Course Descriptions:

Art 101 Art and Visual Culture: A Global Perspective 3 units (Whitney)

This course is an introduction to art and visual culture across time and diverse cultures with a global perspective.

Art 102C History of Western Art—19th Century to Contemporary Times 3 units (Whitney)

This course is a survey of the history, development, and evolution of painting, sculpture, architecture, photography, and related art forms of Western Europe and the United States from the mid-nineteenth century to the late twentieth century.

English 12 Introduction to Fiction 3 units (Donnell)

This course focuses on reading and interpreting the short story and the novel and analyzing the evolution, scope, and form of each genre.

English 41B Survey of Film: 1950 to the Present 3 units (Donnell)

This course focuses on screening, analyzing and writing about film as a narrative reflective of its time and culture. Students study representative film masterpieces from 1950 to the present by viewing films or portions of films.

Note: These are abbreviated course descriptions since the complete ones are more extensive.

ITINERARY

DAY 1 – TUESDAY, 27–JUN–17: FLIGHT, LOS ANGELES TO PRAGUE

Transfer on own to Los Angeles International Airport this afternoon for your connecting flight to Prague, via London/Heathrow.

DAY 2 – WEDNESDAY, 28–JUN–17: ARRIVAL IN PRAGUE

Upon arrival in Prague, rendezvous with your multi-lingual tour manager who will accompany you on your entire program and transfer from the airport to the hotel. This evening, a get-acquainted dinner and orientation will be offered to begin your stay in Europe.

DAY 3 – THURSDAY, 29–JUN–17: PRAGUE

The City of a Thousand Spires has seen it all. Centuries of Bohemian kings, classical composers, invading Nazis, Soviet tanks and Velvet Revolutionaries have passed over Prague's cobblestones, and the spires survived it all, creating one of Europe's most romantic and beautiful skylines. Stroll the Charles Bridge at dusk or row a boat down the Vltava River to discover what makes this Baroque jewel so alluring. Following a short classroom session, and with so many sights to see, a full day of sightseeing with local guide is scheduled for the city, including admission the Old Royal Castle, St. Vitus Cathedral, with its magnificent stained glass windows, and the Old Town with its amazing Astronomical Clock and the Tyn Church. Admissions will also be included to the Czech Cubism Museum and Kafka Museum.

DAY 4 – FRIDAY, 30–JUN–17: PRAGUE

Following another short classroom session, a half day sightseeing of the city is included with a local guide, this time focusing on more of the Old Town, including Wenceslas Square and admission both the Mucha Museum, one of the foremost painters of Art Nouveau, and the Trade Fair Palace, with its many masterpieces of Impressionism and Modern Art.

DAY 5, SATURDAY, 1-JUL-17: PRAGUE

Your professors today will organize via metro a visit to the Muller House – The City of Prague Museum.

DAY 6 – SUNDAY, 2-JUL-17: PRAGUE – KUTNA HORA/BRNO – VIENNA

Today the group will travel from Prague to Vienna, with stops en route in Kutna Hora and Brno. An included lunch will be featured en route. In Kutna Hora, the stop will focus on a visit to the Sedlec Ossuary, estimated to contain the skeletons of between 40,000 and 70,000 people, and with an enormous chandelier of bones, which hangs from the center of the nave with garlands of skulls draping the vault. Time permitting, a stop will also be made at St. Barbara’s Church, one of the Czech Republic’s architectural gems. In Brno, the Czech Republic’s second largest city, a stop will be made at Jacob’s Church, dating from the 15th century, and the Tugendhat House, designed by Bauhaus architect Mies van der Rohe. An early evening arrival is planned in Vienna.

