CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Communications is a suitable major for such professions as public relations, advertising, education, social services, law, or public service. The major can be combined with a variety of specialized fields (e.g., Business, Journalism, Psychology, Marketing, Administration of Justice, and Broadcasting) for careers in business, government or industry. Communications integrates courses in interpersonal, intercultural, organizational and mass communication and public relations. B.A. in Liberal Arts and Sciences or Applied Arts and Sciences

General Communications: Oral communications course from: Speech 1 or 3 or Speech 4 or Speech 12; Completion of a third semester of a foreign language.

General Communications is an impacted program. To be admitted to the general communication program, students must meet the following criteria:

- 1) In addition, students should complete with a grade of “C” or higher: Speech 4
- 2) Complete the general education oral communication requirement with a grade of “C” or higher (CSU GE Area A1).
- 3) Complete a minimum of 60 transferable units.
- 4) Have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.

Advertising and Public Relations: Economics 1, Journalism 1 & 12, Political Science 1, Completion of a third semester of a foreign language.

Advertising and Public Relations is impacted. To be admitted to the upper division emphasis, students must meet the following criteria:

- 1) Complete with a minimum GPA of 3.00 and a grade of “C” or higher: Economics 1, Journalism 1 & 12, and Political Science 1.
- 2) Pass the Grammar, Spelling, and Punctuation (GSP) test.
- 3) Complete a minimum of 60 transferable units.
- 4) Have a cumulative GPA of 3.00.

Telecommunications and Film Emphasis: Journalism 12 and English 41A-41B (entire must be completed) with grades of B or higher; Film 4 and 21; Completion of third semester of a foreign language.

Telecommunications is an impacted program; students need a minimum GPA of 3.00.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY

B.A. Media Studies: Media Studies at Berkeley is not a media production major. The program uses perspectives from the social sciences, journalism, communications, and humanities to examine the mass media. Admission to Berkeley does not guarantee admission to a particular major. Students must submit a separate application to the department after arrival at Berkeley. Students must present strong grades in prerequisite courses. Additionally, students who have completed 70 or more units or whose GPA in the prerequisites and other courses falls below a 3.2 must submit a graded research paper (5 pages in length) with their application in order to demonstrate critical writing and research skills necessary to succeed. AP scores cannot be used for major prerequisite courses.

One course from each of the following four groups:

Group I: History 1B; **Group II:** Political Science 1; **Group III:** Anthropology 2 or Economics 1 and 2 or Psychology 5 or Sociology 101; **Group IV:** Journalism 12

*Note: This major is offered under the College of Letters and Sciences: students **must** complete IGETC or UCB’s L & S requirements in Reading and Composition, Foreign Language, and Quantitative Reasoning by the end of the spring semester prior to fall transfer to Berkeley.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS

A.B. Communication: Speech 1; Psychology 5; Sociology 101; Math 150

Transfer students should complete the courses listed above with a GPA of 3.0 with grades of C or better and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.80.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, LOS ANGELES

B.A. Communication Studies

An interdisciplinary major in Communication Studies, which has specializations in Mass Communications and Interpersonal Communications. Enrollment is limited and highly competitive. Students should have a minimum UC transferable GPA of 3.50. Students are admitted for the fall quarter only.

Math 150 or Psychology 9A or Sociology 109; Students are admitted as a pre-major. Students will not be admitted to the full Communication major until they complete Communication 1, 87, 88 and 89 at UCSB with a GPA of 3.0 in those courses completed at UCSB.

UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

Admission to the Annenberg School of Communication is competitive. Only 40-45 students are admitted each year. The entering transfer applicants were admitted with an average GPA of 3.67 or higher (GPA does not guarantee admission). Students should complete USC's general education pattern and the English writing requirement. Students will need to submit one letter of recommendation from a college professor. This major requires a third semester of a foreign language. There are no lower division prerequisites; however, Annenberg considers the following factors: 1) interest and commitment to major demonstrated by internships, employment, student clubs, and community service, 2) leadership in campus organizations, 3) employment, family responsibility and other circumstances that may have impacted academic performance, 4) it is recommended that students take college statistics for upper division course work preparation, 5) Students should develop critical thinking and writing skills and have strong grades in composition courses.
