STEP 1 | Admission

Who is eligible for Admission?

Anyone 18 years of age or older qualifies for admission to El Camino College. If under the age of 18, you will qualify if you have 1) graduated from high school or 2) passed the California High School Proficiency Examination.

El Camino College may admit as a special part-time or special full-time student anyone in grades 11 or 12 who, in the opinion of the college president, may benefit from instruction. Concurrently enrolled 11th and 12th grade students must comply with all policies, follow all procedures, and meet all requirements by the published deadlines for each semester and/or term.

California Residence Requirement Can I apply as a California resident?

To attend El Camino College as a resident of California, a student is required to have been a legal resident of the state, as defined in the California Education Code, for more than one year immediately preceding the residence determination date. The residence determination date is the day preceding the first day of the semester or term.

In addition, students must meet the two-year intent provisions of California residency code, and must not have engaged in any actions that are contrary to establishing residency in the state of California.

How Do I Apply?

Apply online by visiting www.elcamino.edu and clicking on **Apply Online** – it's that easy! New and returning students (those with an absence of a primary term: Fall or Spring Semester; excluding Summer and Winter Term) must complete an application. Don't forget to submit official transcripts from all accredited colleges and trade schools attended. Students applying for Advanced Placement credit must submit official high school transcripts.

Step 2 | Assessment

How Do I Make Arrangements For Testing?

Before testing, students must first have an El Camino College application on file. A photo I.D. (such as a driver's license) plus an El Camino College I.D. number (the number received at time of application) is required to test or obtain copies of past test results.

The placement tests for English, English as a Second Language (Part 1), and Math are computerized and given on a drop-in basis—no appointment is necessary. Other tests, such as the Chemistry Placement, Degrees of Reading Power (DRP) and English as a Second Language (Part 2) are given on an appointment basis only. Please contact the

All testing is done on campus at the Assessment/Testing Office, located in Room 217 of the Student Services Center. Testing must be completed before registering for courses. Re-testing is limited and may not be done after enrollment in any course related to the test. All students are encouraged to review each subject before taking placement tests. Please visit the Testing Web page at www.elcamino.edu/student-services/co/assessmenttesting.asp for current testing hours and information on tests, including websites for study.

STEP 3 | Orientation

Welcome to El Camino College! All students are encouraged to participate in orientation and to become familiar with the college and its resources.

Orientation is offered in different locations: online at www.elcamino.edu via *MyECC*, and in matriculation counseling groups for new students. Special orientation sessions are arranged for high school students through their high schools. Specialized orientations are also arranged for students who participate in the various SSTARS Programs (see student resources page after class schedule information for a list of programs). For more details visit the 'Counseling' Web page.

STEP 4 | Counseling/ Advisement

Counseling services are available to students through scheduled appointments, express, or online counseling. Appointments are scheduled online one week in advance through a *MyECC* account. Appointments are open for scheduling every Monday at noon. Appointments for special support programs are not available to schedule online. The Appointment Help Desk hours are: Mondays from 2:00 - 4:00 p.m., call 310-660-3458. A student who has selected a major field of study is strongly encouraged to see one of the counselors assigned to that major. Undeclared and undecided students may schedule an appointment with any counselor.

As part of the matriculation program, counseling services assist students in clarifying career and life goals and in developing an appropriate course of study based on goals, aptitudes and interests.

STEP 5 | Registration

How Do I Prepare to Register?

- Be sure prerequisites and corequisites are met.
- Meet with a counselor to ensure schedule is in line with educational goals.

Continuing Students

If you are on Level II probation status, a hold will be placed on your registration. Check your unofficial ECC transcripts through MyECC and schedule a Student Enhancement Program workshop at the Counseling Center in the Student Services Center.

Procedure

Registration appointment information for continuing students will be available beginning **May 6, 2013**. For new and returning students, this information will be available on or after **May 30, 2013**.

When Do I Register?

Please go online to www.elcamino.edu, click on *MyECC* - *Registration Appointment Time*.

Before you attempt to register, verify your registration date and time.

Students may not register prior to the assigned date and time.

How Do I Register?

Register online at www.elcamino.edu and click on *MyECC*. Login and follow the online instructions. Computers are available for student use in the Library Media Technology Center - Library East Wing Basement.

STEP 6 | Pay Fees

All fees must be paid by the fee payment deadlines or you will be dropped from **all** classes at both El Camino College and El Camino College Compton Center. Pay online! Just go to www.elcamino.edu and click on *MyECC*.

Attendance

If you enroll in a class and you do not attend the first scheduled meeting of the class, you may be dropped from the roster and your place may be given to a waiting student. During the course of the term, you may be dropped by your instructor for excessive absences.

All fees, including any optional fees, such as a Parking Permit or ASO Student Discount Sticker that may have been requested at the time of registration must be paid by the deadline!

