Equipment, Furniture, and Supply Funds Allocated

Through the college planning process, approximately \$500,000 has been prioritized to fund projects that support instruction and student support service programs. In one project designed to enhance teaching and learning, several classrooms in the Music Building will undergo a rewiring that will allow instructors to adjust light levels so that PowerPoint presentations, films and other visual images and information can be viewed by students. The Anthropology Museum will also receive a lighting upgrade. In addition, the MBA Building, Behavioral & Social Sciences Division, and the Fine Arts Division will receive new furniture and equipment. The funding is part of a planning process that included input from students, faculty, staff and managers. Allocated funds are the end result of the linkage between planning, budgeting and the program review process. All of the equipment was identified through program plans and via program review recommendations.
