El Camino College Anthropology Museum Presents
Final Days of Pottery Exhibit

The El Camino College Anthropology Department announces the final weeks of the unique exhibit, "Lifeways in Clay: Ceramic Traditions of the Southwest." The exhibit is wrapping a successful yearlong run and is available for public viewing until Sept. 28.

This is the only exhibit of Southwestern ceramics in the Southern California area and presents prehistoric, historic, and current ceramics produced by indigenous potters of California, Arizona, New Mexico, and Northern Mexico (Chihuahua). Special attention is given to the pottery of the Santo Domingo potter Robert Tenorio, and the Mexican potter Juan Quezada, the progenitor of the Casas Grandes revival.

The museum is located on the third floor of the El Camino College Arts and Behavioral Sciences Building (Room 301), adjacent to the Marsee Auditorium.

Museum operating hours are from 8:30 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday, and from 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
