El Camino College to Swear In New Police Chief

Michael J. Trevis will be sworn in as El Camino College's new police chief at 12:30 p.m. July 1 in the Board Room.

Thomas M. Fallo, president of El Camino College, will swear in the college's new chief.

"We welcome Chief Trevis to our campus and are sure to benefit from his solid experience in both the educational environment and the community," President Fallo said.

Trevis joins the 27,000-student Torrance-area campus after more than 30 years of law enforcement experience. He most recently served as police chief for the city of Huntington Park, overseeing a department of 120, including sworn police officers and civilian staff.

He served as chief of police at the Bell Police Department, in addition to other leadership positions in the department. He was also the assistant police chief in Maywood. Trevis worked as a police officer early in his career, and has held positions in both the Los Angeles Unified School District and the Pasadena Unified School District, where he was chief of police.

Trevis takes over the police chief position one year after former El Camino College Police Chief Michael D'Amico passed away after serving the college for 34 years. Police Chief Stephen R. Port held the interim position.

A community college graduate, Trevis earned an associate degree in administration of justice from East Los Angeles College; as well as a bachelor's degree in public administration and a master's degree in organizational leadership, both from the University of La Verne. Trevis is also a graduate of the FBI National Academy and a second-year doctoral student of public administration.
