All general education courses completed towards the nursing degree must have a minimum grade of "C". A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 in all college courses is required for admission.

GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES

General Education courses must be completed before graduation. It is strongly recommended that you complete these prior to beginning the nursing program. Equivalent courses taken at another college may be used to meet these requirements. <u>Effective fall 2020</u> the General Education requirements for the nursing program will change as follows:

- English 1C, 1CH (Note: students may substitute any of the following courses to meet the English 1C requirement Philosophy 105, 105H, 106, Psychology 3, 3H, or Communication Studies 120)
- Communication Studies 100 will replace English 1B and English 1BH as a graduation requirement (Note any 3-unit course from Communication Studies 120, 130, 140 may be substituted for Communication Studies 100).
- Psychology 5 or 5H
- Sociology 101, 101H or Anthropology 2
- Humanities Any 3 unit course from area 3 of the A. S. Degree Requirements

- Humanities Any 3 unit course from area 3 of the A. S. Degree Requirements