For your convenience, we offer three ways to pay your fees:

Students on a waitlist for a class must check their El Camino College email daily to find out if they have been admitted to the class. Waitlisted students admitted to the class must pay those class fees by the same deadlines listed above, or they will be dropped from all classes at both El Camino College and ECC Compton Center.

Financial Assistance

All students are encouraged to apply for financial aid by visiting the Financial Aid Office Web page at www.elcamino.edu/student-services/fao. Various links on programs and services and other information links are easily accessible for reference.

California residents may wish to apply for a Board of Governor's Fee Waiver (BOGW) to pay for their enrollment fees. Students are encouraged to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine eligibility for all federal, state and institutional programs. Some students in certain programs such as CalWORKS, CARE, or EOPS may also complete the fee waiver application in addition to the FAFSA form. Please see enclosed applications on page 13.

The California Dream Act of 2011 became law through the passage of two Assembly bills, AB130 and AB131 that allow AB540 students to apply for privately funded scholarships, state and institutional grants beginning in the 2012-2013 Aid Year.

The California Dream Act Application is now available online at www.caldreamact.org for community college fee waivers payable starting Winter 2013. The Cal Dream Act application can also be used to apply for Dream Act Cal Grants to be used beginning in Fall 2013. Students may also use the enclosed BOGW applications on pages 13-16 or the FAFSA to apply for a fee waiver.

Requirements for the Board of Governor's Fee Waiver for AB540 Students

- Be classified as AB540 by Admissions and Records.
- Submit California Dream application or BOGFW application and required supporting documents.
- Have financial need as defined on page 12.

California Residency

To attend El Camino College as a qualified California resident, students must have established legal residence in the state one year and one day prior to the start of the term. In addition, students must meet the two-year intent provisions of California residency code and must not have engaged in any actions that are contrary to establishing residency in the state of California. The burden of proof to clearly demonstrate both physical presence in California and intent to establish California residence lies with the student in accordance with Education Code Section 68040.

The residence of an unmarried student under the age of 19 is determined by the legal residence of the parents. A married minor determines residency from the date of marriage and must comply with all provisions of residency as cited above. A person may not derive residence from a spouse. Residence is determined at the time of application. The answers to questions on the online application for admissions determine your residency status.

A student who has been notified of non-residency status and who believes to be qualified for California residency may petition for consideration of California residency, provided the student submits the documents required by law and meets the deadline to petition for California residency.

Students who do not petition in the term in which non-residency has been determined may forfeit all rights to petition after the term ends and will be liable for all non-residency fees.

Full procedures and forms for residency petitions may be obtained in the Admissions Office.

AB540 waives out-of-state fees for students not classified as California residents. AB540 students must meet the following requirements:

- Attended a California high school for three or more years.
 - Graduated from a California high school or attained the equivalent of a high school diploma in California.
 - Registered or currently enrolled at a public college/university in California.
- Students must fill out the AB540 affidavit in the Admissions and Records Office and provide required proof.

Priority Registration

Limitations

Enrollment in courses and programs may be limited to students meeting properly established prerequisites and co-requisites. Enrollment may also be limited due to the following:

- Health and safety considerations
- Facility limitations
- Faculty workload
- Availability of qualified instructors
- Funding limitations
- Constraint of regional planning
- Legal requirements imposed by statutes, regulations, or contracts

Registration Priorities

During registration periods, the following registration priority shall be followed:

- Legally mandated groups
- Continuing students
- New and returning students
- K-12 concurrently enrolled students

Within each of the above cohorts, sub-cohorts may be established by law or through policy and procedure of the District.

Legally Mandated Groups

- Any member or former member of the Armed Forces of the United States for any academic term and not subject to dishonorable discharge
- EOPS students
- DSPS students
- Qualified Foster Youth

Continuing Students

Continuing students shall be assigned a priority registration time based on the following criteria:

- Student cohorts established by a federal or state grant that mandates priority registration shall receive priority registration if the granting of priority registration to the cohort does not contradict the provisions or intent of the laws and regulations governing registration priorities.
- Qualified students who are members of cohorts that meet the criteria for priority registration as established and approved by a Priority Registration Committee shall next receive priority in registration.

- Continuing students not receiving priority registration shall receive one registration point for each unit earned at El Camino College since 1983 for up to a maximum of 90 points.
- The more registration points, the earlier the registration assignment time.
- Ties in registration points shall be broken by random selection.
- Students who have earned more than 90 units cannot earn additional registration points. Instead, for each unit earned over 90 two registration points shall be deducted from the accrued registration point count. Therefore, if a student has earned 95 units, the registration point count shall be 80 ($90 - [2 \times 5]$).
- Students who have earned more than 90 units shall continue to have two registration points deducted for each unit earned beyond 90 units until the registration point count equals 15. The student shall not be penalized beyond 15 registration points.

