Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, all 10-month tenured and tenure-track faculty will be required to complete four (4) hours of Senate-approved racial equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI) focused training as part of their 24 hours of required professional development. All part-time faculty will be paid to complete two (2) hours of Senate-approved racial EDI focused professional development per semester.

*EDI PD - denotes Senate-approved racial EDI focused professional development

Beginning in the 2021-2022 school year, all full and part-time faculty who have been certified to teach Distance Education (DE) courses (i.e. online and hybrid) are required to maintain their DE certification. Certification maintenance takes place on a five (5) year cycle. One option for maintaining certification is completing ten (10) hours of DE focused professional development each cycle.

Navigating the New Nuventive - Using the Upgraded Nuventive for Entering & Tracking SLO & PLO Results

This workshop will address the changes made in the recent upgrades Nuventive has made to our SLO and PLO assessment software. Some of the key features we'll review are those that enable you to quickly see SLO success rates over time and to come up with average success rates for multiple SLOs aligned with a given PLO. We will also show how to use the features that will take your raw SLO data from Canvas and automatically put it into Nuventive, so all you need to do in Nuventive is write an analysis and action plan. We will also address how to successfully navigate the upgraded Nuventive even if using it in the same manner as the previous version to enter both assessment data and analysis.

Working to Decolonize El Camino College through Land Acknowledgement (*EDI PD)

Like other California colleges and universities, El Camino College occupies land that sustained and supported Native Americans for millennia prior to European colonization. Our college sits on the ancestral lands of the Tongva / Gabrieleño people, who were dispossessed of their lands first by Spanish missionaries, then by Mexican authorities, and finally Anglo-American officials. This history of dispossession is rarely acknowledged at our college, which is all the more troubling given our use of a name and symbols that evoke the brutal mission system built on indigenous enslavement and the erasure of native culture. Importantly, this pattern of land dispossession on the present day site of El Camino College did not end with the brutal treatment of indigenous peoples at the hands of European colonizers. Rather, it continued in the exclusion of Californios by Anglo-American settlers in the late-1800s and a blocked attempt by African American entrepreneurs to establish a housing development in the 1920s that would have empowered black homeowners at the height of Jim Crow segregation. A critical first step toward decolonizing our college would be to regularly acknowledge the history of the land that El Camino College occupies, something done at public events at many public colleges and universities throughout the state.

This breakout session will begin by reviewing the fraught history of the land that El Camino College occupies then detail how land acknowledgement can further ongoing efforts to transform El Camino into an anti-racist institution. Members of the Land Acknowledgement Task Force will discuss their work to develop a land acknowledgement toolkit for El Camino College. In paying respect to the original caretakers of the land that we occupy, we can help make El Camino College a more welcoming and inclusive space for indigenous students, staff, and faculty. Educating our colleagues about the importance of land acknowledgement will encourage all campus community members to appreciate diverse experiences and recognize legacies of oppression, which are vital to engaging meaningfully in antiracist action.
