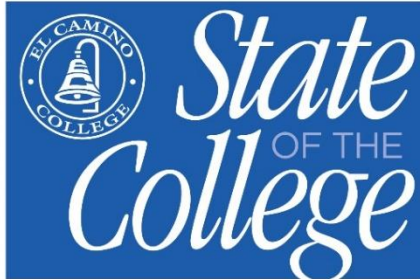

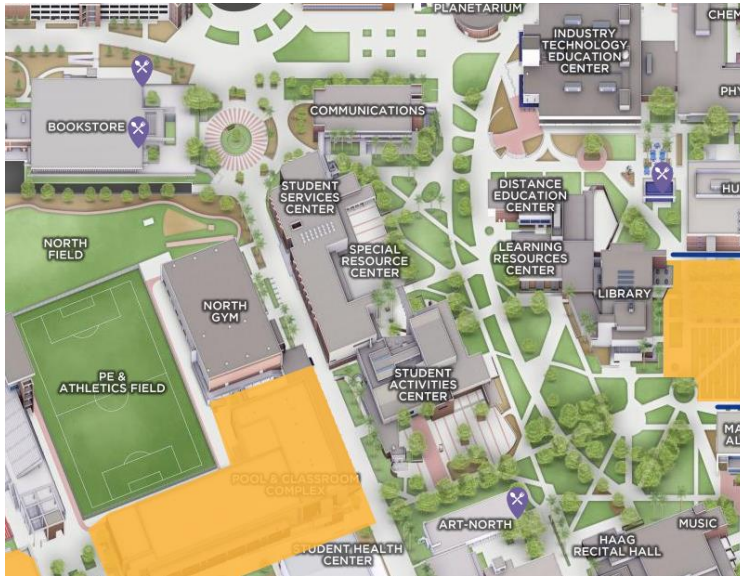

AB 48 – Capital Construction Bond

- Voters must pass the bond
- 9 Billion for K-12
- 2 Billion each for Community Colleges, CSU and UC
- ECC hopes to receive \$20M in matching funds for the Music Building (under the current bond measure)
- ECC has future needs as well – AB48 is important

Campus Sustainability Plan

- Developed for the El Camino College community by campus staff, faculty, and students.
- Identifies short- and long-term goals for the campus that will reduce ongoing operational costs.
- Identified goals will minimize impacts of climate change and depletion of resources, and will encourage new ways of thinking to improve our natural and built environments.
- Represents a collaborative exchange of ideas and opportunities for the entire campus community to be engaged, supportive, and become sustainability champions.

Evening/Weekend Program

Campus Safety

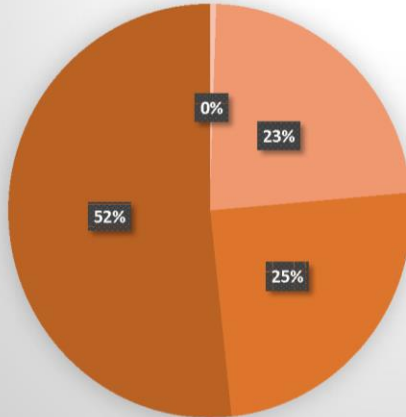
- **Cart Safety Plan**

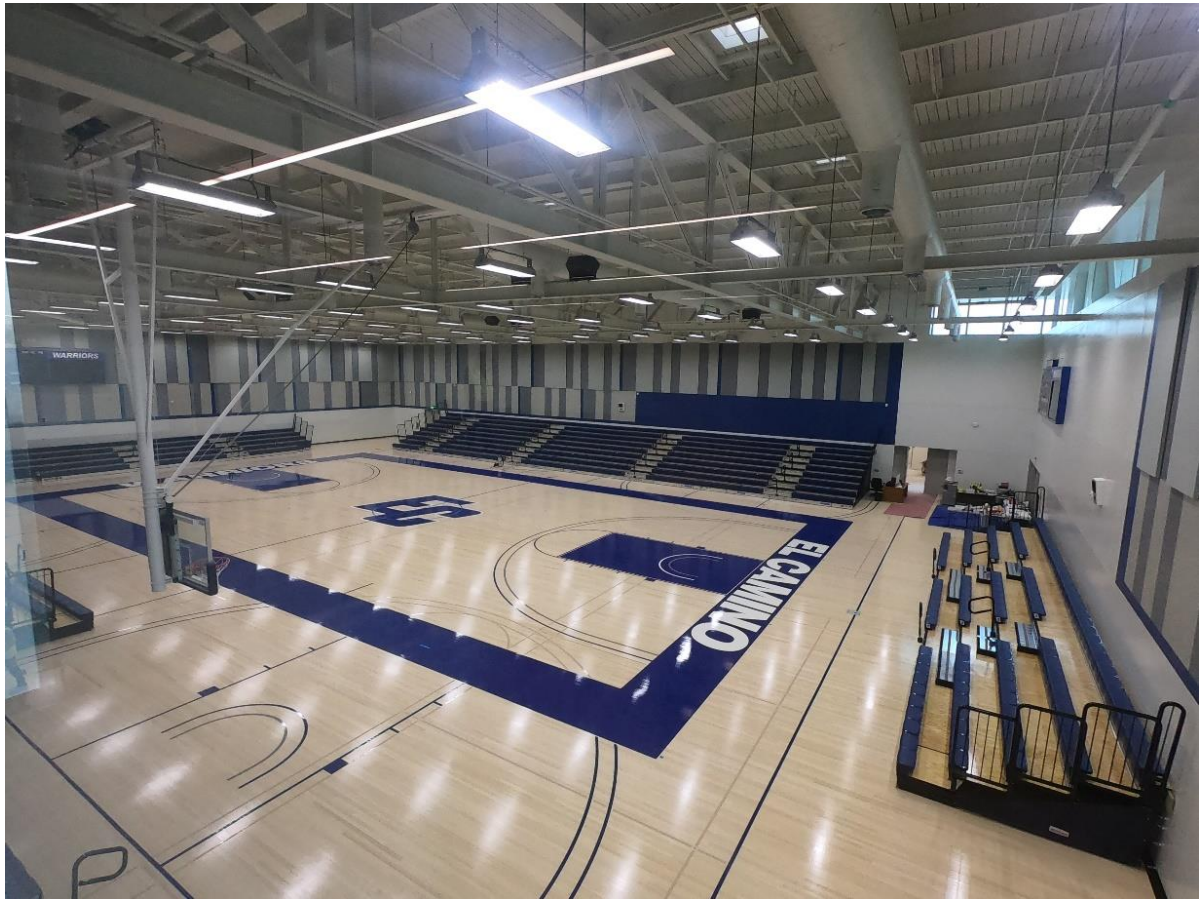

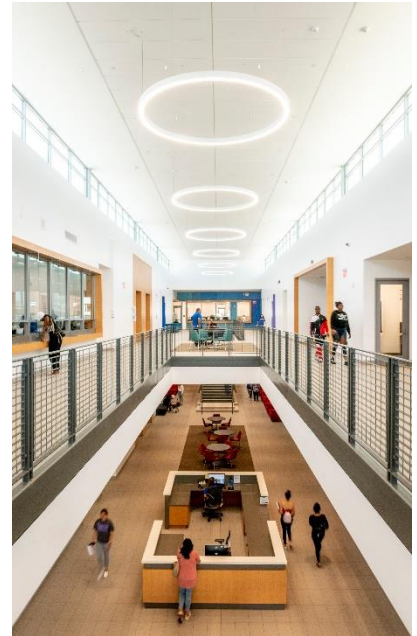
