

Chapter Quizzes (Total 235 Points)

a. Chapter Quizzes from the Textbook Materials

(10 questions x 15 chapters = Total 150 points)

Each week you will be given a closed-book chapter quiz taken from the textbook materials.

b. Student Quiz Questions.

(Chapter 1 & 2 are worth 10 pts each = 20 Points)

(Chapters 3 – 8 are worth 5 pts each = 65 Points)

(= Total 85 points)

1. General Instructions:

- a. Questions must be keyboarded. You may circle the correct answer in ink. Spell check and grammar check your work.
- b. Show the correct answer letter (a, b, c, or d)(true or false). Indicate the page number and the section in the text where the answer is found (Page, Section, etc.) and mark the chapter number.
- c. If your question matches that of any other student, neither students will receive credit for that question.
- d. Multiple choice (M/C) answers must have four selections, a or b or c or d. You may not have more than ONE “all of the above” or “none of the above” for any chapter quiz.
- e. True/False (T/F) questions may not all be the same answer: cannot be all True and cannot be all False.
- f. You may not repeat a T/F or a M/C. For example, the following receives only ONE answer, not two:
 1. *The name of this class is:* **“C”**
 - a. *History*
 - b. *Real estate*
 - c. *Escrow*
 - d. *Math*
 2. *The name of this class is ESCROW.* **“TRUE”**

- g. You may not copy the answer of another student.

2. Specific Instructions:

- a. Write five true/false and five multiple choice questions for chapters 1 and 2 for a total of 10 questions for chapter one and ten questions for chapter 2 for each individual person. (See #3 below) Be sure to indicate the chapter number.
- b. After you receive your “group Number” your group is to write a total of 10 questions for each group for chapters 3-15. Write your GROUP # on the top of your work each week. One person may write the true/false and the other person may write the multiple choice; or, one person may write all ten questions for one week, with the other person writing the questions for the following week. It is the individual student’s responsibility to write the ten questions if the partner drops out of the group or does not write questions.