New and Returning Students

New and returning students shall be assigned a registration appointment time based on the following criteria:

- New, in-District, high school graduates shall register before other new or returning students.
- New international students with F-1, M-1, or J-1 visas shall register next.
- Qualified new and returning students who are members of cohorts that meet the criteria for priority registration as established and approved by a Priority Registration Committee.
- Assignment of the registration appointment time for new and returning students not in the groups described above is on a first come, first serve basis. All other new and returning students shall have their registration appointment time based on the submission date of the application for admissions.

K-12 Concurrently Enrolled Students

Assignment of the registration appointment time for K-12 concurrently enrolled students is on a first come, first serve basis. Each K-12 concurrently enrolled student shall be assigned a registration appointment time based on the submission date of all required documents for admissions (application for admissions, K-12 concurrent enrollment form, and other documents required by law, regulation, and District policy). Failure of a K-12 student to apply and submit all required documents by the deadline specified by the college shall result in that K-12 student being denied admissions and subsequent registration for that term.

Registration Time Allowance

- All students may register on or after their scheduled registration appointment time, but not before.
- All students must register by the published deadlines and in accordance with the policies and procedures of the District. If a student fails to meet these deadlines or to follow the District's policies and/or procedures, the student will not be allowed to register for the course. A student who attends and participates in a course without proper registration will neither receive credit nor a grade for that course and the backdating of registration will not be considered by the District unless the student can prove that he/she properly registered in a timely manner and it was a college error that caused the registration to fail.

A hold against a student (dean, fee, dismissal, etc), a failure by the student to apply for admissions, a failure by the student to meet prerequisites or co-requisites, an unapproved course overload, a K-12 form or process not properly executed, an admissions hold (residency, AB 540, missing data, etc) not resolved by the student in the manner and timeframe proscribed by the District shall not be considered to be college error. A student will not be allowed to enroll in a class if there is any time overlap with another class.

A student may not be allowed to enroll in a class if the enrollment violates any of the repeat rules as set forth in Title 5 or in the El Camino College policy and procedure on repeats. Attending and participating in a course without registration, does not constitute college error.

For the complete El Camino College Board Policy and Procedure for Priority Registration please see Board Policy 5055 and Administrative Procedure 5055.

Adds and Drops

It is the student's responsibility to process an official withdrawal from class. Failure to do so may result in a letter grade of A through F. A student may drop a class or classes within the refund period and add another class or classes using the fees already paid. A student who fails to properly register or add a class will NOT receive credit for that class. Students who petition to add a class after the add deadline will be denied.

If a student drops after the refund deadline, payment of fees for the classes is forfeited. Any added class will require additional fees.

A student may drop a class before the refund deadline and add a class with no additional fees. If a student drops a class after the refund deadline in order to add the same class at a different time/date/instructor, the student

must request a lateral transfer or level transfer from both instructors. All transfers are processed through the Admissions Office.

Unit Limitations

The student's program of studies will vary according to individual need and objectives. There is no minimum but the maximum program for a semester is 18 units without a physical education class and 19 units with a physical education class. The maximum program of study for the six-week summer session is eight units or nine units for the eight-week session if at least one unit is physical education. The maximum program of study for the Winter Session is seven units. The minimum full-time student program is 12 units per semester. A student wishing to take more than the maximum units may file a petition through the Counseling Services Division. Students must have completed at least 15 transferable units in one semester at El Camino College with a 2.75 grade point average and an overall grade point average of 2.5 or higher to be eligible for an overload.

In addition to scheduled class hours, students should include in their weekly schedule the time necessary to study and prepare for classes. Each student is expected to spend two hours per week in study and preparation for each class hour per week in lecture courses. Students who work in business or industry should reduce their total study programs in proportion to the demands of their employment and personal activities. If employment requires 40 hours or more per week, students would limit their study program to seven units or less each semester.

Children in Classrooms

Children are not permitted in classrooms while class is in session. Attendance in class is limited to officially enrolled students and authorized visitors or guests only. In addition, students shall not allow children to be left unattended or unsupervised anywhere on campus. It is the responsibility of each faculty member to inform students of this requirement.

Student Records

Congress has provided in the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) that students have certain rights of access to their education records. A copy of the Act is located in the Library. Please contact the Admissions Office for any information regarding your rights under the Act.

High School Students

By law, El Camino College may restrict K-12 enrollment based on any of the following: age, grade, academic preparation, seat availability or registration priority. District policy restricts concurrent enrollment to students who have completed the 10th grade.

El Camino College will grant college credit for completed coursework. Students should consult their school counselor and/or school district policy on enrolling in college classes to earn high school credits or dual credit.

Students - When you enroll in classes at El Camino College, you are considered a college student and are expected to act accordingly. Please familiarize yourself with El Camino College policies, procedures, the college calendar, and your rights as a student by reading the class schedule and purchasing a college catalog from the ECC Bookstore. It is also available online.

