



SOCIOLOGY/SOCIAL ECOLOGY – TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES: Sociologists are concerned with social life and the social causes and consequences of human behavior. With a bachelor's degree, sociology graduates will be competing with other liberal arts graduates. A master's degree could lead to such fields as social work (see the Social Work Major sheet), human resources development, and public health. A PhD is usually required for teaching and research at the university level and for high-level positions in research institutes, private industry and government agencies. Social impact assessment provides information on the effects proposed actions might have on the quality of life in human communities. Sociology goes beyond the limitations of personal experience and prepares for informed, responsible participation in a complex society. Sociology is a suitable basis for such professions as law, business, education, architecture, medicine, and public health. Sociologists may specialize in the family, urban community, health, old age, occupations, environmental issues, sex roles, sports, government operations, law enforcement, employment counseling, vocational rehabilitation or other aspects of social processes or social systems.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE FOR TRANSFER (AA-T)

Students who have completed the AA-T in Sociology will have a strong academic foundation in the field and will be prepared for upper division baccalaureate study at the university. This coursework will satisfy most of the lower-division requirements at many institutions within the California State University system. This degree is intended for students who are primarily interested in transferring to a four year university and majoring in Sociology and may provide priority consideration for admission to a CSU. **Students considering transferring to a UC, private, or out of state university: Please consult with a counselor before applying to transfer since transfer requirements may be slightly different than those required for the AA-T.**

SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY (2015-16) **IMPACTED

Sociology 101, 104, 109 or Math 150 or Psychology 9A; Students need a 2.50 cumulative GPA and grades of C or higher in the major preparation to be eligible for admission to the major. Language requirement: 3rd semester of one foreign language is required to fulfill the graduation requirement.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY

Sociology: Sociology 101; Math 150 or a score of 4 or 5 on the AP Statistics exam or Philosophy 106 or Sociology 109 or Psychology 9A

Social Welfare (*Impacted*): Sociology 101; Psychology 5; Math 150; Recommended: Anthropology 2; Economics 1 & 2; Political Science 1

* Note: IGETC or UCB's Requirements in Reading and Composition, Quantitative Reasoning, and Foreign Language **MUST** be completed by the spring semester prior to fall transfer.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS

Sociology A.B.: Sociology 101, 104; Anthropology 2; one course from the following: History 101 or 102 or 175 & 176 or 183 & 184; one course from the following: Philosophy 103, 105., 106, or 120

Sociology A.B.(Comparative Studies and World Development): Sociology 101; Economics 1; Anthropology 2; Political Science 2 Coursework in one modern foreign language at the two year level or provide proof of proficiency (27-30 quarter units = 18-20 semester units)

Sociology A.B. (Law & Society): Sociology 101, 104; 2 courses from Anthropology 2; Political Science 1, 6, 7 or 10; one course from Philosophy 103, 105, 106, or 120; two courses from History 101, 102, 175 & 176 or 183 & 184

Sociology A.B.(Social Services): Sociology 101 and 104; Psychology 5

Sociology A.B. (Organizational Studies): Sociology 101; Economics 1, 2

Note: Transfer students pursuing this major who do not certify IGETC must complete a college graduation requirement in a foreign language.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, LOS ANGELES

Sociology 101; Math 150 or Psychology 9A or Sociology 109 or an AP Statistics exam with a score 3 or higher

*Demand for this major highly exceeds space available. Students must be admitted to Pre-Sociology. Students may not change their major to Sociology if admitted under another major.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, IRVINE (2015-16)

Sociology: Sociology 101, 104; two courses from: Sociology 102, 107, Psychology 8; select one course from: Anthropology 1, 2, 3, Economics 1, 2, 5, Geography 1, 2, 5, Political Science 3, Psychology 5; select one course from: Anthropology 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, Geography 7, Political Science 1, 2, 5, 6, 10, Psychology 7, 8, 9B, 10, 15, 16, Sociology 102, 104

*Note: In fulfillment of the requirements above, a single course may be used only once.

Social Ecology: Mathematics 150 or Psychology 9A or Sociology 109; Psychology 5 or 8 or 15; Psychology 9B; Administration of Justice 100

Social Policy and Public Service: Sociology 107

*Note: Sociology and Social Policy and Public Service majors must satisfy a mathematics requirement.

Courses that students can take at ECC to fulfill this requirement are Math 190 and Math 150 or Psychology 9A or Sociology 109.
