The Schedule of Classes is published four times per year by the Office of Public Relations and Marketing.

El Camino College is a two-year public community college, officially and fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. The UC and CSU systems, as well as independent colleges and universities give full credit for appropriate courses completed at El Camino College. We are approved for veterans by the Office of Post-secondary Education, California Department of Education.

The El Camino Community College District is committed to providing equal opportunity in employment and educational opportunities for all individuals, regardless of race, color, ancestry, religion, gender, national origin, marital status, sexual orientation, handicap, age, and Vietnam-era status.

General Information

Anyone 18 years or older qualifies for admission to El Camino College. If under the age of 18, you will qualify if you have satisfied one of these:

1. Graduated from high school or
2. Passed the *California High School certificate of Proficiency Test*

High school students **MUST** obtain enrollment approval forms from high school prior to submitting applications for admission to the college. A separate approval form **MUST** be submitted to the Admissions Office for each semester.

When to Apply

New and former students may apply for summer session 2006 beginning **November 1**. Applications should be submitted to the Admissions Office as soon as possible. Programs are filled on a first-come basis.

Where to Apply

Apply online at www.elcamino.edu. Avoid standing in line, apply online! You may also file with the Admissions Office in the Student Services Center. The Admissions Office is open Monday through Thursday 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Visitor parking is available off the Manhattan Beach Blvd. entrance to the campus.

Attendance

If you enroll in a class and you do not attend the first scheduled meeting of the class, you may be dropped from the roster and your place may be given to a student waiting to enroll. Ultimately, it is the responsibility of the student to drop from a class. Failure to properly drop may result in a "W" or an "F."

Withdrawal from Class

It is the **STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY** to process an official withdrawal from class with the Admissions Office or the Cashier's Office. Failure to complete this process may result in a letter grade of A through F recorded on the student's permanent record.

Any student who receives a Temporary Tuition Fee Waiver from the Financial Aid Office must provide the necessary documentation to make the tuition waiver permanent. Students who do not provide the necessary documentation prior to withdrawing or dropping classes will be responsible for paying enrollment fees.

About Transcripts

If you plan to graduate, attend under veterans or Social Security benefits, or receive academic advisement to become matriculated, please request that high school and college transcripts from all schools you have attended be sent to El Camino College.

Your first two El Camino College transcripts are free. Additional transcripts are \$2 each, payable when requested. Transcripts are processed on a first-come basis. There is a \$5 charge for transcripts prepared on an emergency or hand-carry basis.

California Residency

To attend El Camino College as a qualified California resident, you must have established legal residence in the state for one full year immediately preceding the

first day of your summer session class. The residence of an unmarried student under the age of 18 is determined by the legal residence of the parents. A married minor determines residency from the date of marriage and must comply with the one-year requirement.

Non-resident students who receive a payment deferment through the Fiscal Services Office, but who are not determined to be eligible for financial aid, will be responsible for all fees. Please refer to the refund policy section regarding add and drop periods.

Student Records

Congress has provided in the "Family Education Rights and Privacy Act" that students have certain rights of access to their education records. A copy of the Act is located in the library.

Summer 2006 Registration

All students will be able to register for Summer 2006 classes via El Camino College's online services or telephone registration service.

Continuing Students

All continuing students will have the opportunity to register for summer classes by appointment starting Monday, May 15 through Thursday, June 15. The hours of online/telephone registration for this period are Monday through Thursday 8:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.; Fridays and Saturdays 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Fees should be paid within 7 days of registering.

New & Returning Students

All new and returning students to El Camino College shall register by appointment beginning Friday, June 2 through Thursday, June 15. The hours of online/telephone registration for this period are Monday through Thursday 8:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.; Fridays and Saturdays 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Fees should be paid within 7 days of registering.

Concurrent Enrollment

All students concurrently enrolled in secondary schools, new, continuing, or returning will have the opportunity to register for summer classes by appointment on Tuesday, June 13 and Wednesday, June 14. **ALL REQUIRED PAPERWORK MUST BE TURNED INTO ADMISSIONS COMPLETE WITH ALL AUTHORIZED SIGNATURES BY WEDNESDAY, JUNE 7, 2006** to ensure an appointment for registration. For more information on concurrent enrollment, please visit www.elcamino.edu/highschool. Contact us on the Web www.elcamino.edu - **MyECC**.

