How do you envision supporting students and faculty in the "new normal" of hybrid/hyflex/online learning environment?

I am committed to working closely with the Academic Senate, Faculty, Classified Professionals, Students, and Administrators to map out and assess our course section schedules, professional development for faculty, and support for students in our new endemic COVID environment. This includes the support required to maintain high quality distance education instruction, implementation of new teaching methodologies like HyFlex, the inclusion of student educational plans/voice in the development of schedules.

For context, the college is currently offering 53% of instruction face-to-face and 44% of instruction fully online for the Fall 2022 term. The remaining course sections are dual enrollment, off-site, or HyFlex. Given this I believe the following activities to be critical in planning for our future:

- Complete El Camino College's Strategic Enrollment Management Plan (2022-2025) with the Enrollment Management Committee
 - Including targets for the proportion of distance education in our schedules based on student demand and as COVID conditions/policies evolve
 - Including initial targets to regain enrollment lost during the pandemic by 2024-2025
- Continue support for high-quality DE through the Office of Distance Education under the leadership of Dean Martin and Faculty Coordinator Wolfenstein
 - Support for high-quality support services via DE and hybrid models
 - Support for students to become effective online learners
- Continue El Camino College's movement to be a full member of the state-wide CVC-OEI online consortium, this includes completing the steps to become a Teaching College within the consortium
- · Promote innovation at El Camino College in addressing our equity, enrollment, and other challenges


