The following requirements for the major are subject to change without notice. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES: Sociologists are concerned with social life and the social causes and consequences of human behavior. With a bachelor's degree, sociology graduates will be competing with other liberal arts graduates. A master's degree could lead to such fields as social work (see the Social Work Major sheet), human resources development, and public health. A PhD is usually required for teaching and research at the university level and for high-level positions in research institutes, private industry and government agencies. Social impact assessment provides information on the effects proposed actions might have on the quality of life in human communities. Sociology goes beyond the limitations of personal experience and prepares for informed, responsible participation in a complex society. Sociology is a suitable basis for such professions as law, business, education, architecture, medicine, and public health. Sociologists may specialize in the family, urban community, health, old age, occupations, environmental issues, sex roles, sports, government operations, law enforcement, employment counseling, vocational rehabilitation or other aspects of social processes or social systems.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE FOR TRANSFER (AA-T)

Students who have completed the AA-T in Sociology will have a strong academic foundation in the field and will be prepared for upper division baccalaureate study at the university. This coursework will satisfy most of the lower-division requirements at many institutions within the California State University system. This degree is intended for students who are primarily interested in transferring to a four year university and majoring in Sociology and may provide priority consideration for admission to a CSU.

Students considering transferring to a UC, private, or out of state university: Please consult with a counselor before applying to transfer since transfer requirements may be slightly different than those required for the AA-T.
