At El Camino College we want every student to be academically successful; therefore, it is important that you follow the steps below:

Schedule Your Appointments

Complete the Intake

The online intake form needs to be completed before attending your counseling appointment. This will help the counselor understand what barriers interfered with your academics and can help recommend appropriate resources. For 60 minute appointments only.

Meet with a Counselor

The counselor will help you develop a specific plan to get back into good academic standing and will recommend the appropriate resources needed to be successful. During the meeting you will:

- Complete and sign a Probation Contract (Level 2 only)
 - Complete and sign a Frobation Contract (Level 2 Complete and sign a Student Success Plan
 - Update educational plan

Attend Workshops

Probation Level I: Required to attend SSP 1 Workshop

Probation Level II: Required to attend SSP 1 Workshop and SSP 2 (RISE to Success) Workshop. *Note: If you already attended an SSP 1 Workshop within 1 year then you only need to attend an SSP 2 Workshop.
