Transfer Requirements

The following requirements for the major are subject to change without notice. To assure accuracy of the information on this sheet, you should consult with a counselor, the articulation officer, or review articulation agreements via the internet at www.assist.org.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Business Administration programs are designed to prepare people to plan, organize, and control the activities of people and other resources to achieve the objectives of an organization. Typical options under Business Administration major include: Accounting, Finance, Management, Human Resources Management, International Business, Management Information Systems, Operations Management (or Management Science), Marketing, and Business Law, Real Estate and Labor Relations, Transportation and Logistics. Not every college offers all of these options; check with the transfer college catalog or web site of your choice.

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, DOMINGUEZ HILLS

<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>: Business 1A-1B; CIS 13; Economics 1, 2; Law 4 or 5; <u>Recommended</u>: Math 150 as preparation for an upper division course at CSUDH.

<u>Information Systems Concentration</u>: add CIS 16 and CIS 133 or 134 <u>International Business Concentration</u>: add Political Science 10

Computer Technology: Pre-Major courses: CIS 13, 16; CS 3; Math 150, 180 (refer to www.assist.org)

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON

Pre-Major Courses: Business 1A-1B; CIS 13; Economics 1, 2; Law 4; Math 160 or 190

* Economics 2 will double count for major and General Education.

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, LONG BEACH *Impacted

<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>: Business 1A-1B; Economics 1*, 2*; Math 150 and Math 160-161* or Math 190*; (Philosophy 3 or 23 required only for Accounting majors); Highly Recommended: CIS 13; Admission is based on the cumulative GPA, completion of supplemental requirements, and space available basis.

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, LOS ANGELES

<u>University requirement</u>: English 1C

Pre-Major Courses: Business 1A-1B; CIS 13; Economics 1, 2; Law 5; Math 150. Recommended: Math 160

for MIS)

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, NORTHRIDGE

<u>Options</u>: Business Law, Financial Services (impacted), Management, Marketing, Real Estate, Supply Chain Management, and Systems and Operations Management.

<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>: Business 1A-1B, 28, CIS 13 or Business 54; Economics 1, 2; Law 5; Math 150 and Math 160 or 190. A cumulative GPA of 2.5 will be required for the financial service option for admission.

Marketing Option: no additional courses

<u>Accounting Option</u>: this option is impacted. Students must complete Business 1A and Business 28 with grades of "B" or better. The other prerequisite courses need to be completed with grades of "C" or better. Students will apply to the Accounting option in their first semester at CSUN. Applicants will be ranked by GPA and admitted to the major in that order until all spaces are filled.

SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY

*Impacted

<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>: Business 1A-1B; & 28 (Business 28 is not required for accounting majors.); CIS 13; Economics 1, 2; Law 4; Math 150 or Psychology 9A or Sociology 109; Math 140 and Math 160 or 190. **NOTES**:

Students must apply to enter the University under the business administration pre-major. To be admitted to the upper division emphasis, students must meet the following criteria:

1) Grades of C or better required in each pre-major class 2) Complete a minimum of 60 transferable semester units 3) Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.90 4) Complete all lower division GE by the spring semester prior to transfer.

CALIFORNIA POLYTECHNIC STATE UNIVERSITY, SAN LUIS OBISPO

*Impacted

<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>: Business 1A-1B; Economics 1, 2; Law 5; Math 150 and 160 NOTES:

1. The Economic major is also offered in the School of Business with options in Business and Industrial Economics, International Trade and Development, and Quantitative Economics.

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, SAN JOSE

Pre-Major Courses: Business 1A-1B; Economics 1, 2; CIS 13; Law 4; English 1B or 1C; recommended: Math 140 and 150.

Accounting, Accounting Information Systems, and Corporate Financial Management Majors are not required to take Business 1B.

CALIFORNIA STATE POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY, POMONA

Pre-Major Courses: Business 1A-1B; Economics 1 & 2; English 1C; Math 150, 160, 161; CIS 13; Law 4; Psychology 5 (required for Marketing Management)

UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, (USC)

<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>: English 1A, 1B or 1C; Math 160 & 161 or Math 190; Recommended: Business 1A-1B (completion of 1A-1B will remove one required BUAD course at USC)

* Note: It is highly recommended that students complete the following pre-major requirements by the end of the fall semester prior to the application deadline (February 1): second semester of English (1B or 1C); Math 160 and 161 or Math 190.

