STEP 1 | Admission

Who is eligible for Admission?

Anyone 18 years of age or older qualifies for admission to El Camino College Compton Center. If under the age of 18, you will qualify if you have 1) graduated from high school or 2) passed the California High School Proficiency Examination.

El Camino College Compton Center may admit as a special part-time student K-12 students who, in the opinion of the Vice President, El Camino College Compton Center, may benefit from instruction. Concurrently enrolled K-12 grade students must comply with all policies, follow all procedures, and meet all requirements by the published deadlines for each semester and/or term.

California Residence Requirement

How is my California residency determined?

Please refer to the California residency section.

How Do I Apply?

Apply online by visiting: www.compton.edu and clicking on Apply Online — it's that easy! New and returning students (those with an absence of a preceeding semester, excluding Summer and Winter Terms) must complete a new application. Official transcripts from all accredited colleges and trade schools attended should be sent directly from the school. If you are applying for Advanced Placement credit, then you must submit your official high school transcripts.

Step 2 | Assessment

How Do I Make Arrangements For Testing?

Personal identification with a photograph and your El Camino College Compton Center I.D. number are required to take tests and receive results.

You must have an application on file <u>prior</u> to any testing. Testing should be completed as soon as possible after you file your admission application. In the catalog, read the description of classes which interest you to learn if there is any testing recommended or needed. Keep in mind that all placement tests are part of the multiple measures of the assessment process. Be sure to take testing results with you when you go for your academic advisement or educational planning sessions.

The placement tests for English, English as a Second Language, and Math are computerized and given on a drop-in basis - no appointment is necessary. Other tests, such as the Chemistry Placement Test, are given on an appointment-basis only. Please contact the Assessment Center for Summer 2012 hours of operation at 310-900-1600 ext. 2830.

All testing is done on campus at the Assessment Center. Testing must be completed before you register for courses. Re-testing is limited and may not be done after you have enrolled in any course related to the test.

STEP 3 | Orientation

All students are encouraged to participate in orientation and to become familiar with El Camino College Compton Center and its resources.

Sign-up for student orientations in the Counseling Department, located in the Administration Building.

Attendance

If you enroll in a class and you do not attend the first scheduled meeting of the class, you may be dropped from the roster and your place may be given to a waiting student. During the course of the term, you may be dropped by your instructor for excessive absences.

STEP 4 | Counseling/ Advisement

How can I get help selecting classes?

Counseling services are available to students through scheduled appointments. A student who has selected a major field of study is strongly encouraged to see one of the counselors assigned to that field; an undeclared or undecided student may see any counselor.

As an integral part of the matriculation program, counseling services are intended to assist students in clarifying career and life goals and in developing an appropriate course of study based on a student's goals, aptitudes and interests.

Drop-in advisement for students who have questions which do not require transcript review is available Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. and Fridays from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The drop-in advisement schedule is subject to change based on counselor availability. Please call the Counseling Department in advance for the daily schedule at 310-900-1600, ext. 2076.

STEP 5 | Registration How do I prepare to register?

- Be sure you meet any prerequisites and corequisites.
- Meet with a counselor to ensure your schedule is in line with your educational goals.

Procedure

Registration appointment information for continuing students will be available beginning May 7,2012. For new and returning students, this information will be available on or after May 31, 2012.

Before you register online, you must confirm your registration date and time.

When Do I Register?

Find out your registration date and time it is available online at: www.compton.edu click on MyECC - Log on and click the Registration (Add and Drop)) then Registration Appointment Date and Time to confirm your registration date and time.

Students may not register prior to the assigned date and time.

How Do I Register?

Register online at www.compton.edu and click on MyECC. Computers are available for student use in the Welcome Center, Financial Aid, Admission Office, and Library.

STEP 6 | Pay Fees

All students who enroll in credit classes must pay an enrollment fee. All fees must be paid by the fee payment deadlines or you will be dropped from *all* classes at both locations. Financial assistance (Board of Governor's Fee Waiver) is available to pay the registration fees and the health fee if the student is eligible. A Board of Governor's Fee Waiver application is available online at www.compton.edu - MyECC, or apply at the Financial Aid Office.

Until all fees are paid, students will not be able to purchase parking permits, receive transcripts, or register for upcoming semesters/terms.