Eleventh and 12th grade students must submit an up-to-date application for admissions online, have a fully completed and signed concurrent enrollment form on file in admissions, and have turned in any supporting documentation to the Admissions Office prior to the start of a semester or the start of a session in summer. Failure to meet the admissions deadline will preclude the student from registering in any classes for that term. Late admissions and late registration will not be considered for concurrently enrolled high school students.

Parents - when your child enrolls in classes at El Camino College, you lose some rights afforded you by the K-12 system.

As per FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act) any business you conduct on behalf of your college student must be with the student's written consent. You, the parent, will need a note from your child to access private educational records or to act on his or her behalf.

Applying to El Camino College does not guarantee a seat in a class. Registration priority is given to continuing students first, followed by new and returning students, and then concurrently enrolled high school students. These students must go through the application process each semester or term that they are enrolled as a concurrently enrolled student.



Equivalent Courses

Courses completed at other colleges and universities may be used to meet a prerequisite. Some high school courses, as stated in the college catalog, may also be used to meet a prerequisite.

Students who have completed equivalent courses at another college or in high school must have copies of necessary transcripts. Do not delay. Order transcripts and clear prerequisites prior to registration. Clearance for an equivalent course may be obtained in Drop-In Counseling or the appropriate academic division office.

Transcripts

Students who plan to attend under veterans or Social Security benefits, receive academic advisement to become matriculated; or need to have coursework at other colleges reviewed for prerequisite clearance, must request college transcripts from all schools attended be sent to the El Camino College Records Office.

Students who plan to graduate from El Camino College with a degree or certificate and wish to have course work taken at other colleges considered for graduation must request official transcripts to be mailed from the other colleges to the El Camino College Records Office. Hand-carried transcripts from the student or any other party will not be accepted.

Ordering transcripts is easy. Go online 24/7 to www.elcamino.edu/admissions/transcripts and follow the instructions.

The first two El Camino College transcripts are free. Additional transcripts incur a fee as determined by college policy and are payable at the time of the transcript request. Transcripts are processed on a first in, first out basis.

Cross Enrollment at CSU Dominguez Hills

El Camino College students who are eligible may cross-enroll at CSU Dominguez Hills without formal admission and without payment of state university tuition, in a maximum of one baccalaureate-level course per semester on a space-available basis. Such enrollment would be at the discretion of the appropriate campus authorities on each of the campuses.

A student must meet the requirements of cross enrollment to be eligible. Additional information on requirements and procedures may be obtained at the El Camino College Admissions Office or Counseling Center.

Academic Dishonesty

Academic Dishonesty violates Section I of El Camino College's Board Policy 5500 Academic Honesty & Standards of Conduct

El Camino College is dedicated to maintaining an optimal learning environment and insists upon academic honesty. To uphold the academic integrity of the institution, all members of the academic community, faculty, staff and students alike, must assume responsibility for providing an educational environment of the highest standards characterized by a spirit of academic honesty.

Examples of academic dishonesty include but are not limited to:

- Representing the words, ideas, or work of another as one's own in any academic exercise including the use of commercial term paper companies or online sources for essays, term papers, or research papers, whether free or paid.
- Copying from another student or former student or allowing another student to copy from one's work.
- Allowing another individual to assume one's identity or assuming the identity of another individual.
- Changing answers on a previously scored test, assignment, or experiment with the intent to defraud.
- Inventing data for the purpose of completing an assignment, a laboratory experiment, or case study analysis with the intent to defraud.
- Obtaining or copying exams or test questions when prohibited by the instructor.
- Giving or receiving information during an examination or test by any means such as sign language, hand signals or secret codes, or through the use of any electronic device.
- Using aids such as notes, calculators, or electronic devices unless specifically authorized by the instructor.
- Handing in the same paper or other assignment in more than one class when prohibited by the instructor.
- Any other action which is not an honest reflection of a student's own academic work.
- Other forms of dishonesty, including, but not limited to, forgery or attempted forgery of any academic record; alteration or misuse of college documents, records or identification; or knowingly furnishing false information to the District.
- Unauthorized preparation, giving, selling, transfer, distribution, or publication, for any commercial purpose, of any contemporaneous recording of an academic presentation in a classroom or equivalent site of instruction, including but not limited to

handwritten or typewritten class notes, except as permitted by any District policy or administrative procedure.

Responsibility of El Camino College Students

It is the responsibility of each student to conduct him/herself in a manner which encourages learning and promotes honesty; and to act with fairness toward other students in the classroom. This incorporates the notion that students should not seek an unfair advantage over other students when completing an assignment, taking an examination or engaging in any other kind of academic activity.

