

General Information

Anyone 18 years or older qualifies for admission to El Camino College. If under the age of 18, you will qualify if you have satisfied one of these:

- 1. Graduated from high school or
- 2. Passed the California High School Certificate of Proficiency Test

High school students MUST obtain enrollment approval forms from high school prior to submitting applications for admission to the college. A separate approval form MUST be submitted to the Admissions Office for each semester.

When to Apply

New and former students may apply for Summer 2008, beginning November 1, 2007. Applications should be submitted to the Admissions Office as soon as possible because many programs are filled on a first-come basis while registration appointments are available.

Registration appointment times for continuing students are determined by the college's priority registration procedure.

Note: Once submitted, the application for admission becomes the property of El Camino College and cannot be returned.

Where to Apply

Apply online at www.elcamino.edu. Avoid standing in line and apply online. It is easy, quick, and convenient! The online application is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week!

If you wish to apply in person, the Admissions Office is located in the Student Services Center. For the Admissions Office business hours please check the El Camino College Web site.

Attendance

If you enroll in a class and you do not attend the first scheduled meeting of the class, you may be dropped from the roster and your place may be given to a student waiting to enroll. Ultimately, it is the responsibility of the student to drop from a class. Failure to properly drop may result in a "W" or an "F."

New Procedure

Registration appointment information for continuing students will be available beginning May 1, 2008. For new and returning students, this information will be available on or after May 19. Please go online to www.elcamino.edu, click on MyECC – Registration Appointment Time. You may also check by telephone by calling (310) 516-9339.

Before you go online or register by telephone, you must confirm your registration date and time online at www.elcamino.edu, click on MyECC – Registration Appointment Time. You may also check by telephone by calling (310) 516-9339.

Withdrawal from Class

It is the STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to process an official withdrawal from class with the Admissions Office or the Cashier's Office. Failure to complete this process may result in a letter grade of A through F recorded on the student's permanent record.

Any student who receives a Temporary Tuition Fee Waiver from the Financial Aid Office must provide the necessary documentation to make the tuition waiver permanent. Students who do not provide the necessary documentation prior to withdrawing or dropping classes will be responsible for paying enrollment fees.

About Transcripts

If you plan to graduate, attend under veterans or Social Security benefits, or receive academic advisement to become matriculated, please request that high school and college transcripts from all schools you have attended be sent to El Camino College.

Your first two El Camino College transcripts are free. Additional transcripts are \$2 each, payable when requested. Transcripts are processed on a first-come basis. There is a \$5 charge for transcripts prepared on an emergency or hand-carry basis.

California Residency

In order to attend El Camino College as a qualified California resident, you must have established legal residency in the state on or before June 15, 2007. In addition, you must meet the two-year intent provisions of California residency code,

Summer Registration

All students will be able to register for Summer 2008 classes via El Camino College's online services or telephone registration service.

Continuing Students

All continuing students will have the opportunity to register for summer classes by appointment starting Monday, May 12. The hours of online/telephone registration for this period are Monday through Saturday 7:45 a.m. to 8:30 p.m.

New & Returning Students

All new and returning students to El Camino College shall register by appointment beginning Monday, June 2. The hours of online/telephone registration for this period are Monday through Saturday 7:45 a.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Concurrent Enrollment

All students currently enrolled in high schools will have the opportunity to register in summer classes by appointment beginning Thursday, June 5 through Thursday, June 19. Your appointment date is determined by when you apply. So, apply now! The hours of online/telephone registration for high school students for this period are Monday through Thursday 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Note: ALL REQUIRED PAPERWORK MUST BE TURNED INTO ADMISSIONS COMPLETE WITH ALL AUTHORIZED SIGNATURES BEFORE YOU MAY REGISTER. and must not have engaged in any actions that are contrary to establishing residency in the state of California. The burden of proof to clearly demonstrate both physical presence in California and intent to establish California residency lies with the student in accordance with Education Code Section 68040.

The residency of an unmarried student under the age of 19 is determined by the legal residency of the parents. A married minor determines residency from the date of marriage and must comply with all provisions of residency as cited above. A person may not derive residency from a spouse.

Student Records

Congress has provided in the "Family Education Rights and Privacy Act" that students have certain rights of access to their education records. A copy of the act is located in the library.

Fees

All fees are due at the time of registration. You are liable for all fees for the classes for which you registered, unless <u>you</u> drop the class by the deadline date.