The general fee requirement shall not apply to students enrolled in the non-credit courses specified in Education Code Section 84711.

Students who have a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on file in the Financial Aid Office are encouraged to submit the preliminary documents for review as early as possible. Students are responsible for paying all fees and charges even if they applied for financial aid by the established deadlines.

All fees, including any optional fees, such as a Parking Permit or ASB Student Discount Sticker that may have been requested at the time of registration must be paid by the deadline!

For your convenience, we offer three ways to pay your fees:

- Bring American Express, Discover, MasterCard, Visa, cash or checks to the Bursar's Office
- Mail a check or money order to El Camino College Compton Center; Bursar's Office; 1111 E. Artesia Blvd.; Compton, CA 90221. Be sure to mail your payment 7 days before the deadline. Your check must be received in the Bursar's Office on or before the deadline.

Students on a waitlist for a class must check their El Camino College email daily to find out if they have been admitted to the class. Waitlisted students admitted to the class must pay those class fees by the same deadlines listed above, or they will be dropped from all classes at both the El Camino College and ECC Compton Center locations.

Financial Assistance

All students are encouraged to apply for financial aid by visiting the Financial Aid Office Web page at: www.compton.edu. Begin by clicking the Apply Online button and follow the instructions for a new student (never attended college) or returning student (break in enrollment) or continuing student (no break in enrollment) column. Please review the available resources on the financial aid Web page under the Information Desk, Programs, Services and Free Calculators. California residents may wish to apply for a Board of Governor's Fee Waiver (BOGW) to pay for their enrollment fees. Students are encouraged to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine eligibility for all federal, state and institutional programs. Some students in certain programs such as Cal-WORKS, CARE, or EOP&S may also complete the fee waiver application in addition to the FAFSA form. Please see enclosed applications on pages 11 - 20.

Form of Payment

For any fee paid, El Camino College Compton Center will accept personal checks drawn on United States banks, money orders or cash.

Also honored will be Visa, American Express, MasterCard and Discover credit cards. Checks returned by a student's bank for any reason will result in (1) suspension from enrollment, (2) denial of subsequent registration and (3) detention of transcript until the financial obligation has been satisfied. A service charge of \$20 will be charged on any returned check.

Refunds of Fees

Students must drop their classes online at *MyECC*, according to the following schedule:

Six-Week Session: classes must be dropped by Thursday, June 21, 2012.

Eight-Week Session: classes must be dropped by Thursday, June 28, 2012.

To receive a refund for a parking permit, you must return your permit to the Bursar's Office (C-36) within the drop deadline. Refund checks will be mailed before the end of the term.

If your address has changed, please update your information on *MyECC*.

Non-Resident Refund Policy

To receive a refund of non-resident tuition, drop your classes through the online system according to the following schedule:

Six-Week Session:

100% refund for classes dropped by Thursday, June 21, 2012.

50% refund for classes dropped by Thursday, June 28, 2012.

Eight-Week Session:

100% refund for classes dropped by Thursday, June 21, 2012.

50% refund for classes dropped by Thursday, June 28, 2012.

Refund checks will be mailed before the end of the semester, to the address you have on file in the online student system. If your address has changed, update your address immediately on *MyECC*.

California Residency

To attend El Camino College as a qualified California resident, you must have established legal residence in the state one year and one day prior to the start of the term. In addition, you must meet the two-year intent provisions of California residency code and must not have engaged in any actions that are contrary to establishing residency in the state of California. The burden of proof to clearly demonstrate both physical presence in California and intent to establish California residence lies with the student in accordance with Education Code Section 68040.

The residence of an unmarried student under the age of 19 is determined by the legal residence of the parents. A married minor determines residency from the date of marriage and must comply with all provisions of residency as cited above. A person may not derive residence from a spouse. Residence is determined at the time of application. The answers to questions on the online application for admissions determine your residency status.

A student who has been notified of nonresidency status and who believes to be qualified for California residency may petition for consideration of California residency, provided the student submits the documents required by law and meets the deadline to petition for California residency.

Students who do not petition in the term in which non-residency has been determined may forfeit all rights to petition after the term ends and will be liable for all non-residency fees.

Full procedures and forms for residency petitions may be obtained in the Admissions Office.