Consequences for Academic Dishonesty

When there is evidence or knowledge of academic dishonesty occurring, any or all of the following actions may be imposed:

1. The instructor may assign a failing grade to the examination or assignment in which the alleged cheating or plagiarism occurred.
2. The instructor may dismiss the student from the class or activity for the present and/or following class session(s) as stipulated in AP 5520, section C.5: Removal by Instructor.
3. The instructor may recommend suspension or expulsion of the student from the college as stipulated in BP 5500, Section III.a and V.d. This recommendation must be in accordance with El Camino College's Due Process and Disciplinary Procedure.
4. An Academic Dishonesty Report Form is filled out by the instructor and copies are submitted to the division dean and Director of Student Development. The Director of Student Development will keep this form in the student file and take any additional disciplinary action if deemed appropriate. Should there be record of multiple incidents of academic dishonesty or other misconduct committed by a student, he or she may be suspended from all classes and campus for up to two years.



ASB Student Discounts

All students are encouraged to purchase an optional Auxiliary Services Board (ASB) sticker for their photo ID cards at the Cashier's Window, the Student Development Office, or the Marsee Auditorium Ticket Office.

The ASB sticker offers a variety of discounts including discount movie theater and amusement park tickets. Movie theater and amusement park discount tickets can be purchased (cash only) at the Marsee Auditorium Ticket Office during its regular operating hours. On-campus benefits include access to Activities Center events, free admission to all campus athletic events, and a discount on tickets at district-sponsored Center for the Arts events.

Funds from the sale of the stickers help support co-curricular activities such as student government, clubs, the *Union* newspaper, plays, athletic teams, and the debate team.

The \$10 sticker fee is non-refundable.

Refund Policy

Merchandise must be in new condition, in sealed package, clean and free of all markings and bearing all original tags. A 10% restocking fee may be assessed on all refunds.

Textbooks can be returned for a full refund within the first week of the Fall and Spring Semester. Textbooks purchased for Winter and Summer Session have three days from the start of classes to return for a full refund. Textbooks must be in the same condition as purchased and must be accompanied with a register receipt for a full refund. See the Bookstore Web page for further refund information.

Book Buyback

The Bookstore provides daily book buy-back. Students who buy and sell back used books realize the best value for their money. The best time to sell books is during finals. The Bookstore will pay up to 50% back on textbooks if:

- The book has been requested for an upcoming semester.
 - The Bookstore needs additional stock.
 - There is absolutely no moisture damage on the book.
 - The only markings on the book are from a highlighter.
 - No pages have been removed.
 - There are no new editions pending.
- Any student purchasing a used book

understands that the life of a used book is limited and that the Bookstore may determine that a book purchased at the beginning of the semester in used condition may not be in condition to be resold by the end of that semester.

Career and Transfer services are offered in the Counseling Services Center on the first floor of the Student Services Center. The office hours are:

The Career Center offers opportunities for extensive career planning and evaluation of interests, aptitudes, and skills. Value assessments/inventories are also available. In addition, career exploration and workshops are offered as they are related to vocational and pre-professional planning and job success.

Appointments for career exploration, assessments/inventories and counseling are available to current students and alumni. Career fairs, tours, workshops, and career orientations are scheduled throughout the year.

The Career Center has reference books, Internet career resources, career pamphlets, occupational files, and online career information, describing jobs and providing information on regional, state, and national job markets.

Career and job search booklets are also available in the Career Center. For more information, please call 310-660-3593, extension 6137.

The Transfer Center offers a wide range of activities designed to assist students in transferring successfully to the four-year college or university of their choice.

Among the transfer services offered are professional transfer counseling and advisement, regularly scheduled visits by recruiting and admissions officers from four-year colleges and universities, and workshops on major steps in the transfer process. Other services offered include university fairs at El Camino College and frequent field trips to an array of major universities.

A calendar of Transfer Center activities is published monthly and is widely distributed. A transfer guide is published each semester.

Child Development Center

The El Camino College Child Development Center is located across Redondo Beach Boulevard from campus with licensed and credentialed teachers and staff. The Child Development Center is accredited by the National Accreditation Commission for Early Care and Education Programs. The CDC offers two programs. Both are open to the public as well as to students, staff, faculty, and their families. The Child Development Center provides these services:

- A fee-based day program for children ages 2 years old (toilet trained), through 5 years old. Hours for these services are 6:45 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- State funded pre-school: A program for children ages 3-4 years by October 1. Enrollment and fees are based on family income. The program operates two sessions, Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. or 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. A child may only be enrolled in one of these sessions. Call the Center for eligibility information.

Application packets are available in the Child Development Center. For information, call 310-660-3720. A grant program is available for qualifying student parents.

Library

The Schaurman Library serves as the research center of the college with more than 120,000 books and hundreds of periodical and newspaper titles, in addition to providing access to many online databases. During the fall and spring semesters, the library is open from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday; from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Friday; and from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Saturday. Winter and summer session hours vary (please call the library, or check the Web page for these hours). The library is closed when classes are not in session.