Students with financial problems are encouraged to apply as early as possible to the Financial Aid Office.

The general fee requirement shall not apply to students enrolled in the non-credit courses specified in Education Code Section 84757.

A student who is on the Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) program, the Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Program (SSI/SSP) or the General Assistance Program should apply in the Financial Aid Office for the Enrollment Fee Financial Assistance Program.

Fee Refunds and Deadlines

To receive an enrollment fee refund, drop your class(es) through the online system by the enrollment fee refund deadline. You may access the system via the Web, registration phone line, at a kiosk on campus, at a cashier window, or in the Admissions area.

You are liable for all fees unless you drop the class by the refund deadline date. Fees are due within 7 days of phone or Web registration. Cashier's Hours: 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Closed Fridays June 20 - August 8, 2008.

To receive a parking fee refund, you must return your parking pass to the Cashier's Office by the refund deadline. All refund checks will be mailed to your address listed in our computer system by September 30, 2008. If your address has changed, please update the change in the Admissions Office promptly.

Non Resident (Out of Country/Out of State) Refunds

To receive a refund of non-resident tuition, drop your class(es) through the online system by the non-resident tuition deadline. You may access the system via the Web, registration phone line, at a kiosk on campus, at a cashier window, or in the Admissions area.

Deadline for non-resident tuition: Classes starting June 16: 100% refund if dropped by June 19, 2008. 50% refund if dropped by June 26, 2008. Classes starting June 23: 100% refund if dropped by June 26, 2008. 50% refund if dropped by July 2, 2008. There will be no refunds for classes dropped after the 2nd week of the session. Refund checks will be mailed to your address listed in our computer system by September 30, 2008. If your address has changed, please update the change in the Admissions Office promptly.

Parking Fee

Students/visitors wishing to park on campus pay a \$20 fee for the entire session in accordance with Education Code Section 76360. Students who receive BOGG will pay \$20.

Students/visitors with disabilities who have been issued a DMV Person (DP) placard may park in any student space or faculty/staff space and MUST DISPLAY the DMV disabled person placard/plates AND a valid El Camino College semester or daily parking permit when parked on campus. Failure to display both the disabled placard/plates and the El Camino College semester or daily permit will result in the

issuance of a citation. Students parking in a marked disabled stall need to display their DMV placard only. Temporary medical parking arrangements can be made at the Special Resource Center.

Red and white marked stalls are made available to El Camino Community College District directors, deans and other management personnel for a fee through the Business Manager's Office. Although located in general staff lots, they are for the exclusive use of the individual paying the fee. All others occupying these stalls are subject to citation.

Fee Payment Methods

The college accepts personal checks drawn on U.S. banks, money orders, cash, traveler's checks and the following credit cards: Visa, MasterCard and Discover. Checks returned by the bank for any reason will result in (1) suspension from enrollment (2) denial of subsequent registration and (3) detention of transcripts until the financial obligation has been satisfied. A service change of \$20 will be charged on any returned check.

Adds and Drops

It is the student's responsibility to process an official withdrawal from class. Failure to do so may result in a letter grade of A through F. A student may drop a class or classes within the refund period and add another class or classes using the fees already paid.

If a student drops after the refund deadline, payment of fees for the classes is forfeited. Any added class will require additional fees.

A student may drop a class before the refund deadline and add the same class at a different time/date/instructor with no additional fees. If a student drops a class after the refund deadline in order to add the same class at a different time/date/instructor, the student must request a lateral transfer or level transfer from both instructors. All transfers are processed through the Admissions Office.

MATRICULATION 5

Matriculation

There are four important steps in the matriculation process:

- 1. file the admission application
- 2. participate in assessment
- 3. participate in orientation activities
- 4. make a counseling appointment to develop an educational plan.

We strongly recommend that first-year college students attend The New Student Welcome Day which is an open house activity sponsored by Counseling and Student Services to highlight the programs of study, support programs and services of El Camino College.

By following these steps, you will learn about clearing prerequisites, student rights and responsibilities, procedures on filing petitions, academic standards, student grievance procedures and other important areas of student life. Matriculation information is available in the college catalog, counseling and academic division offices and other locations on campus.

Assessment/Testing Procedures

Personal identification with a photograph and your El Camino College Identification Number is required to take tests and receive results.

