grant program. Long Beach City College will serve as the fiscal lead on the grant project that also includes Cerritos College, Harbor College, and Pasadena City College.

ECC's share of the grant is approximately \$2.8 million, which will be used to implement the highly successful engineering technology pathway - known as Project Lead the Way (PLTW) - at the partner colleges. PLTW is already in place at ECC and Cerritos College, offering exciting courses such as principles of engineering, introduction to engineering design, and computer integrated manufacturing. AIMS Team Update

The newly formed AIMS Team (Assessment, Intervention and Managecess of completing, a minimum of ment for Safety) is a group of individuals from several disciplines and areas who work together to maintain a safe community at ECC. Coordinated within the Emergency Preparedness Organization, the AIMS Team is co-chaired by Janet Schaeffer and Chief Michael Trevis. With the violent events that have occurred in the past two decades, even as recently as last year at nearby Santa Monica College, schools have been forming teams to address the issues involved in campus safety.

One of the main functions of AIMS is to collect as much information as possible about behaviors that are of concern to faculty, staff and students. Once a report is received by the team, the information is evaluated and a determination is made regarding the intervention, which almost always involves gathering more information. Detailed information brings additional opportunities to be proactive and effective in intervening to remedy a problem.

The AIMS Team wants to hear from you! The team can only be effective when problems are detected before they become crises: REPORT, IN-FORM, and SHARE.