Materials are grouped throughout the facilities for easy use in Reference and Reserve/Periodical Rooms as well as in the general collection book stacks. Open stacks are maintained to give students direct access to all books. The Reserve Room contains material required for some supplementary assignments and a collection of textbooks

including the Book Depot.

The Reference and Periodical Rooms provide materials for research. Computers are available to support library research via online databases and Web access. Online book catalogs are located throughout the library. The Library Media Technology Center is located in the East Wing basement and provides computers for word processing, scanning, and Web access.

A fine of 25 cents a day is charged for overdue circulating books, with a maximum of \$10 for hardcover books and \$5 for paperback books. A three-day grace period is allowed at the end of each semester. Lost books are charged at the rate of the cost of the book plus \$10 processing fee. The facility uses the Library of Congress classification system. The library lobby is frequently used as an adjunct art gallery, displaying works by area artists.

Learning Resources Center (LRC)

The Learning Resources Center is dedicated to helping students, faculty, and staff of El Camino College achieve their academic goals. The LRC offers programs to enhance teaching and learning and provides users with learning opportunities through the use of audio-visual materials, computer-assisted instruction, and tutorial services in the following areas:

The **LMTC Computer Commons** (library - East Wing, basement) is El Camino College's central computer facility that provides all students and disciplines with a general use drop-in computer lab. The Computer Commons uses fully networked Windows computers where students have access to a variety of resources including color and laser printing, scanning, adaptive access tools and Internet access on over 160 computers. Software includes word processing, database, spreadsheet, presentation, and graphics programs. Specialized applications support academic programs including nursing, English, ESL, and foreign languages.

The **Basic Skills Study Center** (library - North Wing, upper level) provides individualized computer-assisted instruction in basic reading and basic math. Students may register for Academic Strategies 1abcd (AS 1abcd) or participate in a non-credit drop-in study program. Entering students will be given a diagnostic placement test and a personal plan of study. Both Academic Strategies and drop-in students will be provided with access to various software tutorial applications.

The **LRC Tutorial Program** (library - West Wing, upper level) offers free drop-in tutoring for many subjects including, but not limited to, English, ESL, mathematics, chemistry, business, biology, music, and foreign

languages. Tutoring is provided by trained tutors. The current tutoring schedule is posted in the Learning Center and at: www.elcamino.edu/library/lrc/tutoring.

The **Learning Center** (library - West Wing, upper level) houses an extensive media materials collection that supplements instruction in many academic disciplines. The collection includes audio and video tapes, disarticulated skeletons, human anatomy models, maps, text materials, art, and much more. Equipment is also available for viewing videos and DVDs.

Reciprocal Services

For your convenience reciprocal services are available to students enrolled at either El Camino College and El Camino College Compton Center. Students in good standing at either location have access to services at both El Camino College and ECC Compton Center, including the bookstore, library and computer labs. Additionally, one parking permit is valid at both ECC and ECC Compton Center.

Special Resource Center

The mission of the Special Resource Center (SRC) is to facilitate academic success for verified students with disabilities by providing equal access to educational opportunities in an integrated campus setting. The SRC provides support services, adaptive equipment, computer technology, and specialized instruction designed to meet the educational needs of students with disabilities.

In order to be eligible for support services or accommodations, a student must provide documentation of his/her disability or be assessed by SRC professional staff. Eligibility is determined by specially trained, highly skilled professional staff. Specific educational needs are identified on an individual basis and a plan is developed with each student. Examples of services or accommodations include but are not limited to: American Sign Language interpreters, testing accommodations, access technologies, or printed materials made available in alternate formats.

Parking, Traffic and Safety

The El Camino College Police Department is in charge of the personal safety and security of all who attend classes, as well as all who are employed by El Camino College.

The Vehicle Code Laws of the State of California, the ordinances of Los Angeles County and the Traffic and Parking Regulations of the El Camino Community College District are in effect 24 hours per day, seven days per week and are enforced by the El Camino College Police Department pursuant to section 21113 (a) (c) (f) of the California Vehicle Code.

Anyone parking in district parking lots is required to display a valid El Camino College or ECC Compton Center parking permit in his/her vehicle. Semester parking permits are available for purchase from the Cashier's Office located in the Administration Building. Daily parking permits are available from parking permit machines located in the parking lots.

Parking regulations are enforced seven days per week, 24 hours a day throughout the year, including weekends and holidays, unless otherwise specified. Vehicles parking in staff parking areas must display a valid El Camino College or El Camino College Compton Center staff parking permit. Students/visitors and the general public may park in staff parking areas on weekends and holidays with a valid El Camino College student semester permit or daily parking permit. Parking availability is subject to change, and lots may be closed or restricted for special events.

