 - Character form should be filled out by someone – other than family – who has known you for many years.
- _____ 7. Submit a one page statement of purpose for applying to the program.
- _____ 8. Submit two (2) passport size photos or digital photos with white application form.
- _____ 9. Be available for an interview.
- _____ 10. Sign a statement to acknowledge understanding and full acceptance of Medical Needs in a foreign country.
- _____ 11. Sign a district waiver form holding El Camino College District harmless for any and all problems and/or losses arising from the occasion of or failure to provide non-instructional services by a travel counselor.

**EL CAMINO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT REVISED
STANDARDS OF STUDENT CONDUCT FOR STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMS REV. 12/04**

Students participating in El Camino College's (ECC) Study Abroad Program are representing the United States, the State of California, and ECC. Any misconduct on the part of the program participants may reflect on the study abroad group as a whole, and may produce undesirable results for all program participants. Abuse of the hospitality of a host community or school on the part of a few may result in the loss of opportunities for many. It is important that all program participants observe and abide by the legal and social norms of the community in which they live. Participants are also subject to ECC standards of Conduct. Honesty, courtesy, and respect for the laws of the host country are generally the standards by which Study Abroad participants should live.

Participants in Study Abroad may be subject to dismissal from the program if they violate its rules or otherwise conduct themselves in such a way as to jeopardize or embarrass themselves, their fellow students, or the Study Abroad Program. In most cases, dismissal means that student status will be terminated, visas and residence permits reside in the host country will be revoked, and students will be sent home at their own expense. Students may be subject to dismissal under certain conditions, including, but not limited to the following situations:

- Failure to maintain the minimum prescribed course load (full time student status, defined as at least 12 units during a Semester Program or six units for Summer and/or Winter), failure to attend class and participate in required program activities, or failure to maintain an acceptable level of academic performance, and misconduct as defined by Board Policy 5138.
- Trade in, consumption of, or other involvement in the use of dangerous or illegal drugs or narcotics, or violation of any local law or ordinance with respect to these substances.
- Involvement in illegal actions as defined and interpreted by the lawful authorities of the host country.

STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM STUDENT BEHAVIOR CONTRACT

I, the undersigned student, promise to abide by the following regulations and ethical standards during participation in the El Camino College Study Abroad Program:

1. My general conduct shall conform to the rules outlined in the El Camino College Catalog regarding General Conduct, and to all El Camino College rules, Board policies, and administrative regulations. Specifically, I shall maintain academic integrity, refrain from any abusive behavior; or violating the judicial or statutory standards of obscenity or indecent conduct; using, possessing, or distributing narcotics or other legally controlled substances; possessing or using firearms, explosives, weapons, or dangerous chemicals. If I drink alcoholic beverages, I shall limit myself to the amounts that will not impair my judgment and lead to improper social behavior, disregard for local laws, or disruption of the academic program.
2. I shall be aware that I am a guest in a foreign country and shall adjust my behavior to reveal respect for my hosts. I shall observe the laws of the host country even when they differ from those of my country. Specifically, I will obey and respect official authorities and persons performing their duties of the employment (e.g. police, bus drivers, tour guides, pension managers, restaurant waiters, etc.).
3. I will comply with the directions of the director, instructor(s), and representatives in the program as required by the El Camino College Standards of Student Conduct.
4. I understand that there is a zero-tolerance policy regarding the use, trade-in, association with, or possession of illegal drugs. If I do so, I will be sent home immediately at my own expense, or I may be liable to prosecution by the local authorities.
5. Attendance at class meetings is essential to the success of the Study Abroad Program. There is a maximum of three unexcused absences from classes taught by the On-Site Director. If I am absent from a class meeting, I must provide an excuse from a medical doctor or the appropriate authority to the On-Site Director. More than three unexcused absences will indicate my unwillingness to participate in the Study Abroad Program, and may result in my expulsion from the program.

I understand that any infraction of the standards as stated above may lead to disciplinary action by El Camino College and/or the On-Site Director of the Study Abroad Program. There will be a three strikes rule and each infraction of the Code of Conduct, except for the zero-tolerance policy regarding illegal drugs, will be evaluated as to its severity and required corrective action, which may include, but is not limited to, formal reprimand, and, if the behavior continues, expulsion from the program and forced return to the United States at my own expense.

_____ **ART 101 (formerly Art 1)**

Art and Visual Culture: A Global Perspective; 3 units

This course is an introduction to art and visual culture across time and diverse cultures with a global perspective. Examining works of art through themes, theory, terminology and media, students acquire analytical and interpretive skills to develop visual literacy as well as an understanding of the role of art and visual culture in relation to contemporary life. This course explores how meaning is constructed, transmitted and negotiated in an increasingly visual world.

_____ **ART 102C (formerly Art 4)**

History of Western Art – 19th Century to Contemporary Times; 3 units

This course is a survey of the history, development, and evolution of painting, sculpture, architecture, photography, and related art forms of Western Europe and the United States from the mid-nineteenth century to the late-twentieth century. Artworks, art movements, and art styles are studied in relation to relevant social, political, philosophical, and technological factors, and the accelerating changes that characterize the modern era. Students will see how the aesthetic of newness, originality, anti-academicism, and radical formal invention characteristic of avant-garde modernism was rooted in the deep-seated social changes and values that defined modernity. Students will be introduced to fundamental methods of analysis that will assist them in understanding art and aesthetic human activities.

_____ **English 12**

Introduction to Fiction; 3 units

This course focuses on reading and interpreting the short story and the novel, and analyzing the evolution, scope, and form of each genre. Students study the elements, themes, and styles of short stories and novels, as well as the contributions of individual authors to each genre.

_____ **English 41B**

Survey of Film: 1950 to the Present; 3 units

This course focuses on screening, analyzing and writing about film as a narrative reflective of its time and culture. Students study representative film masterpieces from 1950 to the present by viewing films or portions of films. An emphasis is placed on ideas and values portrayed in the films with regards to how they reflect the concerns of particular nationalities and time periods. Students also analyze the growth and transformation of various artistic techniques used by the filmmakers, as well as trends in major transnational filmmaking and media conglomeration.

Note: Participants must enroll in at least one class.