Fees

All fees are due at the time of registration. You are liable for all fees for the classes for which you registered, unless you drop the class by the deadline date.

Students with financial problems are encouraged to apply as early as possible to the Financial Aid Office.

The general fee requirement shall not apply to students enrolled in the non-credit courses specified in Education Code Section 84711.

A student who is on the Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) program, the Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Program (SSI/SSP) or the General Assistance Program should apply in the Financial Aid Office for the Enrollment Fee Financial Assistance Program.

Fee Refunds and Deadlines

To receive an enrollment fee refund, drop your class(es) through the online system by the enrollment fee refund deadline. You may access the system via the Web, registration phone line, at a kiosk on campus, at a cashier window, or in the Admissions area.

Deadline:

Classes starting June 19 must be dropped by June 22, 2006.

Classes starting June 26 must be dropped by June 29, 2006.

To receive a parking fee refund, you must return your parking pass to the Cashier's Office by the refund deadline. All refund checks will be mailed to your address listed in our computer system by September 30, 2006. If your address has changed, please update the change in the Admissions Office promptly.

You are liable for all fees unless you drop the class by the refund deadline date. Fees are due within 7 days of phone or Web registration. Cashier's Hours: 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Closed Fridays June 23 - August 11, 2006.

Non Resident (Out of Country/Out of State) Refunds

To receive a refund of non-resident tuition, drop your class(es) through the online system by the non-resident tuition deadline. You may access the system via the web, registration phone line, at a kiosk on campus, at a cashier window, or in the Admissions area.

Deadline for non-resident tuition: If classes are dropped on or before the end of the first week of the session, all fees will be refunded. Tuition for classes dropped on or before the end of the second week of the term, will be refunded at a rate of 50%. There will be no refunds for classes dropped after the 2nd week of the session. Refund checks will be mailed to your address listed in our computer system by September 30, 2004. If your address has changed, please update the change in the Admissions Office promptly.

Parking Fee

Students wishing to park on campus pay a \$20 fee for the entire session in accordance with Education Code Section 72247. Students who receive BOGG Method A, B & C will pay \$20.

Students with disabilities who have been issued a DMV Person (DP) placard may park in any student space or faculty/staff space and **MUST DISPLAY** the DMV disabled person placard/plates **AND** a valid El Camino College semester or daily parking permit when parked on campus. Failure to display both the disabled placard/plates and the El Camino College semester or daily permit will result in the issuance of a citation. Students parking in a marked Disabled stall need to display their DMV placard only. Temporary medical parking arrangements can be made at the Special Resource Center.

Fee Payment Methods

The college accepts personal checks drawn on U.S. banks, money orders, cash, traveler's checks and the following credit cards: Visa, MasterCard and Discover. Checks returned by the bank for any reason will result in (1) suspension from enrollment (2) denial of subsequent registration and (3) detention of transcripts until the financial obligation has been satisfied. A service charge of \$20 will be charged on any returned check.

Adds and Drops

It is the student's responsibility to process an official withdrawal from class. Failure to do so may result in a letter grade of A through F. A student may drop a class or classes within the refund period and add another class or classes using the fees already paid.

If a student drops after the refund deadline, payment of fees for the classes is forfeited. Any added class will require additional fees.

A student may drop a class before the refund deadline and add the same class at a different time/date/instructor with no additional fees. If a student drops a class after the refund deadline in order to add the same class at a different time/date/instructor, the student must request a lateral transfer or level transfer from both instructors. All transfers are processed through the Admissions Office.

Matriculation

Matriculation

There are four important steps in the matriculation process:

1. file the admission application
2. participate in assessment
3. participate in orientation activities
4. make a counseling appointment to develop an educational plan.

By following these steps, you will learn about clearing prerequisites, student rights and responsibilities, procedures on filing petitions, academic standards, student grievance procedures and other important areas of student life. Matriculation information is available in the college catalog, counseling and academic division offices and other locations on campus. Complaints about the matriculation process should be communicated to the Dean of Enrollment Services.

Assessment/Testing Procedures

Personal identification with a photograph and your El Camino College Identification Number is required to take tests and receive results.

