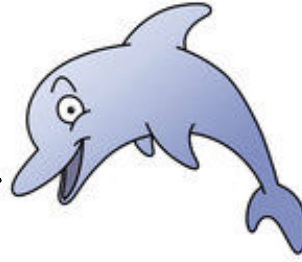


**What people are saying

“I liked how everything was laid out for you, from study guides to lecture notes and PowerPoint slides. There is a lot of reading, but simple, easy reading.”

“Read the online reading for each lecture topic.”

“Pay attention to the review quiz (“clicker”) questions, as they are really helpful in studying and related to test questions.”

“Make sure that you understand the material at the beginning of the course, because it hurts you throughout the entire semester if you do not.”

“Do all the reading, and make sure that you know what he is saying. If you don’t, ask questions until you do.”

“The labs are graded but you are left to your own conclusions, so ask questions if you are not sure.”

“Don’t be scared to ask questions if you don’t understand something.”

“I liked how he was available after class for questions.”

“Ask Professor Noyes questions. He is very good about answering all student questions, in class and outside class.”

“Take notes, ask questions, and makes friends who will help you succeed in class. When studying for the exams, take the study guide questions and answer them. Never miss class.”

“Definitely be here for the labs. It really helps to remember everything for the test, not to mention they’re worth points. They are difference makers.”

“If you have to miss class, try not to miss the lab section.”

“Attend each class meeting – including the field trips. And take the labs seriously.”

“Complete all the labs as this is the best practice for the tests.”

“Show up to every class. It really helps being in the classroom...a lot of points are awarded for showing up.”

“If you have to miss class time, miss the lecture, but not the lab. A lot of points are given for just being there.”

“Don’t miss class; you will always miss something that is beneficial for the tests (or labs)!”

“My only advice is to come to class everyday. You miss vital information in one day, & it can impact your test scores.”
