CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Political Science programs are designed to provide students with an understanding of politics, its processes, its theories, and its institutions. Political science programs are an excellent background for leadership in civic and political activities. Political science majors take education courses in order to be certified as teachers; others seek employment with government or private agencies. Political science is considered good preparation for law school, civil service careers at international, national and local levels of government, or careers in research. This major may also lead to many other careers. ***Note:** AP credit does not satisfy any major requirement. Students **must** complete IGETC or the Letters & Sciences requirements in reading and composition, foreign language, and quantitative reasoning by the end of the spring term prior to fall enrollment.

A.B. Political Science (Public Service): Political Science 1 and two courses from Political Science 2, 6, 10; Math 150; Recommended: Economics 1, 2

Political Science 3; two courses from Political Science 1, 2, 5, 10; one additional political science course not taken above or another social science course from: Anthropology 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, Economics 1, 2, 5, Geography 1, 2, 5, 7, Political Science 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 10, Psychology 5, 7, 8, 9A, 9B, 10, 15, 16, Sociology 102, 104, 109; Highly recommended: Math 150

*Note: while not required for admission, all Social Sciences majors must satisfy a mathematics requirement and a computer education course. Courses that students can take at ECC to satisfy the requirement are Math 190 and Computer Science 3 and 30 or take courses at UCI, students should refer to www.assist.org.
