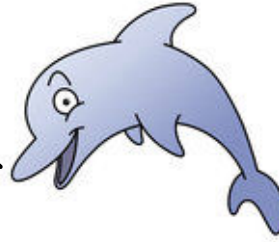


**What people are saying about

You have to be very organized and have your stuff together at all times.”

“Definitely spend time & effort EVERY WEEK in order to follow the schedule or you could be EASILY lost.”

“Do a little each day, try not to jam too much into a day, you will never get it all.
Setting a goal for each day and letting it sink in will help a lot.”

“You should totally keep up with the syllabus and assignments. If you fall behind in this class, you should drop it because the amount of work is a lot.”

“Monday, you need to read all the material - read with your study guide. Start your Lab Assignment.

Tuesday, participate in Discussions - so that students can see your questions early. Also, take the quizzes.

Wednesday, you should redo your quiz and ask questions if you did not score too well.

Thursday - listen to the audio lecture and read over your study guide. Continue to work on the lab.

Friday - you should come in to the lab because it is easier; you won’t become overwhelmed by the questions and mathematical work required when you’re working in a group and with the teacher. Turn in your Progress Report.

Saturday and Sunday you should be able to relax.”

“There is a lots of information and study aids on this site – use them.”

“Start on the study guides early and post any answers to the forum that you aren't sure about.”

“Do not skip assignments.”

“Always do the progress reports (which I always did) and all the other assignments so that you don't lose any points on small, relatively-easy assignments. This will help to make your grade stronger for the tests.”

“Start filling in the progress report at the beginning of the week and every time you post something to the discussion board.”

“Make sure that you understand the material at the beginning of the course, because it hurts you throughout the entire semester if you do not.”

“Don't forget material you've already learned, because you'll be able to continue using what you learned for future parts of the class.”

“Participate in the discussion forums because the lack of points really adds up and affects your grade. They actually help out too if you're just perusing.”

“Do not copy and paste text from a reading, unless you are using it as an example or reference. Always credit the author, and answer in your own words. Otherwise you are just LAZY and don't really learn anything.”

“The labs are graded but you are left to your own conclusions, so ask questions if you are not sure.”

“Always ask the teacher questions on the lab to make sure to get full points on the lab.”

“Don’t be scared to ask questions if you don’t understand something.”

“Definitely do the labs. It really helps to remember everything for the test, not to mention they’re worth points. They are difference makers.”
