

Assessment

What is the AIMS Team?

AIMS is a multidisciplinary campus threat assessment and behavioral intervention team that collects, assesses, addresses and monitors information about disturbing or threatening behaviors on the El Camino College campus. AIMS strives to assist the campus in intervening before a situation becomes a crisis; before disruptive behaviors become dangerous to the ECC community.

Intervention

AIMS was formed in response to the tragic increase in school violence incidents across the country.

Increased violence has resulted in loss of life as well as physical and emotional damage to individuals.

The AIMS Team plans to engage the campus community to raise awareness of the importance of timely identification, early reporting, assessment and monitoring of potentially threatening situations.