Priority Registration

Limitations

Enrollment in courses and programs may be limited to students meeting properly established prerequisites and co-requisites. Enrollment may also be limited due to the following:

- Health and safety considerations
- Facility limitations
- Faculty workload
- Availability of qualified instructors
- Funding limitations
- Constraint of regional planning
- Legal requirements imposed by statutes, regulations, or contracts

Registration Priorities

During registration periods, the following registration priority shall be followed:

- Legally mandated groups
- Continuing students
- New and returning students
- K-12 concurrently enrolled students

Within each of the above cohorts, subcohorts may be established by law or through policy and procedure of the District.

Legally Mandated Groups

- Any member or former member of the Armed Forces of the United States for any academic term within two years of leaving active duty
- EOPS students
- DSPS students
- Qualified Foster Youth

Continuing Students

Continuing students shall be assigned a priority registration time based on the following criteria:

- Student cohorts established by a federal or state grant that mandates priority registration shall receive priority registration if the granting of priority registration to the cohort does not contradict the provisions or intent of the laws and regulations governing registration priorities.
- Qualified students who are members of cohorts that meet the criteria for priority registration as established and approved by a Priority Registration Committee shall next receive priority in registration.
- Continuing students not receiving priority registration shall receive one registration point for each unit earned at El Camino College since 1983 for up to a maximum of 90 points.
- The more registration points, the earlier the registration assignment time.

- Ties in registration point shall be broken by random selection.
- Students who have earned more than 90 units cannot earn additional registration points. Instead, for each unit earned over 90 two registration points shall be deducted from the accrued registration point count. Therefore, if a student has earned 95 units, the registration point count shall be 80 (90 [2 x 5]).
- Students who have earned more than 90 units shall continue to have two registration points deducted for each unit earned beyond 90 units until the registration point count equals 15. The student shall not be penalized beyond 15 registration points.

New and Returning Students

New and returning students shall be assigned a registration appointment time based on the following criteria:

- New, in-District, high school graduates shall register before other new or returning students.
- New international students with F-1, M-1, or J-1 visas shall register next.
- Qualified new and returning students who are members of cohorts that meet the criteria for priority registration as established and approved by a Priority Registration Committee.
- Assignment of the registration appointment time for new and returning students
 not in the groups described above is on a
 first come, first serve basis. All other new
 and returning students shall have their
 registration appointment time based on
 the submission date of the application for
 admissions.

K-12 Concurrently Enrolled Students

Assignment of the registration appointment time for K-12 concurrently enrolled students is on a first come, first serve basis. Each K-12 concurrently enrolled student shall be assigned a registration appointment time based on the submission date of all required documents for admissions (application for admissions, K-12 concurrent enrollment form, and other documents required by law, regulation, and District policy). Failure of a K-12 student to apply and submit all required documents by the deadline specified by the college shall result in that K-12 student being denied admissions and subsequent registration for that term.

Registration Time Allowance

- All students may register on or after their scheduled registration appointment time, but not before.
- All students must register by the published deadlines and in accordance with the policies and procedures of the District. If a

student fails to meet these deadlines or to follow the District's policies and/or procedures, the student will not be allowed to register for the course. A student who attends and participates in a course without proper registration will neither receive credit nor a grade for that course and the backdating of registration will not be considered by the District unless the student can prove that he/she properly registered in a timely manner and it was a college error that caused the registration to fail.

A hold against a student (dean, fee, dismissal, etc), a failure by the student to apply for admissions, a failure by the student to meet prerequisites or co-requisites, an unapproved course overload, a K-12 form or process not properly executed, an admissions hold (residency, AB 540, missing data, etc) not resolved by the student in the manner and timeframe proscribed by the District shall not be considered to be college error. A student will not be allowed to enroll in a class if there is any time overlap with another class.

A student may not be allowed to enroll in a class if the enrollment violates any of the repeat rules as set forth in Title 5 or in the El Camino College policy and procedure on repeats. Attending and participating in a course without registration, does not constitute college error.

For the complete El Camino College Board Policy and Procedure for Priority Registration please see Board Policy 5055 and Administrative Procedure 5055.

Adds and Drops

It is the student's responsibility to process an official withdrawal from class. Failure to do so may result in a letter grade of A through F. A student who fails to properly register or add a class will NOT receive credit for that class. Adding after the deadline is prohibited.