A maximum of 64 units can be transferred from a community college. Students should have 30 transferable units of transferable course work by the end of the spring semester prior to fall transfer. Admission is competitive; students with an average GPA of 3.70 or higher and grades of "B" or better in the courses required for admission will have an advantage in the admissions review process.

LOYOLA MARYMOUNT UNIVERSITY

Pre-Major Courses: Business 1A-1B; Economics 1, 2; Math 160; Psychology 5

A lower division business law class is required after transfer. A student must have completed a course in Business Calculus, (ECC Math 160), with a grade of "B" or better to transfer into the College of Business Administration.

Students should follow the LMU general education requirements and complete as many of the Business Administration requirements listed above. In most cases, students are eligible to transfer after completing 30 units of transferable coursework, with a minimum GPA of 3.00. A maximum of 60 units may be transferred from all community college work.

MOUNT SAINT MARY'S COLLEGE

<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>: Business 1A-1B, 25; Economics 1, 2; Law 4 or 5; Math 130 or 140; Math 150; CIS 13; Communication Studies 1

A maximum of 66 semester credit units may be transferred from all community college work.

PEPPERDINE UNIVERSITY, SEAVER COLLEGE

Business 1A-1B, 54; Math 140, 150, 160; Economics 1, 2

PEPPERDINE UNIVERSITY, GRAZIADIO SCHOOL OF BUSINESS AND MANAGEMENT

(This program is for full time working adults; location is in Culver City; it is NOT offered through Seaver College in Malibu).

To transfer to the School of Business and Management's Bachelor of Science in Management program, a student must have earned a minimum GPA of 2.0 on 60 or more transferable semester units from a regionally accredited college. Students should have two years of full time work experience before entering the program. UNIVERSITY OF REDLANDS, WHITEHEAD CAMPUS-TORRANCE (ACCELERATED DEGREE)

Recommended courses: Business 1A-1B; Economics 1, 2; Math 130, 150

B.A. in Management does not require math in the major.

Students should have a minimum of 40 transferable units to be eligible for admission with a minimum GPA of 2.0. Three years of work experience is highly recommended.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, RIVERSIDE

<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>: Economics 1, 2; CIS 13; Business 25; Business 1A; Math 150; Math 160 or 190. Other prerequisites must be taken at UCR.

To meet selection criteria to be admitted directly into the Business Administration major, students must complete: Business 25, Business 1A, Economics 1, 2, CIS 13, Math 160 or 190, and Math 150 prior to transfer, and all general education must be completed, (IGETC strongly recommended).

NOTE: Students who take Business 1B will receive subject credit for UCR's Business 108 which is an upper division course at UCR. Students will have to take additional upper division units for the degree.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY

<u>Major Prerequisite Courses</u>: Business 25; Economics 1, 2; English 1A & 1B; Math 150; Math 160 and 161 or Math 190 and 191(students entering Haas in fall 2012 must complete two semesters of calculus); Three years of a single foreign language in high school or Chinese 2 or French 2 or German 2 or Italian, or Japanese 2 or Spanish 2 at El Camino College. (Visit the website www.assist.org for other options to meet the foreign language requirement).

To be eligible for admission to the Haas School of Business a student must:

- 1. Complete all prerequisite courses for letter grades. (See above)
- 2. Complete 60 UC transferable semester units.
- 3. Complete the foreign language requirement.
- 4. Items 1 through 3 must be completed by the end of the spring term prior to fall enrollment. However, it is recommended that all major requirements be completed prior to transfer and the majority completed by the end of the fall semester in which the UC application is submitted.
- 5. Students must meet the breadth requirement through course work. AP, A level, or IB exams will not fulfill breadth requirements. IGETC does not meet breadth requirements.

<u>Note</u>: Prerequisite courses must be completed no more than 5 years before admission to Haas. Apply in November for admission for the following Fall semester. The completed application must be postmarked no later than November 30. For important information, please refer to the website www.haas.berkeley.edu/Undergrad/.

Breadth Requirements

The breadth requirement has changed to the College of Letters and Science 7-Course Breadth. While some courses may fit into more than one breadth category, a single course may not be used by the student to fulfill multiple neither breadth requirements, nor may a course be used to satisfy both a breadth and a prerequisite requirement. B.A. Business Administration:

Junior level applicants with the highest grades overall and who satisfactorily complete required lower-division major requirements will be given preference for admission.

Required courses: Math 150 or Psychology 9A or Sociology 109; Business 1A,1B; Economics 1, 2; Math 190 and 191
