


POLLING TERMINOLOGY

Popularity versus Intensity



When trying to bring movement on an issue, it is intensity that matters the most. The intensity level needs to be at least 40% on either end of the spectrum to know that voters feel strongly about an issue or questions and what will move them.

Outside the margin of error stronger than the average (in this case at least 5% more than the overall average)

Demographics


Men/Women, working women, retired, young, Republican/Democratic/Independent, Caucasian//African American/Hispanic-Latino, Direct College Experience, etc.

Mood & Economic Environment

Voters in the El Camino College District are very divided in their opinions about the direction the area is headed (45% right direction and 45% wrong track), and there is a lot more negative intensity (29% strongly wrong track) than positive intensity (11% strongly right direction). These kind of negative intensity numbers are not likely to turn positive anytime soon.








EL CAMINO COLLEGE IMAGE





Long lines, overcrowded classes and teachers not really interested in the people they're teaching. I don't know what else. It's just a community college. A lot of high school drop outs go there.



Voters in the district have an overwhelmingly positive opinion when first asked about the bond extension measure for El Camino College (74% favor and 15% oppose). Further, the forty-four percent (44%) definite support level means that the measure has a solid base of supporters who will not be easily moved by any negative advertising produced by the measure's opponents.




Gender Breakdown

There is slightly more opposition to the extension measure among male voters. However, 8% definitely oppose is really not that significant.




Age Breakdown

The youngest and oldest voters in the district show the most intensity in favor of the bond extension measure. The only problem with this is that the young are also the "least likely" to vote. However, having 47% Definitely in favor among the 65 plus age group is a plus because they traditionally always vote.




Home Status Breakdown

It is also not surprising to see homeowners showing a lesser support level for the measure than renters, but sixty-eight percent (68%) of homeowners supporting the measure would again mean a large victory for the measure.




Ethnicity Breakdown

Support for the bond extension measure is much stronger among Hispanic and African American voters.




Vote Likelihood Breakdown

Support levels for the bond extension measure are highest with the most infrequent voters, but support among those most likely to vote is still around 2/3rds positive (66%), and the definite support among these highest probability voters is at a solid thirty-eight percent (38%).



Geographic Region Breakdown


Support for the measure is strongest in the Inglewood/LA region of the district.



When the voters were given more details and told that they would not have to pay any more than the \$60-\$80 per year, they are already paying, in their property taxes if this extension measure is passed, they were slightly less supportive of the measure (73% favor and 15% oppose), but there was still a solid core of forty-two percent (42%) who said they were definitely in favor of the measure. Even though this meant no increase, this question reminded them that they were paying a tax from an earlier year.


There are four specific items to be funded by this bond extension measure which arouse positive intensity above the fifty percent (50%) level, and two of them test above the sixty percent (60%) level. Messages which elicit this kind of intense reaction from voters are usually impossible for opponents to overcome.

The bond measure would continue to add additional space and training for future nurses and fire-fighters, providing these care givers the latest in high tech equipment and an environmentally sound learning facility.

The buildings that the bond measure extension is paying for are the oldest and least energy efficient with the least amount of useful technology on the campus. With completion of the new buildings, the campus will be far more "GREEN" energy efficient, and this will save the college thousands of dollars annually in energy costs.




Nurse & Firefighter Tracking Top Groups


Replacement of Non-Energy Efficient Buildings Top Groups


More Space for Career and Technical Education Facilities Top Groups




While none of these other items to be funded by the bond extension measure hurt the cause of El Camino College, they simply do not arouse positive intensity on the same level as others. A focus on the other four items should be enough to push the measure over the top without even mentioning these.

The bond measure would include the money to build a new SMALLER College Administration building. By doing this, additional land will be freed up on the campus for other classrooms and athletic facilities for the students.

Included in the bond measure is a new \$40 million dollar Student Activities Center which will provide a new well equipped study hall for students as well as have offices and meeting rooms for the El Camino College Student Government.

A new \$121 million dollar athletic stadium and gymnasium, Olympic size swimming pool, class rooms for athletic education, and a full fitness complex will be built with money from the extension of the bond measure.