For more testing information call 1-310-660-3405. You must have an application on file at the college prior to any testing. Testing should be completed as soon as possible after you file your admission application. The El Camino College I.D. number is generated upon submitting the application. Read the catalog description of classes which interest you to learn if there is any testing recommended or needed. Keep in mind that all placement tests are part of the multiple measures of the assessment process. Be sure to take testing results with you when you go for your academic advisement or educational planning

English Placement Test - Complete your English Placement Test at least one day before you attempt to enroll in any English course, which has a course level as a prerequisite, corequisite or recommended preparation. You may not repeat the English Placement Test once you have enrolled into both English course sequences. If you require further review of your placement recommendation, obtain the appropriate petition form in the Assessment/Testing Office.

English as a Second Language Placement Test - Complete both parts of your English as a Second Language (ESL) Placement Test at least one day before you attempt to enroll into any ESL course, which has a course level as a prerequisite, corequisite or recommended preparation. The first part of the ESL test is on a dropin basis, the second part by appointment only. Begin your ESL assessment at least one week prior to your registration date. If you require further review of your placement recommendation, you should see the ESL Coordinator in the Assessment/Testing Office

Mathematics Placement Test - The Mathematics Placement Test is required of any student who wishes to enroll in any mathematics class. High school math courses may not be used, per se, for placement into El Camino College math courses. However, they may be used in combination with testing for placement assessment, which must be completed before your registration date. Assessment and placement results will be valid for two years. Once you begin the mathematics course sequence, you cannot repeat the placement test and must take all courses in sequence. If you require further review of your placement recommendation, obtain the appropriate petition form in the Assessment/ Testing Office.

Specialized Tests

Chemistry Placement Test - The Chemistry Placement Test is required of any student who wishes to enroll in Chemistry 1A unless the student has completed Chemistry 4 at El Camino College with a grade of C or better. Previous chemistry course work, whether taken in high school or another college, does not in itself qualify a student for Chemistry 1A. Students who have never taken a chemistry course or who want a beginning class may enroll in Chemistry 4, 20, or 21A depending upon their major and completion of mathematics prerequisites. The Chemistry Placement Test may be taken only once and may not be taken if a student has enrolled in Chemistry 4 at any time. If you require further review of your placement recommendation, obtain the appropriate petition form in the Assessment/Testing Office.

Mathematics Competency Test - If passed, this may be used to satisfy the El Camino College mathematics competency graduation requirement (item # 6 of Section A of the AA/AS graduation requirements.) If you do not successfully complete Mathematics 40 or 41B or any other course listed under the Mathematics Competency requirement for the A.S. Degree in the College Catalog, you must psss this test for admission into the Registered Nurse Program. Contact the Assessment/Testing Office for an appointment.

The Mathematics Competency Test is a basic algebra exam, which may be repeated a maximum of three times through a petitioning process. The appropriate petition form may be obtained through the Assessment/ Testing Office.

Waiver Exams for the Associate Degree. A waiver exam is available for Contemporary Health only. Contact the Assessment/Testing Office for further information and an appointment.

Cashier's Office

The Cashier's Office is located on the first floor of the Administration Building. Office hours during summer session are 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Closed Fridays (June 20-August 8).

Child Development Center

The El Camino College Child Development Center is located on the corner of 166th St. and Crenshaw Blvd., in a fully equipped facility with licensed and credentialed teachers and staff.

The Center operates year-round, offering quality child care to children ages 2 (toilet trained) to 5 years old. The Center offers both full and part-time child care with reasonable rates. Students of El Camino College receive priority for enrollment. There is a \$40 registration fee for full time students. The program offers a nutritious breakfast and snack and a developmentally appropriate curriculum.

The Center is open daily from 6:45 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. For info, call (310) 660-3720 between 7:45 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

Counseling Services

Counseling services are available to students through scheduled appointments or express counseling. Appointments must be made one week in advance through the Counseling Appointment Center. Appointments can be made Monday through Thursday in person or by calling (310) 660-3458. A student who has selected a major field of study is strongly encouraged to see one of the counselors assigned to that field while undeclared and undecided students may see any counselor.

As part of the matriculation program, counseling services assist students in clarifying career and life goals and in developing an appropriate course of study based on goals, aptitudes and interests.

