## **EL CAMINO COLLEGE CAMPUS ALERT**

The El Camino College Police Department reported an incident where an unknown male suspect recently grabbed a female student's backpack and briefly tried to restrain her. The incident occurred at about 11:45 a.m. in the Humanities Building on March 12, but was not reported to El Camino College Police until several days later. The student was unharmed.

## **Suspect Description:**

- Male black adult, 20-23 years of age
- 5-foot 7-inches tall; thin build, with black hair and hazel eyes
- A mole on his left cheek and a tattoo on his left forearm

Cadets have been assigned to patrol the building, and the halls are under increased supervision by police personnel.

El Camino College Police again remind the campus community to be vigilant about safety – in all situations and locations. Police advise everyone to walk in a group or at least with one other person at night, use the campus shuttle service, and to put away distracting items such as music listening devices and cell phones.

### The El Camino College Police Department encourages our students, staff and faculty to:

- Be very alert as to your surroundings remember the use of iPod like devices and cell phones may significantly distract you
- Report any unusual or suspicious persons immediately to the El Camino College Police Department. You can contact the police via cellular phone at (310) 660-3100, use any blue telephone poles on campus or dial 9-1-1 free of charge from any on campus pay telephone or from your cellular phone
- Don't walk alone, use the buddy system; Have keys in hand before walking to your car
- Night students and faculty are encouraged to park in the same general area as other faculty or students with night classes in their building; this provides the opportunity for a group of students and faculty to walk to their cars after dark
- If you have to walk alone at night, utilize the Campus Courtesy Shuttle (The shuttle operates 5:30 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Use one of the Blue POLICE poles located throughout campus, ask your instructor to call campus police for you, or call campus police on your own, 310-660-3100 to request the service)
- Always cooperate with the suspect's demands; your property can always be replaced
- Be prepared