Red and white marked stalls are made available to El Camino Community College District directors, deans and other management personnel for a fee through the Business Manager's Office. Although located in general staff lots, they are for the exclusive use of

the individual paying the fee. All others occupying these stalls are subject to a citation.

Traffic and parking regulations are posted throughout campus. Campus Police will issue citations to violators of these regulations. Parking violations are a minimum of \$38.

The El Camino Community College District shall not be liable for the loss or damage caused to any vehicle parked in a district parking lot.

The basic campus speed limit is 15 mph in all posted areas. All provisions of the California Vehicle Code and the Traffic Rules of the El Camino Community College District are strictly enforced. Police officers may issue superior court citations to violators of these regulations.

If you have lost property on campus, please stop by the Police Department Parking Services office Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Lost property not claimed within 90 days is disposed of in accordance with district policy.

The El Camino College Police Department operates a campus courtesy shuttle between the campus buildings and parking lots, Monday through Friday evenings from 5:30 to 10:30 p.m. You may obtain this service by calling the police department or by using one of the "POLICE" phones located throughout campus. The "POLICE" telephones can also be used for reporting emergencies and suspicious activity. You may reach the police department in an emergency situation by dialing 9-1-1 from any pay telephone on campus or by dialing 310-660-3100 from a cellular telephone.

First aid, as well as help in all emergency situations, is provided through the police department.

The use of skateboards, razors, scooters, roller skates and bicycles is not permitted on campus. It is a violation of California Vehicle Code section 21113(F) to operate those items on campus. Also see, El Camino College Board Policy 5500(II.e.).



Disabled Persons Parking

Students/visitors with disabilities who have been issued a DMV Disabled Person (DP) placard may park in any designated disabled person stall. Disabled persons may park in faculty/staff/student space and MUST DISPLAY the DMV disabled person placard/plates AND a valid El Camino College semester or daily parking permit when parked. Failure to display the DP placard and a valid El Camino College or ECC Compton Center permit (when parked in faculty/staff/student space) will result in the issuance of a citation. See California Code of Regulations – Title 5, Section 54100; Ed Code 67301(a). Temporary medical parking arrangements can be made at Campus Police/Parking Services.

Student Right to Know Information

The El Camino College Police Department provides professional law enforcement services to the El Camino College community. The police department is located at the corner of Redondo Beach and Crenshaw boulevards in Parking Lot K. The police department provides emergency first aid service in emergency situations. You may reach the police department by calling 310-660-3100.

The police department is open 24 hours per day. In accordance with the Federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act, campus police has posted campus security and safety information, and all required statistical data on the police department Web page: www.elcamino.edu/police/. This information is also available in printed form in the lobby of the police department and can be mailed upon request. The police department Web page also offers a wide variety of information about services and programs provided by the police department.

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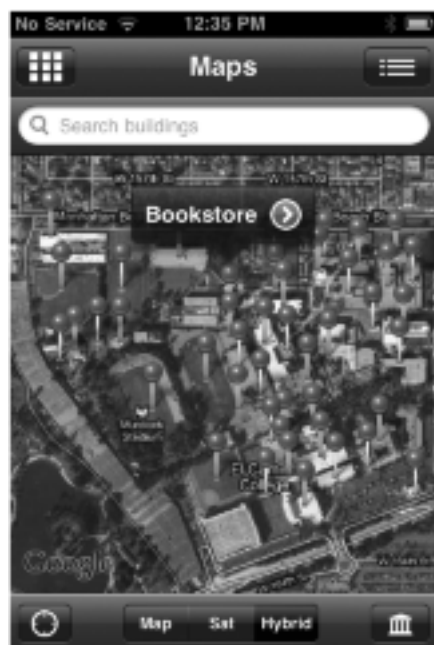
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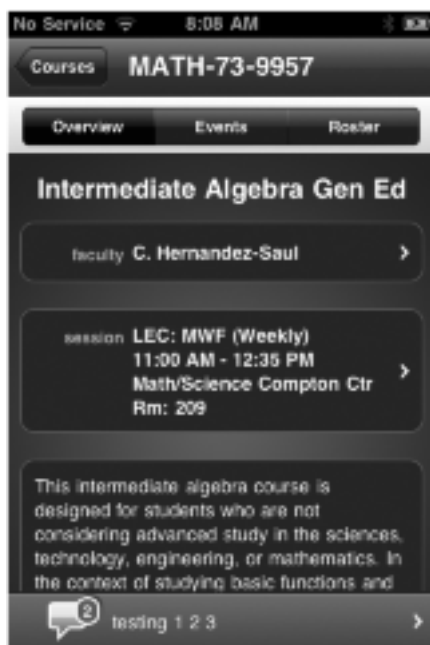
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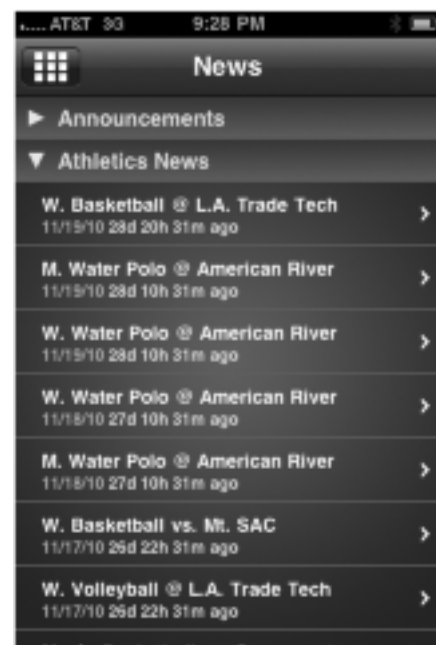
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Sexual Harassment Policy

