El Camino Community College District Boundary Review Committee Schedules Public Forum in El Segundo

The El Camino Community College District Boundary Review Committee (BRC) has scheduled a public forum for 6:30 p.m. November 9 at El Segundo City Hall, 350 Main Street, El Segundo.

The meeting is the fourth of five public forums in October and November designed to gather input regarding modifications of current trustee area boundaries. The fifth and final meeting is set for 6:30 p.m. November 16 at Lawndale City Hall, 14717 Burin Avenue, Lawndale.

The district, along with many other public agencies and school districts in California, is examining voting practices.

In Fall 2010, the El Camino Community College District (ECCCD) board of trustees initiated discussions regarding the process required to modify trustee area boundaries and change from “at large” to “trustee area” elections. New trustee areas would be determined utilizing 2010 census population data.

Currently, trustees in the ECCCD must live in the trustee area they represent, however residents of the ECCCD vote for trustee candidates “at large;” that is, voters cast their vote for all candidates on the ballot. When voting by “trustee area,” residents will only vote for the candidate who resides in their specific trustee area.

All public comments must be submitted by November 30.