For more testing information call (310) 660-3405. Testing should be completed as soon as possible after you file your admission application. Read the catalog description of classes which interest you to learn if there is any testing recommended or needed. Keep in mind that all placement tests are part of the multiple measures of the assessment process. Be sure to take testing results with you when you go for your academic advisement or educational planning sessions.

English Placement Test - Complete your *English Placement Test* at least one day before you attempt to enroll in any English course, which has a course level as a prerequisite, corequisite or recommended preparation. You may not repeat the *English Placement Test* once you have enrolled into both English course sequences. If you require further review of your placement recommendation, obtain the appropriate petition form in the Assessment/Testing Office.

English as a Second Language Placement Test - Complete both parts of your *English as a Second Language (ESL) Placement Test* at least one day before you attempt to enroll into any ESL course, which has a course level as a prerequisite, corequisite or recommended preparation. The first part of the ESL Test is on a drop-in basis, the second part by appointment only. Begin your ESL Assessment at least one week prior to your registration date. If

you require further review of your placement recommendation, you should see the ESL Coordinator in the Assessment/Testing Office.

Mathematics Placement Test - The *Mathematics Placement Test* is required of any student who wishes to enroll in any Mathematics class. High school math courses may not be used, *per se*, for placement into El Camino College math courses. However, they may be used in combination with testing for placement assessment, which must be completed before your registration date. Assessment and placement results will be valid for two years. Once you begin the mathematics course sequence, you cannot repeat the placement test and must take all courses in sequence.

Specialized Tests

Chemistry Placement Test - The *Chemistry Placement Test* is required of any student who wishes to enroll in Chemistry 1A unless the student has completed Chemistry 4 at El Camino College with a grade of C or better. Previous chemistry course work whether taken in high school or another college, does not in itself qualify a student for Chemistry 1A. Students who have never taken a chemistry course or who want a beginning class may enroll in Chemistry 4, 20, or 21A depending upon their major and completion of mathematics prerequisites. The Chemistry Placement Test may be taken only once and may not be taken if a student has enrolled in Chemistry 4 at any time. If you require further review of your placement recommendation, obtain the appropriate petition form in the Assessment/Testing Office.

Mathematics Competency Test - If passed, this may be used to satisfy the El Camino College mathematics competency graduation requirement (item # 6 of Section A of the AA/AS graduation requirements.) If you do not complete Mathematics 40 or 41B or any other course listed under Mathematics Competency requirement for the A.S. Degree in the College Catalog, you must pass this test for admission into the Registered Nurse Program.

The *Mathematics Competency Test* may be repeated a maximum of three times through a petitioning process. The appropriate petition form may be obtained through the Assessment/ Testing Office. Contact the Assessment/Testing Office for an appointment.

Waiver Exams for the Associate Degree. Waiver exams are available for the subjects of American Government, American History, and Contemporary Health. Contact the Assessment/Testing Office for further information.



Summer Services

Bookstore

The Bookstore provides all textbooks, supplies and reference books for El Camino College courses. Summer Bookstore hours are **Monday through Thursday**, 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

VISA, MasterCard and Discover Cards are accepted for the amount of purchase with a valid California driver's license or valid California ID.

Non-Acceptable charge cards: Parental.

Bookstore Check Policy & Travelers Check

1. **Required I.D.** - Valid Driver's License or State I.D. (no temporary), or Military I.D.

2. **Acceptable Checks** - Must be your personal check - Imprinted with your name and full address (No Post Office box numbers) Travelers Checks must use at least half of total check.

3. **Non Acceptable Checks** - Pre or Post Dated - Two party - Temporary - Payroll - Altered - Non-imprinted - Parental.

4. **Special Notes** - For amount of purchase only. \$5 minimum purchase; \$25 service charge will be assessed on all returned checks.

Please read the **refund policy** attached to your receipt **before** marking in books or removing shrinkwrap. Refund period for summer school will be posted in the Bookstore and stated on your cash register receipt. Summer book buyback dates will be posted in the Bookstore.

