CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The study of history can help students gain perspective on their own society and compare its traditions with those of other civilizations. Average employment prospects are expected for historians who have a master's or doctoral degrees and wish to work in teaching, libraries, archives, museums, research and editorial organizations, and government. Those possessing only a B.A. are likely to find very limited opportunities. A history major is a good background for lawyers, legislators, business executives, radio and television newscasters, and Foreign Service. This major may also lead to many other careers. For additional possibilities, check the EUREKA computerized career database, the Occupational Outlook Handbook, or one of the many other resources in the Career and Transfer Center.
