Her faculty experience is accented with completing a Fellowship in Educational Leadership at the University



of Southern California, and receiving the National Faculty Award for Excellence in Resident Education in 1998 and 2011. She continues working with organizations that promote academia and medical education, such as the Los Angeles Obstetrical & Gynecological Society (past president), the Pacific Coast Obstetrical & Gynecological Society's Los Angeles Caucus (chair), and the OB GYN Assembly of Southern California (executive committee).

Dr. Toy-Wohlmuth is a recipient of the 2011 El Camino College Distinguished Alumni Award, honored for outstanding achievement in her chosen career and service to the community.

A record number of students applied for scholarships this year using the online system. This spring also marks the first year that El Camino College will receive a full distribution from the Osher Scholarship Endowment of \$139,000, which will continue each year.




