CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The study of foreign language as a major includes language, literature and culture. Career opportunities exist in U.S. government agencies, international organizations and international business. Careers in translation, interpreting and Foreign Service may require several years of experience. Foreign language can be a useful adjunct in fields such as social welfare, health, public administration, journalism, law and education. Prospective teachers may major in foreign language for the Standard Teaching Credential. Teachers may wish to continue with graduate study toward a Specialist Credential to work in Bilingual/Cross Cultural programs. **Recommended preparation for a major** in any foreign language includes course 4 and, when possible, 5 and/or 6, 22ab. History, or other courses related to the geographic area would be valuable. Foreign language majors are encouraged to participate in <u>international study programs</u> to help perfect their mastery of the language and to gain cultural insight.

French minor: Recommend: French 1, 2, 3, or 4. Students must pass a proficiency test. **Spanish**: Spanish 1, 2, 3, 4, 52A. Options available: Language and Literature, Public Service, Spanish for Public Service Certificate: Spanish 21AB. Instruction is available in Japanese.

<u>French</u>: French 1, 2, 3, 4. <u>German</u>: German 1, 2, 3. <u>Japanese</u>: Japanese 1, 2, 3, 4. <u>Spanish</u>: Spanish 1, 2, 3, 4, 21ab or 22ab. Courses available in Arabic, Chinese, Italian, Korean, Persian, Portuguese, and Vietnamese.

<u>French</u>: French 1, 2, 3, 4, 22AB; Recommend: History 140, 141; course 4 of a second foreign language. <u>German</u>: German 1, 2, 3. <u>Japanese</u>: Recommend: Japanese 1, 2, 3, 4. <u>Spanish</u>: 1, 2, 3, 4; for all options in Spanish, students should complete four semesters of a second foreign language. Options available in Language/Linguistics, Literature/Culture and Translation. <u>Italian</u> minor: Recommend: Italian 1, 2. Courses available in Arabic, Armenian, Chinese, Greek, Hebrew, Hindu, Korean, Latin, Portuguese, Russian, Sanskrit, Swahili, and Vietnamese.

<u>University Requirement</u>: English 1C; **French**: French 3, 4. Recommended: 22AB. Options: Literary, General Language, and Teaching <u>Japanese</u>: Japanese 1, 2, 3, 4. <u>Spanish</u>: Spanish 3, 4, 21AB or 22AB. Options: General, Teaching. Courses available in Chinese, German, Italian, Korean, Latin, Portuguese, Russian, Thai, and Vietnamese.

<u>French</u>: French 21AB, 22AB, 3, 4; English 35 or 36. Options: Literature; Language and Culture. <u>German</u>: German 3; English 35 and 36. UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, IRVINE

After satisfactory completion of a more advanced foreign language course, no credit is allowed for a lower level course in the same language course. Non-native English speakers who completed nine years or more of their education in their native language will not receive credit for lower division courses taken in that language in U.S. colleges.

All majors must complete one course from each area: Writing: English 1A, 1B, 1C, Philosophy 5 or Psychology 3; Literature: English 10 or 11 or 12 or 15A or 15B or 35 or 36 or 40A or 40B; History: History 1A or 1B or 12A, 12B or 14A or 14B or 22 or 140 or 141; Philosophy: Philosophy 2 or 7 or 10 or 11 or 23. Chinese Language and Literature: add Chinese 1, 2; Japanese 25. French: add French 1, 2, 3, 4. German: add German 1, 2, 3. Japanese Language and Literature: add Japanese 1, 2, 3, 4; Spanish: add Spanish 1-6.

*For all Languages, two years (four semesters) of course work in the selected language is required, if the selected language does not offer two years (four semesters) of the language, supplemental courses may be used to replace additional language courses, including related courses in civilization, culture, history, literature, and closely related languages.

<u>Classics</u>: Majors in Greek, Latin, Greek and Latin, English/Latin, English Greek

Asian Languages and Cultures: Majors in Japanese, Chinese, and Korean are offered.

<u>Japanese</u>: Recommend: Japanese 1, 2, 3, 4; Courses in Filipino, Hindi, Indic, Indonesian, Korean, Tagalog, Thai, and Vietnamese.

<u>French and Francophone Studies</u>: French 1, 2, 3, 4. Options in French (for credential), Literature, French Studies (humanities, social sciences, linguistics), French and Linguistics.

<u>Germanic</u> <u>Languages</u>: For German: German 1, 2, 3. Courses in Afrikaans, Dutch, Old Norse Studies, Yiddish languages and literature are available.

<u>Italian</u>: Italian 1, 2. Italian may be combined with other majors including Anthropology, Art, Classics (Latin), English, French, History, Linguistics, Music, Political Science, Theatre Arts.

<u>Linguistics</u>: course 4 in one foreign language; course 2 in a second foreign language; related courses in civilization, culture, history and closely related majors. Linguistics may be combined with Anthropology, Computer Science, Asian Languages and Cultures, English, French, Italian, Philosophy, Psychology, Scandinavian Languages or Spanish. B.A. in African Languages also offered.

<u>Near Eastern Languages and Cultures</u>: Majors in Ancient Near Eastern Civilizations, Arabic, Iranian Studies, Hebrew. Courses available in Armenian, Islamic, Jewish Studies, Iranian Studies Semites, Turkic languages.

Scandinavian Languages: Languages and Literature of Denmark, Norway, and Sweden

<u>Slavic Languages and Literature</u>: Major in Russian Language and Literature, Russian Studies, Central and East European Language and Cultures. Courses in Czech, Hungarian, Polish, Romanian, Serbian, Slavic and Ukrainian.

Spanish and Portuguese: Majors in Spanish, Spanish and Linguistics, Portuguese, and Spanish and Portuguese. For Spanish: Spanish 1, 2, 3, 4.