Career Center

Career Services is located in the Counseling Division, SSVC 100 in the Career and Transfer Center. Hours are Monday through Thursday 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Career Services provides the opportunity for extensive exploration and evaluation of interests, skills, and other characteristics related to vocational and pre-professional planning and job success through a resources library which includes books, video cassettes, occupational files and a computer software system featuring Internet access. Appointments for individual career counseling sessions and career assessments are available. Career Services also supports Human Development 5, an interactive career planning class.

Cashier's Office

The Cashier's Office is located on the first floor of the Administration Building. Office hours during summer session are 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Closed Fridays (June 23-August 11).

Child Development Center

The El Camino College Child Development Center is located on the corner of 166th St. and Crenshaw Blvd., in a fully equipped facility with licensed and credentialed teachers and staff.

The Center operates year-round, offering quality child care to children ages 2 (toilet trained) to 5 years old. The Center offers both full and part-time child care with reasonable rates. Students of El Camino College receive priority for enrollment. There is a \$40 registration fee for full time students. The program offers nutritious snacks and a developmentally appropriate curriculum.

The Center is open daily from 6:45 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. For info, call (310) 660-3720 between 7:45 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

Counseling Services

Counseling services are available to students through scheduled appointments or express counseling. Appointments must be made one week in advance through the Counseling Appointment Center. Appointments can be made Monday through Thursday in person or by calling (310) 660-3458. A student who has selected a major field of study is strongly encouraged to see one of the counselors assigned to that field while undeclared and undecided students may see any counselor.

As part of the matriculation program, counseling services assist students in clarifying career and life goals and in developing an appropriate course of study based on goals, aptitudes and interests.

Express academic counseling is usually

available from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday for students who have questions not requiring transcript review. The express counseling schedule is based on counseling faculty availability and is subject to change. Call (310) 660-3458 for express counseling schedule.

EOPS

Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) provides eligible students with support services in the areas of counseling, peer support, financial assistance, transferring and tutorial services. EOPS is located in rooms 202 and 203 on the second floor of the Student Services Center. Office hours are 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mon. through Thurs.

Academic counselors provide matriculation, personal and academic guidance services for all eligible students. Students who are trained as peer advisers work with students on academic, financial or personal matters. Peer advising is provided on a drop-in basis.

The EOPS staff assists students in applying for the many financial aid resources available, such as EOPS book service, scholarships and fee waivers.

The Transfer Guidance component of EOPS assists students in transferring to a four-year college or university to continue their education once their goals have been met at El Camino College. Application fee waivers are available to EOPS eligible students who participate in the program.

The EOPS office provides supervised study, which is a tutorial service designed to assist students toward successful completion of their academic course work.

Financial Aid

Students who want to apply for a tuition fee waiver must obtain and complete a Board of Governor's Waiver (BOGW) application and information sheet from the forms bin located outside the Financial Aid Office, or apply online at cccapply.org. Please be advised that the Financial Aid Office does collect supporting documentation for verification purposes. Students should review the Information Sheet to determine the appropriate documentation that must be submitted with the BOGW application.

Students who have filed a 2005-2006 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) AND have received a waiver for either the fall or spring semesters do NOT have to complete a new fee waiver application until the following fall semester.

The Financial Aid Office also offers the Federal Pell Grant and Stafford Loans during the summer sessions. Students who wish to apply should have submitted a

FAFSA to the federal processor and completed their financial aid files by June 30, 2006 or the last day of attendance, which ever comes first.

Career Placement Services (Formerly Job Placement)

Career Placement Services (CPS) is located in Room 204 of the Student Services Center Building. Summer hours are: 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday.

Career Placement Services provides a link between employers and students who are seeking part- or full-time, regular, temporary, holiday and summer employment. Internship opportunities are also available. Students also have access to assistance with job search, interview strategies, and resume writing. A computerized resource center and job search lab is also available.

Students who are currently enrolled or former students who have completed a minimum of 15 units at El Camino College may utilize Career Placement Services. New students must register for classes before utilizing services.

Check daily for on-going career fairs and new job listings.

Library Hours

The Library offers full summer services and is open from 7:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

Learning Resources Center

The Learning Resources Center (LRC) is located on the upper floor of the west wing of Schaurman Library and is open all hours the library is open. In the LRC, students have access to a wide collection of individualized study materials in audio, video, computer assisted instruction and multimedia formats.