DAY 7 – MONDAY, 3-JUL-17: VIENNA

A whirl of gilded Hapsburg palaces and regal parks on the banks of the blue Danube, Vienna is a fine romance of a city. Tradition and innovation walk hand in hand: Strauss waltzes are still hip to 20-something ball-goers and even the imperial stables have been born again as the surprising and vibrant Museum Quarter. Following a two-hour classroom session, travel by metro to visit Schönbrunn Palace, the stunning former Imperial summer residence of the Habsburgs. The 1,441-room Baroque palace is one of the most important architectural, cultural, and historical monuments in the country. The history of the palace and its vast gardens spans over 300 years, reflecting the changing tastes, interests, and aspirations of successive Habsburg monarchs.

DAY 8, TUESDAY, 4-JUL-17: VIENNA

Following a short classroom session, travel by metro to visit the fascinating Freud Museum, consisting of the founder of psychoanalysis’ former practice and a part of his old private quarters; the Albertina Museum, one of the largest and most important art museums in the world with approximately 65,000 drawings and approximately 1 million old master prints; and the Karlskirche, widely considered the most outstanding Baroque church in the city.

DAY 9, WEDNESDAY, 5-JUL-17: VIENNA

Today your professors will lead a walking tour of the city focusing on modern art and architecture. A visit is also planned via metro to Vienna's Natural History Museum.

DAY 10, THURSDAY, 6-JUL-17: VIENNA

Travel by metro today to visit Vienna's premier art museum, the Kunsthistorisches, with art masterpieces spanning more than two millennia. A two-hour classroom session will be scheduled for this afternoon.

DAY 11, FRIDAY, 7-JUL-17: VIENNA

A visit will be offered this morning via metro to the Galerie Belvedere, perhaps best known for its large collection of paintings by Klimt, prior to another two-hour classroom session this afternoon.

This evening, we will take the group slightly outside of the city for dinner at one of Vienna's famous Heurigen wine taverns.

Today will again be of your own choosing in Vienna, with the tour manager available for optional walking tours of the city.

DAY 13, SUNDAY, 9-JUL-17: VIENNA – BUDAPEST

Depart Vienna this morning, and by midday the group will be in Budapest, one of Central Europe's most picturesque cities. Lunch will be on own prior to our afternoon of sightseeing with a local guide. Sights will include the newly renovated St. Matthias Church, originally founded by St. Stephen in 1015, and the Hungarian National Gallery, containing many of the masterpieces of Hungarian art from the 19th and 20th centuries. Dinner will be included this evening, either at the hotel or a local restaurant.

DAY 14, MONDAY, 10-JUL-17: BUDAPEST – VIENNA

The morning has been set aside for an organized visit via motorcoach to the impressive Gellert Baths. Additional sightseeing with a local guide will be offered in Budapest this afternoon and a visit to the Rumbach Street Synagogue, which played a prominent role in Hungarian Jewish history. Early evening will find us back in Vienna.

DAY 15 – TUESDAY, 11-JUL-17: VIENNA – MELK ABBEY – SALZBURG

Today, the group will travel from Vienna to Salzburg, with a lengthy stop planned in Melk to visit its famous Abbey. One of the finest baroque buildings in the world, the Melk Abbey complex is one of Austria's major attractions. Despite all the adornment in the abbey, it is still surpassed in lavish glory by the Stiftskirche, the golden abbey church. As a local guide will show, Melk is still a working abbey, and you might see black-robed Benedictine monks going about their business or students rushing out of the gates. A late afternoon arrival is planned in Salzburg.

DAY 16 – WEDNESDAY, 12-JUL-17: SALZBURG

Salzburg has been an endless source of inspiration to the prince-archbishops who created its mighty baroque churches and to its famous son, Mozart, whose symphonies regularly headline the Salzburg Festival. It's also served as a backdrop for many movies, such as the classic, *The Sound of Music*. Stroll the tangled lanes of Salzburg's Old Town, a World Heritage Site, to discover your own favorite things about this most Austrian of cities. A half day sightseeing tour will be offered this morning with a local guide, including the Hohensalzburg Castle, overlooking the city and the largest completely preserved castle left in central Europe. An additional visit will be offered at nearby Nonnberg Abbey, which played a prominent role in the Von Trapp family saga. A classroom session will be scheduled this afternoon, with an included dinner planned for this evening in one of Salzburg's many fine restaurants.