If a student drops after the refund deadline, fees for the classes are forfeited. Any class subsequently added will require additional fees.

If a student drops a class after the refund deadline in order to add the same class at a different time/date/instructor, the student must request a lateral transfer or level transfer from both instructors. All transfers are processed through the Admissions Office.

Unit Limitations

The student's program of studies will vary according to individual need and objectives. There is no minimum but the maximum program for a semester is 18

units without a physical education class and 19 units with a physical education class. The maximum program of study for the sixweek summer session is eight units or nine units for the eight-week session if at least one unit is physical education. The maximum program of study for the Winter Term is seven units. The minimum full-time student program is 12 units per semester. A student wishing to take more than the maximum units may file a petition through the Counseling Services Division. Students must have completed at least 15 transferable units in one semester at El Camino College with a 2.75 grade point average and an overall grade point average of 2.5 or higher to be eligible for an overload.

In addition to scheduled class hours, students should include in their weekly schedule the time necessary to study and prepare for classes. Each student is expected to spend two hours per week in study and preparation for each class hour per week in lecture courses. Students who work in business or industry should reduce their total study programs in proportion to the demands of their employment and personal activities. If employment requires 40 hours or more per week, students would limit their study program to seven units or less each semester.

Photo Identification and ASB Stickers

All students are required to obtain a free El Camino College Compton Center identification card. These cards are available in the Student Life Office Monday, Tuesday and Thursday 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; Wednesday 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.; and Friday 8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

These cards serve as photo identification, and are required for library services, student activities, access to the Learning Resource Center and Open Computer Labs, and to verify attendance in classes for each semester or term.

All students are encouraged to purchase an optional ASB sticker for their photo identification cards during registration at the Bursar's Office. The ASB sticker offers a variety of discounts at businesses, theaters, ASB sponsored events, and athletics events. El Camino College Compton Center students can also utilize ASB stickers at El Camino College, including access to Student Activities Center table games, free admission to all campus athletic events and a discount on tickets at district-sponsored Center for the Arts events. Funds generated from the cards help support student activities. The \$10 sticker fee per semester is nonrefundable.

Children in Classrooms

Children are not permitted in classrooms while class is in session. Attendance in class is limited to officially enrolled students and authorized visitors or authorized guests only. In addition, students shall not allow children to be left unattended or unsupervised anywhere at El Camino College Compton Center. It is the responsibility of each faculty member to inform students of this requirement.

Student Records

Congress has provided in the "Family Education Rights and Privacy Act" (FERPA) that students have certain rights of access to their education records. A copy of the act is located in the Library. Please contact the Admissions Office for any information regarding your rights under the act.

High School Students

By law, El Camino College may restrict K-12 enrollment based on any of the following: age, grade, academic preparation, seat availability or registration priority. District policy restricts concurrent enrollment to students who have completed the 10th grade.

El Camino College will grant college credit for completed coursework. Students should consult their school counselor and/or school district policy on enrolling in college classes to earn high school credits or dual credit.

Students - When you enroll in classes at El Camino College, you are considered a college student and are expected to act accordingly. Please familiarize yourself with El Camino College policies, procedures, the college calendar, and your rights as a student. Both the class schedule and college catalog are available online and for purchase at the Bookstore.

K-12 students must submit an up-to-date application for admissions online, have a fully completed and signed concurrent enrollment form on file in admissions, and have turned in any supporting documentation to the Admissions Office prior to the start of a semester or the start of a session in summer. Failure to meet the admissions deadline will preclude the K-12 student from registering in any classes for that term. Late admissions and late registration will not be considered for K-12 students.

Parents - when your child enrolls in classes at El Camino College, you lose some rights afforded you by the K-12 system. As per FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act) any business you conduct on behalf

of your college student must be with the student's written consent. You, the parent, will need a note from your child to access private educational records or to act on his or her behalf

Applying to El Camino College does not guarantee a seat in a class. Registration priority is given to continuing students first, followed by new and returning students, and then K-12 students. K-12 students must go through the application process each semester or term that they are enrolled as a concurrently enrolled student.

Equivalent Courses

Courses completed at other colleges and universities may be used to meet a prerequisite. Some high school courses, as stated in the catalog, may also be used to meet a prerequisite.

