ECC History

- After WWII, Redondo Beach, Inglewood, El Segundo, Centinela Valley and Torrance decided a two-year college was needed
- Established in 1947
- Serving the community for 65 years: associate degree, transfer path to a university, career technical education, workforce education

- Transfer admission rate to UCLA regularly ranks #1 in state
- Consistently ranks in the top 10 in the state for transferring to UC and CSU
- Regularly ranks in top three in the state for transfer rate to USC

2008: Central Plant

Local Bond Information

- ECCCD Board voted to place Measure E, a \$350 million facilities bond measure, on November 2012 ballot
- Measure E will cost only \$7 per year per \$100,000 assessed property – not market – value
- Assessed value, not market value of home

Renovation

ECC Community Survey

- 99% have heard of El Camino College
- El Camino College “favorable rating”
 - ECC 83%
 - USC 84%
 - UCLA 87%
- 68% would support an ECC bond extension
- 60% would support bond with knowledge of tax increase



2009: Parking Structure

How Will Measure E Funds Be Utilized?

- Measure E projects include:
 - Expand science labs
 - Upgrade outdated electrical systems and wiring
 - Green energy for savings
 - Up-to-date classroom technology
 - Improve facilities for veterans
 - Campus site improvements: accessibility, safety/security
 - Health and safety improvements
 - Additional classrooms



2008: Humanities Building

How Will Measure E Funds Be Utilized?

- No funds may be used for any college employee salaries or pensions
- Sacramento will be prohibited from taking any of the funds
- All funds will be subject to local control
- Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee ensures funds are spent as authorized