These materials support instruction offered through every division of the college including foreign languages and instructional television.

The LRC Tutorial Program offers tutoring in many different subjects. See current schedule posted in LRC or on the LRC website.

In the Basic Skills Study Center (in LRC), students may work on their Basic Math and Reading skills with the help of individualized computer assisted instruction. Check with LRC staff for more information.

Children in Classrooms

Children are not permitted in classrooms while class is in session. Attendance in class is limited to officially enrolled students and authorized visitors or guests only. In addition, students shall not allow children to be left unattended or unsupervised anywhere on campus. It is the responsibility of each faculty member to inform their students of this requirement.

CAI Lab (Communications 204) offers students access to individualized computer assisted instruction in foreign language and other subjects on Macintosh and IBM-compatible computers. In addition, the CAI Lab serves as a word processing center for all ECC Students.

TOP Lab (Technical Arts 205) provides service to students registered in vocational programs at El Camino College. These services include computer assisted instruction, math tutoring and access to word processing, graphics and CADD applications software.

Library Media Technology Center (Lower level library, east wing) is a general purpose computer lab open to all ECC students.

Student ID cards are required to use all LRC services and centers.

Special Resource Center

Located in the east wing of the first floor of the Student Services Center, the Special Resource Center offers a wide range of equipment, supportive services and classes for students with disabilities.

El Camino College recognizes its responsibility to provide an equal opportunity for education for all students. The college's courses, programs, and facilities are designed to accommodate the needs of students with disabilities. No one may be excluded from any course, program or activity.

Eligibility is determined by a specially trained, highly skilled professional and paraprofessional staff. Each student is assessed on an individual basis. Specific educational needs are identified and a plan is developed with the student.

Courses are designed to address the specific and unique needs of students with disabilities. The courses listed under "Educational Development" and "Adapted Physical Education" in this Schedule of Classes are also described in the College Catalog.

Interpreters for the deaf, readers for the blind, mobility aides for the physically impaired and instructional aides for the learning disabled may be obtained through the program for those who are eligible.

Student Health Services

The Student Health Services will be closed during the summer and winter. Campus Police may be contacted in case of emergency requiring first aid.

Transfer Center

The Transfer Center, located in the Counseling Services Center, offers a wide range of activities designed to assist students in successfully transferring to the four-year college or university of their choice. Some of the activities and services offered are:

- Regularly scheduled visits by university representatives
- University campus tours to UC's, CSU's, and Independents
- University fairs
- A library of college catalogs and reference materials
- Transfer strategies, application, and specific major workshops
- Transfer admission guarantee programs
- Transfer advising

A calendar of activities is published monthly, is widely distributed, and can be picked up in the Transfer Center. The summer hours for the Transfer Center are Monday through Thursday 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Section 4002 meets for 8 weeks from: June 19 to August 10, 2006. Students enrolling in section 4002 must schedule a total of 6 hours per week. One of these hours must be scheduled during the Instructor's regularly scheduled hours on Monday or Wednesday evening. (The Instructor's schedule will be available in the Learning Resources Center.) The other 5 hours are to be scheduled during the Learning Resources Center hours of service. Students enrolling in this section must meet with the Instructor during the first week of classes.

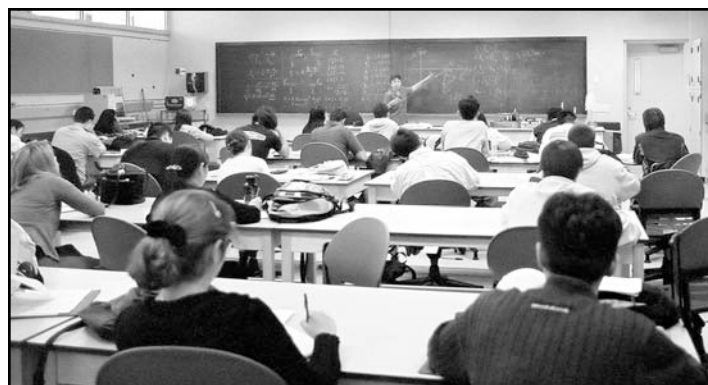

STUDY ABROAD IN SPAIN

This summer El Camino College will offer a 33-day program in Spain. Students will spend four nights in the capital city of Madrid visiting museums, the Royal Palace, Segovia, and Toledo, as well as wonderful shops and restaurants. Students will spend two weeks each in Granada and Barcelona, attending classes and visiting local points of interest. The group will also travel to Seville, and Valencia.

