How to Build a Solar Powered Car/Web Design for Newbies— Practical Algebra (Grades 7-8) #410048

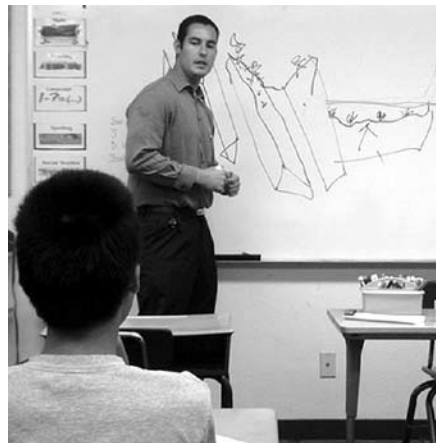

Corps' engineers mentor middle-school students

Recognizing it's never too early to begin mentoring youth and growing future engineers and scientists, members of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Los Angeles District actively engage in educational awareness programs.

Los Angeles District team members spoke with students at the **El Camino College Kid's College** in Torrance, Calif. July 15 about levee and dam construction, as part of a summer education program for students in grades six to eight.

Jody Fischer, Senior Hydraulics Engineer and Damien Lariviere, a landscape architect and intern in Engineering Division, provided a snapshot of engineering careers and projects in the L.A. District.

When asked why she chose to become a Civil Engineer, Fischer replied, "I love math and wanted to use it to build things." Students also asked Fischer if a civil engineering student needs to be good at math. She explained, "You don't have to be extremely smart in math, but you need to enjoy it enough to spend the time learning it."

She encouraged students to think about flood control relative to safety and the environment. She also helped them understand the power of flood waters, and how the Corps' reservoir operations affect water quality and wildlife. Fischer introduced them to a variety of Corps projects by showing them photos, including the Tropicana-Flamingo Flood Control project in Las Vegas.

Lariviere spoke to the math students about the personal reasons he became a landscape architect. "I choose to be a landscape architect because I wanted to change the way people live," said Lariviere. "A friend once asked me if I would like to live in downtown Los Angeles," said Lariviere.

"I quickly responded, 'No way, I'd miss a yard full of trees and plants.'"

He told students about the difficult choice he made in college: choosing between a career in architecture or landscape architecture. "I realized that while architecture could be an amazing profession, buildings can be made any time," said Lariviere. "Land on the other hand, cannot be made."

Lariviere discussed how the Army Corps of Engineers builds dams, channels and levees, primarily to preserve human life. "We understand that by constructing these, we may also disturb land and the potential habitat surrounding the area," he said. "It's our responsibility to restore anything we impact." Lariviere spoke about the many job opportunities the Corps offers in the United States and in other countries. "It's not just an Engineer's show at the Corps; it takes a very diverse group of minds, cultures and different professions to accomplish the work and projects we do," Lariviere told the students.

Fischer left the students with a few words of advice. "When you lose yourself in solving problems or doing math homework, then you know that engineering may be a good fit for you," she said. "When you lose track of time because you are so interested in what you are studying, it's a very good sign that you've found your niche."

The district recently celebrated the launching of the STEM-UP Initiative™. The program provides educational and enrichment opportunities to the students, teachers and parents of the 13 elementary and three middle schools that feed into Roosevelt and Mendez High Schools in East Los Angeles.
