El Camino College Names Five Finalists for New Superintendent/President

Following a nationwide search, the El Camino Community College District Board of Trustees recently announced five finalists for the Superintendent/President position.

Kathleen Burke, president of Los Angeles Pierce College; JoAnna Downey-Schilling, vice president of academic affairs at Cerritos College; Dena Maloney, superintendent/president West Kern Community College District and Taft College; Sandra Mayo, president of Moreno Valley College; and Ron Taylor, superintendent/president of Merced College were selected as final candidates to become the sixth superintendent/president in the college district's 68-year history. The final appointment will be voted on in an open meeting by the El Camino Community College District Board of Trustees.

Each candidate will participate in a Public Forum prior to a closed session interview with the Board of Trustees. Students, faculty, staff, and managers from ECC and ECC Compton Center, as well as community members, are invited to attend the forums, scheduled to take place in the college's Alondra/East Dining Room on the following dates:
