Post Ground Rules and Netiquette

Ground Rules:

- Be constructive and productive
- Do not gripe or whine
- Ask questions
- Contribute replies
- Expect to be misunderstood
- Don't take things personally
- Be supportive
- Have BIG FUN!



General Rules for Management:

- Keep your posts short one to two paragraphs.
- Keep one topic/question per post don't mix topics.
- Avoid getting into philosophical questions about tool behavior.
- Let's focus on learning how the tools work not how they could work.
- No aside dialogue within the topics. Click on PM and talk to each other.
- Focus on coming up with good uses of the tools for learning.
- Keep your posts short one to two paragraphs.
- It is normal to feel lost. ASK lots of questions.
- Keep one topic/question per post don't mix topics.
