COURSE REVIEW; CHANGE IN CATALOG DESCRIPTION

Students improve their pronunciation and speaking oral communication skills along with their understanding of spoken and extend their study of the basic grammar, vocabulary and Chinese characters. Audio and video tapes are available to reinforce the language skills acquired in the classroom Technological support and tutorial services enhance the course.

Note: The prerequisite for this course is comparable to two years of high school Chinese.

Recommendation:
