- Registration must be in the name of the child.
- Students must be under 18 to attend Kid's College classes.
- Kid's College classes are not for K-12 or college credit.
- No grades are assigned.
- Children are not allowed to attend classes in which they are not officially enrolled.
- Grade levels indicate the grade children will be attending in the Fall.
- Choose your child's courses carefully-there are no transfers or refunds if parent enrolls their child in the wrong class.

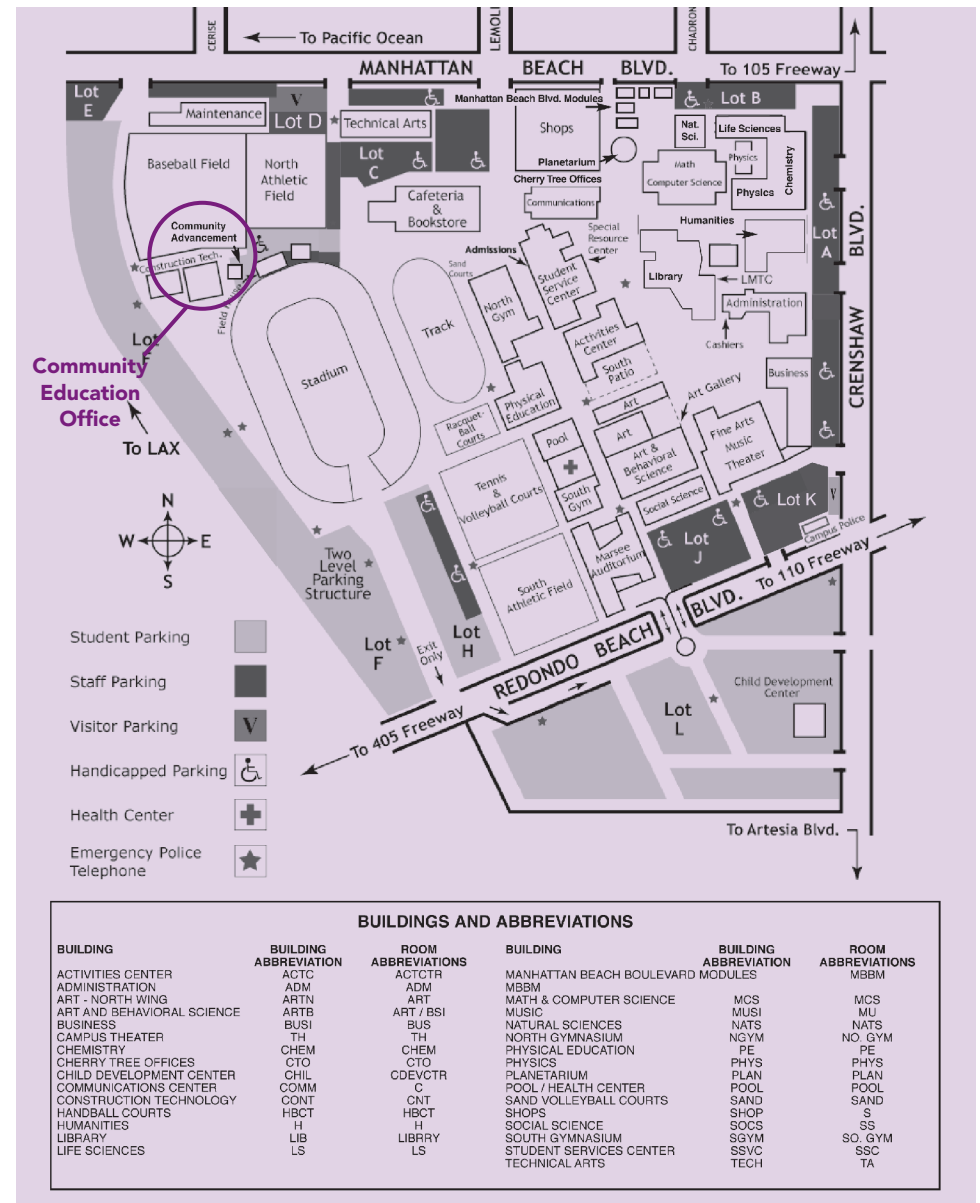

Area Map



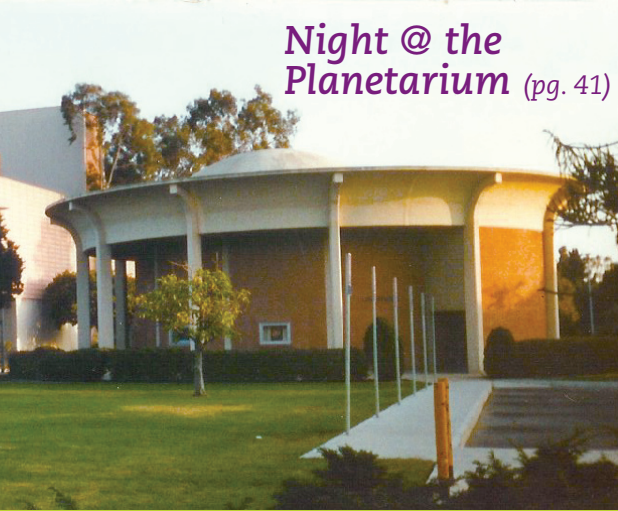

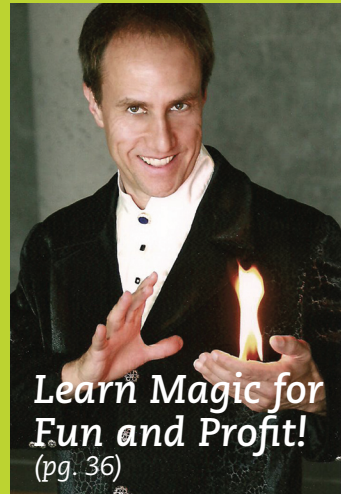