The cost for this program is \$4,325, which includes round-trip air transportation from Los Angeles to Europe; 32-nights' accommodations; ten meals; transportation and transfers by private motor coach; city tours in Madrid, Granada, and Barcelona with English-speaking guides and paid museum admission fees; two-day excursions in Madrid; an overnight excursion to Seville from Granada; and public transportation passes for two weeks in both Granada and Barcelona.

Dates for this program are: June 20 to July 22, 2006. Several pre-departure class meetings will be held on campus. To qualify for the Study Abroad Program in Spain, students need to have completed a minimum of 12 college units with a G.P.A. of 2.5 or above and be eligible for English 1A. Classes to be offered include:

Distance Education courses are ideal for those who are looking for a convenient way to take courses. We offer both online courses (via computer) and telecourses (via video) in a wide variety of subjects. The courses are fully accredited and offer the same high quality of instruction as traditional classes. The course content, course credit, and cost per unit is the same as equivalent courses offered on campus. Anyone who is eligible to take courses on campus may enroll in Distance Education courses.

The courses offered this semester are listed under "Distance Education" in this Schedule (pages 13 to 15). Many of the courses have a mandatory first class meeting. If you do not attend the first meeting, you may be dropped from the course. Refer to the "Distance Education" section in this schedule for the time and location of the first meeting.

Some online courses do not have a first class meeting. You must follow the instructions under the course listing or you may be dropped from the course.

The Student Handbook for Online Courses and the Student Handbook for Telecourses provide additional information about the courses. All students should obtain the Handbook(s) prior to the start of the semester. Both are available on the Distance Education website and at our office. Please contact us if you'd like to have it mailed to you.

FAQs about Distance Education Courses

The first class meeting conflicts with another course I want to take. What should I do?

Do not enroll in both courses – choose only one!

Will I be required to attend class meetings on campus throughout the semester?

It depends on which course you are enrolled in. Refer to the Student Handbooks for the total number of meetings you will be expected to attend.

If meetings are scheduled throughout the semester, when will they be held?

They usually take place on the same day and at the same time as the first class meeting. You may contact the instructor for specific meeting dates. You will find a faculty directory on our website and in our office.

How does an online course work?

Students in online courses communicate with their instructor and classmates electronically via a course website. The instructor posts such things as lectures, assignments, announcements, and other information to the site. The class may respond with questions, comments, etc.

Some activities may require students to be online at a given time (online chat sessions, online exams, etc.). Contact the instructor for information.

Students must have at minimum:

- A Computer - either a PC with Windows and a Pentium processor or a Macintosh with at least System 9.0
- Regular access to the Internet
- A recent version of a web browser such as Netscape Navigator or Microsoft Internet Explorer
- An Internet Service Provider
- An Email Address
- Current Word Processing Software (as required by instructor)

Some courses may have additional requirements. The instructor will provide more information.

Computer literacy is required and experience with computer communication is recommended. The procedures for working online will be explained by the instructor.

What is a telecourse?

Telecourses are pre-produced video courses. They are shown locally on the ECC television station, which is carried on the Time Warner Communications cable system (Channel 8). Some courses are also shown on KCET, the Los Angeles area PBS station. Students who are unable to view the telecourses where they reside may check out video copies of the programs free of charge from the Schauerman Library or they may view them in the Library's Learning Resources Center. Copies may also be obtained for a fee through RMI Media Productions, Inc., a telecourse rental service. **Consult the Student Handbook for Telecourses for the broadcast schedule.**

Is a Distance Education course right for me?

In order to succeed in a Distance Education course, you must be self-motivated and be able to manage your time effectively. You also need strong reading and study skills. Distance Education courses are every bit as challenging as traditional courses.

How Do I Enroll?

The registration process is the same for Distance Education courses as it is for on-campus classes. If you wish to enroll in Distance Education courses and on-campus courses, register for all of your courses at the same time.
