ECC Student Selected to Serve on California Community Colleges Board of Governors

El Camino College student body president Eman Dalili was recently selected to serve on the California Community Colleges Board of Governors. The appointment was made by Governor Jerry Brown.

Eman will serve as student representative on the state board. An El Camino College student since 2014, Eman is a student ambassador for El Camino College, and is the current president of the Associated Students Organization (ASO), the college's student government body. He previously served as the student representative on the El Camino Community College District Board of Trustees for 2015-2016.

"The opportunity to represent the 2.1 million students in the California Community Colleges is an honor," Eman said. "I am so humbled to receive this appointment from Governor Brown. I truly believe none of this would be possible without the remarkable experience I've had as my role as a president, trustee, ambassador and most important, student at El Camino College.