Express academic counseling is usually available from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday and Friday 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. for students who have questions not requiring transcript review. The express counseling schedule is based on counseling faculty availability and is subject to change. Call (310) 660-3458 for express counseling schedule.

EOPS

Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) provides eligible students with support services in the areas of counseling, peer support, financial assistance, transferring and tutorial services. EOPS is located in rooms 202 and 203 on the second floor of the Student Services Center. Office hours are 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

Academic counselors provide matriculation, personal and academic guidance services for all eligible students. Students who are trained as peer advisers work with students on academic, financial or personal matters. Peer advising is provided on a drop-in basis.

The EOPS staff assists students in applying for the many financial aid resources available, such as EOPS book service, scholarships and fee waivers.

The Transfer Guidance component of EOPS assists students in transferring to a four-year college or university to continue their education once their goals have been met at El Camino College. Application fee waivers are available to EOPS eligible students who participate in the program.

The EOPS office provides supervised study, which is a tutorial service designed to assist students toward successful completion of their academic course work.

Financial Aid

Students who want to apply for a tuition fee waiver must obtain and complete a Board of Governor's Waiver (BOGW) application and information sheet from the forms bin located outside the Financial Aid Office, or apply online at cccapply.org. Please be advised that the Financial Aid Office does collect supporting documentation for verification purposes. Students should review the information sheet to determine the appropriate documentation that must be submitted with the BOGW application.

Students who have filed a 2007-2008 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) AND have received a waiver for either the fall or spring semesters do NOT have to complete a new fee waiver application until the following fall semester.

The Financial Aid Office also offers the Federal Pell Grant and Stafford Loans during the summer sessions. Students who

wish to apply should have submitted a FAFSA to the federal processor and completed their financial aid files by June 30, 2008 or the last day of attendance, whichever comes first.

Career Placement Services

Career Placement Services (CPS) is located in Student Services Center, Room 204. CPS provides current students and alumni (who have completed a minimum of 15 units at El Camino College), opportunities to find part-time and full-time jobs, as well as seasonal, summer, and temporary employment. A comprehensive job board and computer lab allows students to search for jobs including online services.

The CPS staff also develops internship opportunities for students in every academic area. Internships provide students the opportunity to explore a number of career fields. Most internships are non-paid, short-term experiences which allow the students to "try on a profession." Many require only a few hours a week. Some require academic credit - see CPS staff for more information about academic credit for internships.

CPS also assists students in writing resumes and cover letters as well as preparing for interviews. Resume workshops are regularly scheduled and mock interview appointments can be made with the adviser.

Several job and internship fairs are held each semester. Individual employees also come to campus to recruit on a regular basis. Check the campus calendar (select Career Placement Services) http://www.elcamino.edu/uportal/calendar/select_cal.aspx for updates.

Library Hours

The Library offers full summer services and is open from 7:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

Learning Resources Center

The Learning Resources Center (LRC) is located on the upper floor of the west wing of Schauerman Library and is open all hours the library is open. In the LRC, students have access to a wide collection of individualized study materials in audio, video, computer assisted instruction and multimedia formats.

These materials support instruction offered through every division of the college including foreign languages and instructional television.

Children in Classrooms

Children are not permitted in classrooms while class is in session. Attendance in class is limited to officially enrolled students and authorized visitors or guests only. In addition, students shall not allow children to be left unattended or unsupervised anywhere on campus. It is the responsibility of each faculty member to inform students of this requirement.

The LRC Tutorial Program offers tutoring in many different subjects. See current schedule posted in LRC or on the LRC Web site www.elcamino.edu/library/lrc/.

In the Basic Skills Study Center (in LRC), students may work on their basic math and reading skills with the help of individualized computer assisted instruction. Check with LRC staff for more information.

CAI Lab (Humanities 114) offers students access to individualized computer assisted instruction in foreign language and other subjects on IBM-compatible computers. In addition, the CAI Lab serves as a word processing center for all ECC students.

TOP Lab (Technical Arts 205) provides service to students registered in vocational programs at El Camino College. These services include computer assisted instruction, math tutoring and access to word processing, graphics and CADD applications software.

Library Media Technology Center (lower level library, east wing) is a general purpose computer lab open to all ECC students

Student ID cards are required to use all LRC services and centers.

Special Resource Center

Located in the east wing of the first floor of the Student Services Center, the Special Resource Center offers a wide range of equipment, supportive services and classes for students with disabilities.