Attribute Bond Extension Ballot

After hearing about the various items to be included within the bond extension measure, support within the district increases to over eighty percent (82%), and definite support increases to fifty percent (50%). This could very well be how the final numbers look on election day if opponents to the measure are unable to mount a serious campaign.


POSITIVES

A simple focus on the value of El Camino College to the community and on the importance of it being kept modern and ready to meet the needs of the next generation works quite well as a campaign message for the extension measure (40% strongly agree). Neither of the other tested messages reached the crucial 40% intensity level.

%Total Agree Supporters of the bond extension measure say El Camino College is a valuable part of the community and that taxpayers Strongly Agree 40% 68% should continue to support the college fully as it continues to modernize its facilities to meet the needs of the next generation. Bond extension measure supporters point to all the newly modernized buildings on the campus of El Camino College, and 32% they say that it only makes sense to continue and modernize the 56% other buildings as well so that the entire campus is as up to date and prepared for the future as possible.. Those supporting the bond extension measure say that El Camino College has managed its bond money very wisely and is on track to complete almost every project which the bond was intended to pay 51% for. These supporters say local voters should not have a problem 24% continuing to pay this small extra tax so that the campus can be finalized and stay up to date rather than beginning to deteriorate again as it had before the original bond measure was passed.

Supporters of the bond extension measure say El Camino College is a valuable part of the community and that taxpayers should continue to support the college fully as it continues to modernize its facilities to meet the needs of the next generation.




NEGATIVES

The messages tested in opposition to the bond extension measure do not generate any intensity at all (the highest being only 19% strongly agree). Unless opponents come up with something new and unique which tests a whole lot better, it will be very hard for them to mount any sort of real campaign.

Those opposed to the bond extension measure say El Camino College passed this bond measure with a promise that it's campus renovations would be completed before the money was gone, and the opponents say it is unfair for the college to ask voters to continue to pay this extra tax for more years just because the college did not use the money as wisely as it should have.

Opponents of the bond extension measure point out that El Camino College already has one of the newest and most modern campuses of any community college in the area. They say that, in these tough financial times, it is more important to let the bond expire and put more money back into the pockets of taxpayers than it is to make the campus even more modern.


Those opposing the bond extension measure say that El Camino College is saying this bond extension measure will fund many of the same items which they said the original bond measure would pay for. These opponents say the college has not used the money they have been given in a wise enough manner and that voters should not give them any more money to waste.



Informed Bond Extension Ballot


After hearing about the items to be funded by the measure and then hearing the arguments both for and against the bond extension measure, fully three quarters (75%) of the voters in the El Camino College District still say they favor the measure, and a strong forty-three percent (43%) say they definitely favor the measure. Given the lack of any convincing arguments against the measure, this puts the measure in a very solid position for passage in November.

As you may or may not know, the El Camino College District is considering the possibility of extending a bond measure to continue to provide modern and safe facilities for the education of its students. Would you FAVOR or OPPOSE extending the existing bond measure for El Camino College?



When faced with the prospect of multiple taxation issues on their ballot in November, more voters in the district said they would vote for the college measure (53%) than said they would vote for the statewide K-14 bond measure (46%) or Governor Brown's statewide tax increase measure (22%).

As you are probably aware, there are likely to be several different measures on the ballot at the same time in any given election. If you went into the voting booth and found out these three measures were on the same ballot plus very likely others, which ones would you vote in favor of?




Final El Camino College Opinion

Regardless of what their opinions were about the bond extension measure, nearly every voter in the district (97%) said at the end of the survey that they considered El Camino College to be at least somewhat important to the area, and sixty-eight percent (68%) of them said they felt that way strongly.

We have been discussing quite a bit about El Camino College, and I would now like to take a moment and ask you just how important you feel El Camino College is to this area of Los Angeles County. Would you say it is (ROTATE TOP TO BOTTOM, BOTTOM TO TOP) extremely important, somewhat important, not all that important, or not important at all?






My main thought is I like it but the fact that they're spending tons of money that they already spent, I don't know how many millions on those new buildings. I don't think they need to spend any more.

Fully eighty-five percent (85%) of the voters interviewed said they had direct experience with the California Community College System, and forty-three percent (43%) of them said they themselves had direct experience at El Camino College.