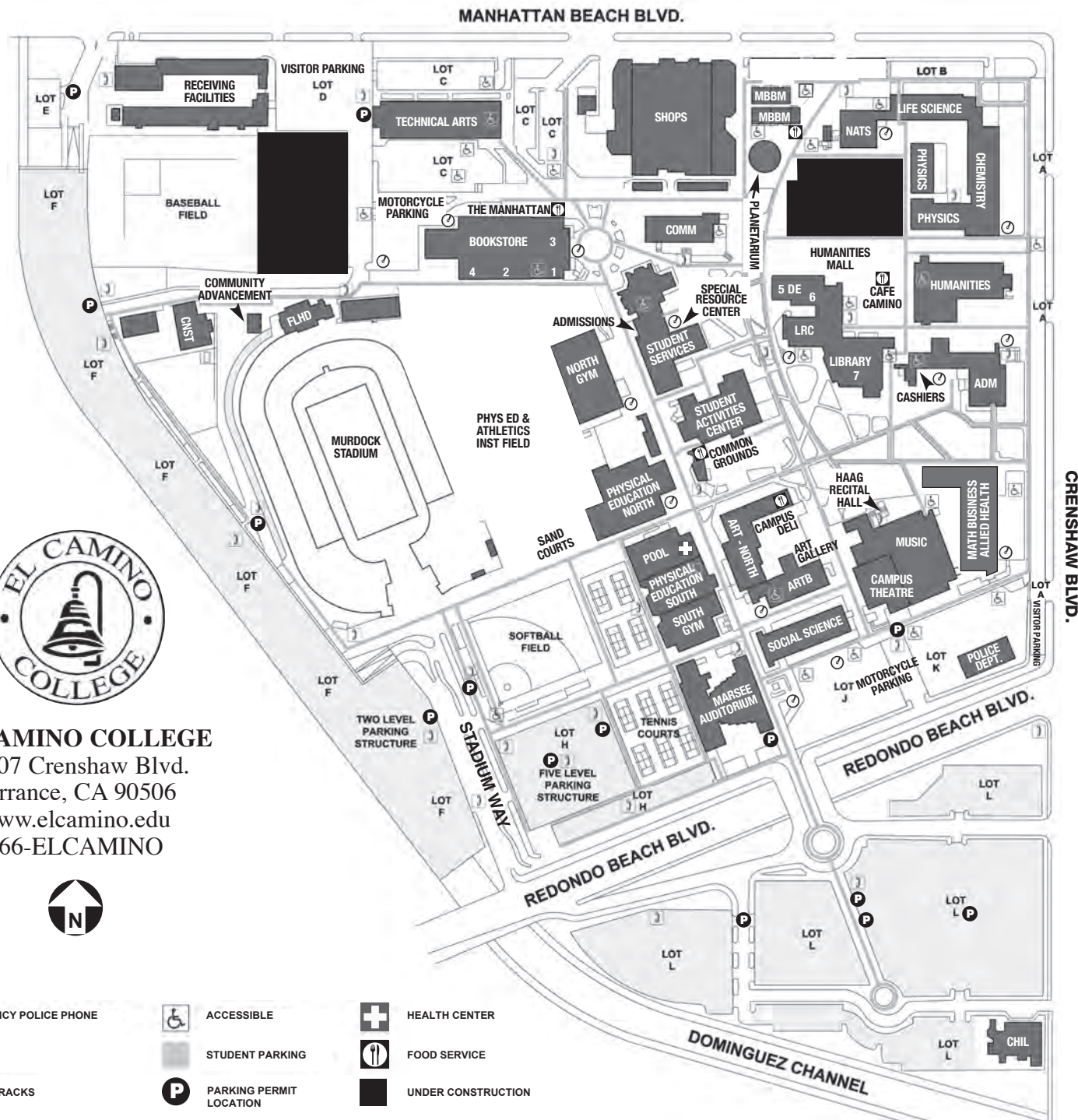