El Camino College recognizes its responsibility to provide an equal opportunity for education for all students. The college's courses, programs, and facilities are designed to accommodate the needs of students with disabilities. No one may be excluded from any course, program or activity.

Eligibility is determined by a specially trained, highly skilled professional and paraprofessional staff. Each student is assessed on an individual basis. Specific educational needs are identified and a plan is developed with the student.

Courses are designed to address the specific and unique needs of students with disabilities. The courses listed under "Educational Development" and "Adapted Physical Education" in this Schedule of Classes are also described in the College Catalog.

Interpreters for the deaf, readers for the blind, mobility aides for the physically impaired and instructional aides for the learning disabled may be obtained through the program for those who are eligible.

Student Health Services

Student Health Services will be closed during the summer and winter. Campus Police may be contacted in case of emergency requiring first aid.

Transfer Center

The Transfer Center, located in the Counseling Services Center, offers a wide range of activities designed to assist students in successfully transferring to the four-year college or university of their choice. Some of the activities and services offered are:

- University campus tours to UC's, CSU's, and Independents
- University fairs
- A library of college catalogs and reference materials
- Transfer strategies, application, and specific major workshops
- Transfer admission guarantee programs
- Transfer advising and counseling

Distance Education courses are ideal for those who are looking for a convenient way to take courses. We offer both online courses (via computer) and telecourses (via video) in a wide variety of subjects. The courses are fully accredited and offer the same high quality of instruction as traditional classes. The course content, course credit, and cost per unit is the same as equivalent courses offered on campus. Anyone who is eligible to take courses on campus may enroll in Distance Education courses.

The courses offered this semester are listed under "Distance Education" in this Schedule (pages 14 to 18). Many of the courses have a mandatory first class meeting. If you do not attend the first meeting, you may be dropped from the course. Refer to the "Distance Education" section in this schedule for the time and location of the first meeting. This information can also be found on the Distance Education Web site.

Some online courses do not have a first class meeting. You must follow the instructions under the course listing or you may be dropped from the course.

The Student Handbook for Online Courses and the Student Handbook for Telecourses provide additional information about the courses. All students should obtain the Handbook(s) prior to the start of the semester. Both are available on the Distance Education web site and at our office. Please contact us if you'd like to have it mailed to you.

FAQs about Distance Education Courses

The first class meeting conflicts with another course I want to take. What should I do?

Do not enroll in both courses - choose only one!

Will I be required to attend class meetings on campus throughout the semester?


It depends on which course you are enrolled in. Refer to the Student Handbook for the total number of meetings you will be expected to attend.

If meetings are scheduled throughout the semester, when will they be held?

They usually take place on the same day and at the same time as the first class meeting. You may contact the instructor for specific meeting dates. You will find a faculty directory on our Web site and in our office.

How does an online course work?

Students in online courses communicate with their instructor and classmates electronically via a course Web site. The instructor posts such things as lectures, assignments, announcements, and other information to the site. The class may respond with questions, comments, etc.



Students must have at minimum:

- A Computer either a PC with Windows and a Pentium processor or a Macintosh with at least System 9.0
- Regular access to the Internet
- A recent version of a Web browser such as Netscape Navigator or Microsoft Internet Explorer
- An Internet service provider
- An e-mail address
- Current word processing software (as required by instructor)

Some courses may have additional requirements. The instructor will provide more information.

Computer literacy is required and experience with computer communication is recommended. The procedures for working online will be explained by the instructor

What is a telecourse?

Telecourses are pre-produced video courses. They are shown locally on the ECC television station, which is carried on the Time Warner Communications cable system (Channel 8). Students who are unable to view the telecourses where they reside may check out video copies of the programs free of charge from the Schauerman Library or they may view them in the Library's Learning Resources Center. Copies may also be obtained for a fee through RMI Media Productions, Inc., a telecourse rental service. Consult the Student Handbook for telecourses for the broadcast schedule.

Is a Distance Education course right for me?

In order to succeed in a Distance Education course, you must be self-motivated and be able to manage your time effectively. You also need strong reading and study skills. Distance Education courses are every bit as challenging as traditional courses.

How Do I Enroll?

The registration process is the same for Distance Education courses as it is for oncampus classes. If you wish to enroll in Distance Education courses <u>and</u> on-campus courses, register for all of your courses at the same time.