Students who have completed equivalent courses at another college or in high school must have copies of necessary transcripts. Do not delay. Order transcripts and clear prerequisites prior to registration. Clearance for an equivalent course may be obtained in the Counseling Department or the Academic Affairs Office (C-32) located in the Administration Building.

Transcripts

Transcripts from Other Schools

If you plan to attend under veterans or Social Security benefits, receive academic advisement to become matriculated, or need to have coursework at other colleges reviewed for prerequisite clearance, you must request college transcripts from all schools you have attended be sent to the El Camino College Records Office.

If you plan to graduate from El Camino College with a degree or certificate and wish to have course work taken at other colleges considered for graduation, you must request official transcripts to be mailed from the other colleges to the El Camino College Compton Center. Hand-carried transcripts from the student or any other party will not be accepted.

El Camino College Compton Center Transcripts

Ordering transcripts is easy. Go online 24/7 to www.elcamino.edu/admissions/transcripts and follow the instructions.

Your first two El Camino College transcripts are free. Additional transcripts incur a fee as determined by college policy and payable at the time of the transcript request. Transcripts are processed on a first in, first out basis.

Cross Enrollment at CSU Dominguez Hills

El Camino College Compton Center students who are eligible may cross-enroll at CSU Dominguez Hills without formal admission and without payment of state university tuition, in a maximum of one baccalaureate-level course per semester on a space-available basis. Such enrollment would be at the discretion of the appropriate authorities at ECC Compton Center and CSU Dominguez Hills.

A student must meet the requirements of cross enrollment to be eligible.

Additional information on requirements and procedures may be obtained at the El Camino College Compton Center Admissions Office or Counseling Department, located in the Administration Building.

Academic Dishonesty

Academic Dishonesty violates Section I of El Camino College's Board Policy 5500 Academic Honesty & Standards of Conduct

El Camino College is dedicated to maintaining an optimal learning environment and insists upon academic honesty. To uphold the academic integrity of the institution, all members of the academic community, faculty, staff and students alike, must assume responsibility for providing an educational environment of the highest standards characterized by a spirit of academic honesty.

Examples of academic dishonesty include but are not limited to:

- Representing the words, ideas, or work of another as one's own in any academic exercise including the use of commercial term paper companies or online sources for essays, term papers, or research papers, whether free or paid.
- Copying from another student or former student or allowing another student to copy from one's work.
- Allowing another individual to assume one's identity or assuming the identity of another individual.
- Changing answers on a previously scored test, assignment, or experiment with the intent to defraud.
- Inventing data for the purpose of completing an assignment, a laboratory experiment, or case study analysis with the intent to defraud.
- Obtaining or copying exams or test questions when prohibited by the instructor.
- Giving or receiving information during an examination or test by any means such as sign language, hand signals or secret codes, or through the use of any electronic device.

- Using aids such as notes, calculators, or electronic devices unless specifically authorized by the instructor.
- Handing in the same paper or other assignment in more than one class when prohibited by the instructor.
- Any other action which is not an honest reflection of a student's own academic work
- Other forms of dishonesty, including, but not limited to, forgery or attempted forgery of any academic record; alteration or misuse of college documents, records or identification; or knowingly furnishing false information to the District.
- Unauthorized preparation, giving, selling, transfer, distribution, or publication, for any commercial purpose, of any contemporaneous recording of an academic presentation in a classroom or equivalent site of instruction, including but not limited to handwritten
 - or typewritten class notes, except as permitted by any District policy or administrative procedure.

Responsibility of El Camino College Students

It is the responsibility of each student to conduct him/herself in a manner which encourages learning and promotes honesty; and to act with fairness toward other students in the classroom. This incorporates the notion that students should not seek an unfair advantage over other students when completing an assignment, taking an examination or engaging in any other kind of academic activity.