DAY 17 – THURSDAY, 13-JUL-17: SALZBURG

Your professors will lead the group to an organized visit via motorcoach of Hellbrunn Palace, with its famous "trick" fountains, and the Panorama Museum, with its gigantic round painting, prior to another two-hour classroom session this afternoon.

DAY 18 – FRIDAY, 14–JUL–17: SALZBURG – EAGLE'S NEST/SALT MINES – MUNICH

The group will depart Salzburg today, bound for Bavaria's capital city of Munich. En route stops will be made at the infamous Eagle's Nest, the former residence of Adolf Hitler, sitting atop on a mountain peak high above Berchtesgaden in the Bavarian Alps. The Dokumentation Obersalzberg offers interesting exhibits on the history of Obersalzberg, Hitler's regime and WWII. It also gives access to part of the underground bunker system. The greater Salzburg area originally gained much of its wealth from the mining of salt, and a tour inside the depths of the its most famous Salt Mine will be our second stop. Lunch will be offered en route today, with a late afternoon arrival planned in Munich.

DAY 19 – SATURDAY, 15–JUL–17: MUNICH

Though perhaps best known as the city of beer and oom-pah-pah, Munich (München, pronounced *Mewn-shin*, in German), is only one part of exuberant city. The other part is rich, cultured and sophisticated, and its architectural legacy includes decorated baroque and rococo churches and palaces of a kind rarely seen in parts of Germany. The kingdom of Bavaria and its capital, created by Napoleon in 1806, lasted until 1918, has a sense of that privileged royal past that still lingers. Think of Munich as the capital of *Gemütlichkeit*, that not-quite-translatable adjective that means something between cozy and good-natured. Our half-day sightseeing of the city with via motorcoach will focus on the area surrounding the Marienplatz area, with its famous Glockenspiel, and will also include a brief tour of the Alte Pinakothek, comprises more than 700 artworks from the glittering epochs of German, Flemish, Netherlandish, French, Italian and Spanish painting. The afternoon will be of your own choosing.

DAY 20 – SUNDAY, 16–JUL–17: MUNICH

A sobering half-day excursion via motorcoach will be offered this morning to nearby Dachau Memorial Site, the former Nazi concentration camp. Our local guide will chronicle the twelve years of its existence. Over 200,000 Jews and other minorities from all over Europe were imprisoned here, and over 40,000 lost their lives. Following our return to Munich, a self-guided visit will be made to Nymphenburg Palace. This lavish Baroque palace and gardens served as the main summer residence of the former rulers of Bavaria of the House of Wittelsbach.

DAY 21 – MONDAY, 17-JUL-17: MUNICH

Following a short classroom session, a professor-led walk via metro will be organized through the English Garden, along with a visit to the Neue Pinakothek.

DAY 22 – TUESDAY, 18-JUL-17: MUNICH

A full day excursion is planned today to the fabled Neuschwanstein Castle, perhaps more than any other structure, “the” symbol of Germany for millions of tourists who visit the country each year. The nineteenth-century Romanesque Revival palace is situated on a rugged hill above the village of Hohenschwangau and was commissioned by Ludwig II of Bavaria as a retreat and as a homage to Richard Wagner. Lunch will be included. En route back to Munich, stops will be made the Munter House in Murnau, the former home of the painter, Kandinsky, and which played a formative role in the history of the Blue Rider; and the Buchheim, often called the Museum of Imagination. A late afternoon arrival is planned back in Munich. To celebrate our last night together, a farewell dinner will be offered at a local restaurant.

DAY 23 – WEDNESDAY, 19-JUL-17 MUNICH – LOS ANGELES

It’s time to say a fond *Auf Wiedersehen* to both Germany and Central Europe. A morning motorcoach transfer will be provided to Munich Airport for your return connecting flight to Los Angeles, via Philadelphia. An evening arrival is planned back in California.
