Through the college's Emergency Preparation Committee, active shooter training will be expanded, beginning with emergency responders such as building captains, floor leaders and other emergency personnel, so that they know their roles and responsibilities prior to performing an actual exercise. ### State Budget 2016-17 Update

Governor Jerry Brown released his proposal for the 2016-17 state budget. For California's community colleges, highlights include:

- An increase of \$114.7 million in general purpose apportionments, a 2% increase in full-time equivalent enrollment
- \$283 million increase for deferred maintenance, instructional equipment, and specific types of water conservation projects; no matching funds will be required
- \$48 million increase to support the Career Technical Education Pathways Program
- \$200 million increase for the Strong Workforce Program, to allow districts to expand access to additional career technical education courses and programs and regional accountability structures aligned with the Workforce Task Force recommendations
- \$76.3 million (about \$64 per FTES) in discretionary funds to be used at local discretion, which would be counted by the state as offsetting mandate reimbursement claims
- \$45.2 million is proposed in Proposition 39 funds to support energy efficiency projects and clean energy job development programs in 2016-17
- \$30 million increase for the Basic Skills Program to implement practices that increase students' mobility to college-level courses
- \$29.3 million to reflect a 0.47% costof-living adjustment (COLA)

The Governor's budget proposal is the first step in a six-month long legislative process. We will continue to monitor changes in budget figures and priorities.

### **Trustees Conduct Annual Organizational Meeting**

Three El Camino Community College District Board of Trustees members were sworn in at the regular board meeting on December 14. All three incumbents, William Beverly, Mary Combs and Kenneth Brown, were appointed in lieu of an election in an uncontested race. Additionally, as part of its annual organizational meeting, the board appointed Brown as board president, John Vargas as vice president and Cliff Numark will serve as secretary.

In addition, Beverly will serve as the district representative to the Los Angeles County Committee on School District Organization, Numark will represent the district with the Los Angeles County School Trustees Association, Vargas will serve on the El Camino Community College District Foundation board, and Mary Combs will review nominations for membership on the California Community College Trustees Board and make a recommendation the Board of Trustees. Regular board meetings are open to the public and are generally scheduled for 4 p.m. on the third Monday of each month.

### STEM Receives \$50,000 Donation from Toyota

El Camino College recently received a \$50,000 donation from Toyota Motor Sales, U.S.A., Inc. for the college's Endowment for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Student Support Services. Michael Rouse, Toyota's vice president of diversity, philanthropy and community affairs, presented the check last month during the El Camino Community College District board meeting.

Designed to support the college's STEM Endowment, the donation was matched 100 percent by a Hispanic-Serving Institutions - Science, Technology, Engineering, or Mathematics and Articulation Programs federal grant for a total of \$100,000.

Endowment funds will be used to make a direct and significant impact on El Camino College STEM students. Future plans include: purchasing/replacing equipment, initiating technology upgrades, launching STEM-related campus events/seminars, and supporting STEM student events and conferences off campus.
