EQUIVALENCY AND EVALUATION SHEET

EQUIVALENTS TO A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

The Department of Education recognizes several equivalents to a high school diploma:

- A GED: or
 - A certificate demonstrating that the student has passed a state authorized examination (for example the California High School Proficiency Exam) that the state recognizes as the equivalent of a high school diploma; or
 - An academic transcript of a student who has successfully completed at least a two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor's degree; or
 - ➤ For a student who enrolls before completing high school, a transcript indicating the student has excelled in high school. The student must no longer be enrolled in high school, must satisfy your school's written policy for admitting such students, and must be starting a program that leads at least to an associate's degree or its equivalent

EVALUATIONS: FOREIGN HIGH SCHOOLS AND UNIVERSITIES

You are required to have your high school or university transcripts translated and evaluated so that your financial aid eligibility can be determined. For foreign high schools and universities, the Financial Aid Office needs a course-by-course evaluation completed. We recommend the following services to translate and evaluate your transcripts:
