

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT INTRODUCTION

This Articulation Agreement has been developed by Mount St. Mary's College and El Camino College. Its purpose is to help the prospective Mount St. Mary's student plan a course of study that will facilitate a more effective transfer into Mount St. Mary's College. Mount St. Mary's College accepts a maximum of 70 transferable community college units that may be applied toward the units required for a baccalaureate degree.

The Articulation Agreement contains relevant information about MSMC General Studies Requirements, which includes five areas: Communication Skills; Critical Thinking; Arts & Sciences; Modern Language, Religious Studies and Philosophy. Listed under each area are equivalent courses offered at El Camino College