Consequences for Academic Dishonesty

When there is evidence or knowledge of academic dishonesty occurring, any or all of the following actions may be imposed:

- 1. The instructor may assign a failing grade to the examination or assignment in which the alleged cheating or plagiarism occurred.
- 2. The instructor may dismiss the student from the class or activity for the present and/or following class session(s) as stipulated in AP 5520, section C.5: Removal by Instructor.
- 3. The instructor may recommend suspension or expulsion of the student from the college as stipulated in BP 5500, Section III.a and V.d. This recommendation must be in accordance with El Camino College's Due Process and Disciplinary Procedure.
- 4. An Academic Dishonesty Report Form is filled out by the instructor and copies are submitted to the division dean and Director of Student Development. The Director of Student Development will keep this form in the student file and take any additional dis-

ciplinary action if deemed appropriate. Should there be record of multiple incidents of academic dishonesty or other misconduct committed by a student, they may be suspended from all classes and campus for up to two years.

Transfer Center

Transfer services are offered Monday, Tuesday, Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Wednesday from 9:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., and Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., in Room D-29. The Transfer Center offers a wide range of activities designed to assist students in transferring successfully to the four-year college or university of their choice. Among the transfer services offered are advisement, regularly scheduled visits by admissions office representatives from four-year colleges and universities, and workshops on major steps in the transfer process. Other services offered include university fairs at El Camino College Compton Center and field trips to major universities. Choose and apply to universities online, explore majors, and much more.

Library

Parking, Traffic and Safety

The El Camino College Police Department is in charge of the personal safety and security of all who attend classes, as well as all who are employed by El Camino College and El Camino College Compton Center.

The Vehicle Code Laws of the State of California, the ordinances of Los Angeles County and the Traffic and Parking Regulations of the El Camino Community College District are in effect 24 hours per day, seven days per week and are enforced by the El Camino College Police Department pursuant to section 21113 (a) (c) (f) of the California Vehicle Code.

Anyone parking in district parking lots is required to display a valid El Camino College Compton Center or El Camino College parking permit in his/her vehicle. Semester parking permits are available for purchase from the Bursar's Office located in C-36.

Parking regulations are enforced seven days per week, 24 hours a day throughout the year, including weekends and holidays, unless otherwise specified. Vehicles parking in staff parking areas must display a valid El Camino College Compton Center or El Camino College staff parking permit. Students/visitors and the general public may park in staff parking areas on weekends and holidays with a valid El Camino College Compton Center student semester permit or daily parking permit. Parking availability is subject to change, and lots may be closed or restricted for special events.

Traffic and parking regulations are posted throughout El Camino College Compton Center. ECC Police will issue municipal court citations to violators of these regulations. Parking violations are a minimum of \$38.

The El Camino Community College District shall not be liable for the loss or damage caused to any vehicle parked in a district parking lot.

The basic speed limit is 15 mph in all posted areas. All provisions of the California Vehicle Code and the Traffic Rules of the El Camino Community College District are strictly enforced. Police officers may issue superior court citations to violators of these regulations.

If you have lost property at El Camino College Compton Center, please stop by the Police Department office Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Lost property not claimed within 90 days is disposed of in accordance with district policy.

You may reach the police department in an emergency situation by dialing 9-1-1 from any pay telephone at El Camino College Compton Center or by dialing 310-660-3100 from a cellular telephone.

First aid, as well as help in all emergency situations, is provided through the police department.

Disabled Persons Parking

Students/visitors with disabilities who have been issued a DMV Disabled Person (DP) placard may park in any designated disabled person stall. Disabled persons may park in faculty/staff/ student space and MUST DISPLAY the DMV disabled person placard/plates AND a valid El Camino College semester or daily parking permit when parked. Failure to display the DP placard and a valid El Camino College or El Camino College Compton Center permit (when parked in faculty/staff/student space) will result in the issuance of a citation. See California Code of Regulations - Title 5, Section 54100; Ed Code 67301(a). Temporary medical parking arrangements can be made at Campus Police Parking Services located in V-72.

Student Right to Know Information

The El Camino College Police Department provides professional law enforcement services to El Camino College and El Camino College Compton Center. The police department is located at the corner of Redondo Beach and Crenshaw boulevards in Parking Lot K and at El Camino College Compton Center in V-72. The police department also provides first aid service in emergency situations. You may reach the police department by calling 310-660-3100.

The police department is open 24 hours per day. In accordance with the Federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act, the ECC Police Department has posted security and safety information, and all required statistical data on the police department Web page: www.elcamino.edu/police/. This information is also available in printed form in the lobby of the police department and can be mailed upon request. The police department Web page also offers a wide variety of information about services and programs provided by the police department.


